## TOTAL HANDLE UP 20 PERCENT FOR

**MARYLAND JOCKEY CLUB** The Maryland Jockey Club posted a total in-state handle of \$397,624,729 for 1993, resulting in an increase of 5.9 percent over the previous year. The gross handle reached \$490,717,685 for a 20 percent gain over 1992; the gross handle incorporates in-state and out-of-state wagers. The amount wagered out-of-state increased 31.1 percent over 1992. Overall attendance decreased 7.3 percent, but an attendance count is not recorded for Maryland's three OTB sites which opened in 1993. Mike Luzzi led all jockeys for most Maryland stakes wins with 20; trainer Ron Cartwright topped the conditioners in the same category with 10 stakes victories.

## NORFOLK WINNER POINTS FOR EL

**CAMINO REAL DERBY** Shepherd's Field (Spectacular Bid), winner of the GII Norfolk S. at Santa Anita last year, is scheduled to make his 1994 debut in the GIII \$200,000 El Camino Real Derby at Bay Meadows January 22. The three-year-old finished sixth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, his last start of '93. "He jumped a shadow leaving the gate and dropped way back and that was it," said his trainer, Brad MacDonald. "Nothing good happened after that. He had done enough and was pretty tired; we gave him a month off and he looks great now."

**SEA CADET TO RESUME TRAINING** Verne H. Winchell's Sea Cadet (Bolger) was due in at trainer Ron McAnally's barn this weekend after missing nearly two weeks of training because of colitis. McAnally said the GI winner has been recovering in Chino. "I'm not sure when he's going to run," said McAnally. "We have to get him back and see how much training we've lost."

The main event is the McKnight; **Fraise** (Strawberry Road) will be a heavy favorite, but there are lots of caution flags with this one. Yes, his recent win in the Hollywood Turf Cup was big, but that was at scale weights in a small field, and this is a whole different story. He has shipped cross country to spot gobs of weight to a large field, and drew an outside post in a three-turn race. At a short price, he's not for us.
