THREE-YEAR-OLDS PREP FOR EL CAMINO REAL DERBY **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat), third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and better known as the colt who put trainer Jeff Lukas in the hospital, will make his next start in the GIII \$200,000 El Camino Real Derby at Bay Meadows Jan. 22. The D. Wayne Lukas trainee prepped for the race going six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 at Santa Anita Sunday. Pat Day will ride the three-year-old, who will ship to Bay Meadows Thursday. Generous S. winner **Delineator** (Storm Cat) also breezed for the race yesterday, going seven furlongs in 1:27 3/5 at Bay Meadows with jockey Russell Baze up. "Awesome," said Baze. "He was a lot more relaxed today. He got a lot out of the work." The Fordell Fierce charge finished third as the 2-5 favorite in the California Juvenile S. Jan. 1.

CALIFORNIA SATELLITE FACILITY CLOSES Redwood Acres, the satellite wagering facility in Eureka, California, which has been in operation for six years, will close indefinitely following the Bay Meadows meet. In a letter to California Horse Racing Board Chairman Ralph Scurfield, Dianne Coday, CEO of Redwood Acres, cited "severe budgetary constraints" as the reason for the closing. The Bay Meadows meet closes Jan. 29.

AQUEDUCT CANCELS FOR SIXTH TIME IN 1994 Racing at Aqueduct was again cancelled Sunday due to the severe cold and wind chill. This brings to six the number of total or partial New York racing cards cancelled in '94. The Busanda S., scheduled for yesterday, will be redrawn for Sunday, Jan. 23. Racing is planned for Monday, Martin Luther King Day, but there is a possibility of snow in the forecast, and a decision on the card will be made this morning. Also cancelling Sunday were Laurel, Suffolk Downs and Turfway; Philadelphia Park closed after the first.

Monday's Santa Monica lost much of its luster with the defection of Meafara, but it is still one of the few Grade I sprints for coeds, and should mark the emergence of a new star. **Arches of Gold** (Strike Gold) will attract attention at the windows but will probably disappoint once again. She is a typical sprinting filly that runs well fresh, then tails off as her campaign continues. **Mamselle Bebette** (Copelan) will also take action off her La Brea score, but that race was by far the best of her life and she's almost sure to bounce. **Cargo** (Caro), on the other hand, runs her race pretty much every time. Dropping back to a sprint she is solid as a rock, but she's only our second choice. **Desert Stormer** (Storm Cat) is on her way to being a top filly. In only her second lifetime start she ran a figure that would win this, then came back with another good effort when second in the La Brea. This time she gets significant weight from the other contenders and has enough early speed to make her own luck. SALT DOME MOVED Ken Quirk announced yesterday that GII multiple stakes winner **Salt Dome** (Blushing Groom) will be moved to Summers Mill Farm in Belton, Texas for the 1994 breeding season. The 11-year-old previously stood at Airlie Stud in County Dublin, Ireland; he will stand for a fee of \$2,500 live foal. Conditioned by Frank Brothers, Salt Dome ranked among North America's leading sprinters on the Daily Racing Form Sprint Handicaps of 1987 and 1988; he earned \$226,321 and won five stakes. His first foals are four-year-olds of 1994; in 1993 he was represented by stakes-placed two-year-old Salt Peanuts.

WICKED WIT RETIRED **Wicked Wit** (Pirate's Bounty), 6xSW of the 1991 Pasadena S., has been retired and will be bred to Kris S. "She won over \$300,000 and she retired sound," said trainer Danny Velasquez.
