RACING CANCELLATIONS CONTINUE Live racing was cancelled at Aqueduct yesterday due to the heavy snow that hit the Northeast. It was the ninth cancellation of 1994 at the Big A. Yesterday's live racing cards were also cancelled at Garden State Park and Penn National. Suffolk Downs ran its first race before calling off the remainder of the card.

BREEDERS' CUP DISPUTE UNSETTLED Meetings today between the Kentucky HBPA and Churchill Downs produced no new developments in the dispute over revenues for the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup at the Louisville track. The dispute concerns a bonus, in which the horsemen would not share, that Churchill Downs would receive from the Breeders' Cup if it keeps expenses under a certain level. The HBPA has agreed to give up its share of proceeds from wagering on the Breeders' Cup, as it did when the track hosted the 1988 and '91 runnings of the event, if certain conditions are met. The HBPA is asking that \$250,000 from the Breeders' Cup bonus be utilized to offset purses for the three races preceding the event day races, and that Breeders' Cup provide an amount equal to the bonus incentive received by Churchill, in excess of the \$250,000 previously mentioned, to be deposited into the Horsemen's Purse Account. Both the Kentucky Racing Commission and the governor's office are trying to serve as catalysts to solve the dispute. Further discussions are planned for tomorrow.

NEW SPONSOR FOR ST. LEGER Great Britain's St. Leger, the world's oldest Classic race, has a new sponsor. TeleConnections (UK), a rapidly-growing message and fax communications company, has agreed to back the prestigious Doncaster event for three years. The St. Leger was first run in 1776.

CANADIAN TURF H.-GII, \$100,000, 3&up, 9f(T)
Daarik (IRE) (Diesis{GB}) breezed 1/2 mile on the turf Tues. in 52 seconds. "He just went easy," said trainer Tom Skiffington of the seven-year-old. "He is not the kind of horse that needs a tremendous amount of work. He runs better when he is fresh and feels good about himself--not tightened like a five day clock." Jerry Bailey has the mount.

HUTCHESON S.-GII, \$75,000, 3yo, 7f
The much anticipated rematch between 1993 Juvenile Champion **Dehere** (Deputy Minister) and undefeated **Holy Bull** (Great Above) has attracted five others as well. **Patton** (Lord At War{ARG}), who won his last start, an allowance at Gulfstream, by 11 lengths, boasts the same connections as '92 Florida Derby winner **Technology**. Owner Scott Savin compared the two. "Patton is very different from Technology," he said. "He has a tremendous burst of speed, and is a bit stockier. Technology is longer, more lean, and we always knew he wanted to go long. With Patton we're not sure." Jose Santos will ride. **You and I** (Kris S.), a 13 1/4-length allowance winner last out, worked a bullet five furlongs in :59 Tues. **Crary** (Mt. Livermore), second to Dehere in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 16, worked five furlongs Tues. in 1:01 under jockey Craig Perret. Completing the probable field are **Roglee** (Naevus), winner of the Inaugural S. at Tampa Bay Dec. 26, and **Sunshine Man** (Irish Open), who has won or placed in seven of eight lifetime starts.

ON TAP AT • GULFSTREAM

The \$500,000 GI Florida Derby, a major preview of the Triple Crown, will be telecast locally and nationally on ABC's "Wide World of Sports" March 12. In the past, the classic for three-year-olds, at 1 1/8 miles, had been blacked out in South Florida. The Florida Derby will be one of three national telecasts from Gulfstream during the current meeting. The others, to be aired by ESPN, will be the \$300,000 GI Donn Handicap Feb. 3 and the GI Fountain of Youth Stakes Feb. 19. The Donn is the first of the season's major tests for older Thoroughbred stars. The Fountain of Youth annually attracts leading Florida Derby and Triple Crown candidates.
