HANSEN'S BODY FOUND? A body, which may be that of jockey Ron Hansen, was discovered by a salt company worker Thursday morning near the San Mateo Bridge. Hansen, who disappeared Oct. 1, had last been seen in that area; his 1990 Jaguar was involved in an accident on the bridge, and was found abandoned nearby. Detective Ron Miller of the Alameda Police Dept. stated, "We believe it could be Hansen because of the stature of the body and because of the clothing, which is similar to what Hansen was wearing when he was last seen." The area had been searched before at both high and low tides, but, said Miller, "We think the body probably washed ashore. We won't know the cause of death for several weeks, but there were no outward signs of foul play." An expert odontologist is examining the dental records in order to make a positive identification; an announcement is expected today.

HOLLYWOOD PARK--MARYLAND JOCKEY CLUB TALKS CEASE Negotiations between Hollywood Park Inc. and the principals of the Maryland Jockey Club regarding Pimlico and Laurel Race Course have been terminated for the present time but may resume later, according to G. Michael Finnigan, executive vice president and chief financial officer of Hollywood Park. Hollywood Park had been in serious negotiations to buy the two Maryland tracks.

KRONE'S DOCTOR INJURED Dr. Frank Ariosta, a horse owner and the surgeon who reconstructed jockey Julie Krone's fractured right ankle last Sept., was involved in a serious automobile accident near Goshen, New York early Thursday morning. Ariosta is in critical condition in the ICU at Staten Island University Hospital, where he is Director of Orthopedics and the Center for Joint Reconstruction. The surgeon sustained extensive injuries including fractures of the pelvis and ribs as well as a punctured lung.

The path to the Derby begins in earnest Saturday, with two-turn stakes for three-year-olds at four different tracks. The stable area at Gulfstream contains a majority of this year's serious Derby contenders, so, not surprisingly, the Preview is this week's most important test. **Go for Gin** (Cormorant) is a dead serious Derby contender. His figures and pattern are excellent, and his half brother, Pleasant Tap, got better each year he raced. But Nick Zito's pattern is to not ask his charges for their best in the first start of a campaign, and he most certainly has his eye on greater prizes down the road with this one. So, while **Go for Gin** certainly is the one to beat, there may be value elsewhere. **Halo's Image** (Halo) will probably be second choice, but coming off two major efforts and trying two turns for the first time, a bounce is likely. **Money of the Mind** (Irish Tower) will also take action, and this one could be a nice horse--but his best race isn't quite good enough, at least so far.

ON TAP AT • GULFSTREAM

Go for Gin could strengthen a Remsen Stakes--Florida Derby link today in the \$75,000 Preview Stakes. "He's got an uncanny amount of ability--possibly more than any horse I've ever trained," said Nick Zito, his conditioner. Go for Gin numbers the Grade II Remsen Stakes as one of three 1993 wins. Over the years, several Remsen winners have gone on to outstanding performances in the \$500,000 Florida Derby and the spring Classics. Among them were Carry Back, Northern Dancer, Pleasant Colony, Dr. Carter and Alydar. The latter was second behind Affirmed in all three Triple Crown events. Zito's Strike the Gold finished second in the 1991 Florida Derby then won the Kentucky Derby.
