PAT DAY CLOSING IN ON 6,000 With three wins at Oaklawn Park Friday and two, including the El Camino Real Derby, at Bay Meadows yesterday, Hall of Fame jockey Pat Day increased his career total to 5,999, just one shy of the 6,000 milestone. Day will become the 10th rider in history to reach that plateau, following Bill Shoemaker, Laffit Pincay, Angel Cordero, Jorge Velasquez, Larry Snyder, David Gall, Carl Gambardella, John Longden and Sandy Hawley. "I'm taking it one race at a time," said Day. "I would prefer the winners to come in a bunch. Of course, you always hope that. I hope I don't get on 5,999 and hang there several days."

GULFSTREAM PURSE INCREASE Effective Tuesday, Jan. 25, purses at Gulfstream Park will be increased for the second time since the meet opened Jan. 4. All purses will go up five percent. "The additional money for the purses is due to the continued excellent response to our programs and simulcasting," said Douglas Donn, Gulfstream's president and CEO. "On-track gains reflect favorable public reaction to our new package admission plan and to reduced takeout." Over the first 13 days of racing, Gulfstream on-track handle was \$22,577,777 for an increase of 14 percent over '93. Simulcast wagering of \$65,627,473 is ahead by 218 percent. Earlier, purses were boosted 10 percent.

DESORMEAUX ON "EYEWITNESS VIDEO" Jockey Kent Desormeaux's life-threatening spill at Hollywood Park Dec. 11, 1992 will be the subject of a segment on tonight's edition of "Eyewitness Video" on NBC. The spill left Desormeaux in critical condition with multiple skull fractures; the rider recovered quickly and won his first two races back at the end of Jan., 1993.

Odds-on favorite GO FOR GIN, making his first start as a three-year-old and looking for his third straight stakes win, cruised up to the lead after three-quarters of a mile and galloped away from the field to win as much the best, smashing the stakes record by nearly two full seconds. The previous record of 1:43 2/5 was set in 1991. "He did it like the professional he is," said trainer Nick Zito. "He has so much ability, it's scary. Perhaps more than any horse I have ever trained. I think we have plenty left in the tank. We have two more to go in Florida--the Fountain of Youth and the Florida Derby." The colt paid \$3.40.

MUSIC MERCI RETIRED Eight-year-old gelding **Music Merci** (Stop the Music) has been retired from racing. According to trainer Bill Spawr, the Canadian-bred suffered ligament injuries to his right foreleg during a recent workout. "He's too old to bring back," said Spawr. "We'll make him a riding horse--a saddle horse. He's got a great temperament." The grey made his last start in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, finishing sixth; he retires with a record of 35-12-7-4 and \$1,500,710 in earnings.
