CHRB OPENS VIOLATIONS HOTLINE The California Horse Racing Board now has an 800 number that individuals may call to report rule violations, safety hazards and other matters that should be brought to the attention of state regulators. CHRB investigators will be on line at (800) 805-7223 during regular business hours; a message service is available at other times. The calls are free of charge and confidential. "Although we have a fine team of investigators who do a good job enforcing our rules, they can't be everywhere at all times, so we're asking the people who work in the horse racing industry to help us," said CHRB Chairman Ralph Scurfield.

SHOEMAKER CO-AUTHORS MYSTERY Bill Shoemaker, racing's all-time leading jockey and enjoying success as a trainer, can now add author to his list of accomplishments. Along with Dick Lochte, Shoemaker has written "Stalking Horse", a mystery novel with a racing background. The novel will be published in April by Ballantine Books and is planned as the first in a series of three. Lochte formerly was book editor of the Los Angeles Times.

HOLLYWOOD WILDCAT POSSIBLE FOR LA CANADA Breeders' Cup Distaff winner **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.) could make her four-year-old debut in the Gil \$200,000 La Canada at Santa Anita Feb. 5. "She's doing very well and will probably run in the La Canada, but weather and other factors could change our plans," said trainer Neil Drysdale.

The Canadian (Jan. 29) seems like the logical step to take." Said his rider, Mike Smith, "He ran a big race. He is a big, well-balanced horse and when I asked him he just took off. The weight didn't bother him one bit."
