GULFSTREAM CANCELS RACING Racing was halted by a rare "mudout" Thurs. at Gulfstream Park. Following the first race, jockeys refused to continue riding due to the sloppy conditions created by four straight days of rainy weather. "Gulfstream management accepted the jockeys' decision not to continue riding this afternoon," said Douglas Donn, Gulfstream President and CEO. "I told the jockeys that we would abide by whatever decision they made and that there would be absolutely no reprisals of any kind against anyone." Yesterday marked the third time in its 55-year history that Gulfstream had to cancel racing.

JOCKEY CLUB TAKES NEXT STEP IN DNA-TYPING Encouraged by results of last fall's nationwide DNA-based parentage verification Field Test and the overwhelming support of breeders throughout the country, The Jockey Club announced yesterday a move to the next phase of the program by implementing a DNA-typing requirement for the North American stallion population. Within the next few days, more than 6,000 DNA-sampling kits will be mailed to owners of all active stallions who stood in North America in 1993, so that DNA-typing of the 1994 foal crop can occur. The Jockey Club estimates that, on average, DNA parentage verification will save breeders more than \$30 for every foal registered, effectively removing more than \$1 million from overall annual breeding costs.

SANDY HAWLEY TO RIDE AT SANTA ANITA Hall of Fame jockey Sandy Hawley, a regular on the Southern California circuit from the mid-70's to the mid-80's before returning to ride in his native Canada, will resume riding at Santa Anita Sat. "I got here four days ago," said Hawley yesterday. "I had some CAT scans and X-rays done and the doctor gave me a clean bill of health." Hawley, 44, has been battling skin cancer since 1986. His book will be handled by George O'Bryan.

JEFF LUKAS' PROGRESS CONTINUES Jeff Lukas continued to show improvement Thurs. from multiple skull fractures suffered when he was run down by Tabasco Cat in the Santa Anita barn area Dec. 15. "I just spoke to the hospital and his condition has been upgraded to fair," Lukas spokesperson Peggy Yost said Thurs. morning. "He's definitely doing better," said trainer Randy Bradshaw, a former Lukas assistant and family friend. "He did have some help brushing his teeth and shaving, but that's certainly to be expected. Being in bed for 30 days takes its toll...your muscles deteriorate. It'll take time to get his strength back."

LOUISIANA DOWNS ANNOUNCES 1994 STAKES PROGRAM Louisiana Downs' Racing Secretary Patrick J. Pope has announced a stakes program worth more than \$3 million for the track's 1994 racing season. A total of 58 stakes events will be offered throughout the 132-day meet which runs April 30 through Nov. 13. The richest event planned is the GI, \$750,000 Super Derby, to be run for the 15th time Sat., Oct. 1. Louisiana Downs will run four other graded events in 1994: the Gill Ark-La-Tex H., Gill Louisiana Downs H., Gill River Cities Budweiser BC and Gill Golden Harvest H.

TURF PARADISE TO RACE MONDAYS Turf Paradise Race Course in Phoenix, Arizona will expand its racing schedule with the addition of Mondays beginning Jan. 17. Racing will now be conducted six days a week, Wed. through Mon., until the end of March.

LAUREL ADOPTS NEW POLICY FOR RACING CANCELLATIONS Following a meeting Tues. with representatives of the Jockeys Guild, Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Maryland Jockey Club, Laurel has instituted a new policy for racing cancellations. If the safety of the racing surface is questioned before or during a racing card, representatives of all three groups will inspect the track. Should both management and the horsemen deem the track safe while the riders disagree, the jockeys will cast a written, secret vote to begin or continue riding. If 12 or more jockeys vote in favor of racing, the racing card will begin or continue; those riders voting against racing will be excused.

VERNE WINCHELL: TOBA OWNER OF THE MONTH TOBA's final Owner of the Month award for 1993 goes to Verne Winchell, owner of Mira Loma Farm near Alhambra, Calif. and Oakwind Farm in Lexington, Ky. Winchell's **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty) defeated BC Juvenile winner **Brocco** (Kris S.) in the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 19.

HANSEN DISAPPEARANCE DRAWS TV CREWS A crew from "American Journal," a CBS news magazine show, was at Bay Meadows yesterday doing a story on the disappearance of jockey Ron Hansen. "American Journal," which will air its Hansen story Mon., is the third national TV show to visit Bay Meadows in the past week. Crews from "Prime Suspect" and "Hard Copy" were at the track last Thurs. and Fri., respectively. "Hard Copy" will air its Hansen piece next Wed. "Prime Suspect" has not yet determined when its story will be broadcast.
