KOTASHAAN IS HORSE OF THE YEAR

Kotashaan (FR) (Darshaan {GB}), by a vote of 2-1 over **Lure** (Danzig), was named 1993 Horse of the Year by TRA President David Vance at Fri.'s 23rd annual Eclipse Awards Dinner. Each of the Eclipse Award sponsoring entities-- the TRA, the National Turf Writers Association (NTWA) and Daily Racing Form (DRF)-- casts a single bloc vote for Horse of the Year determined by the individual balloting within each organization. Kotashaan received votes from the TRA and NTWA, while Lure captured the DRF vote. All 1993 Eclipse Award recipients were honored in ceremonies emceed by actor John Forsythe at the New Orleans Riverside Hilton Hotel and Towers. Kotashaan was bred in France by brothers Jacques and Gerard Wertheimer, members of the French family that owns the world famous Chanel perfume manufacturing business. The Wertheimers raced Kotashaan under their farm name, La Presle Farm. Kotashaan won six of 10 starts in 1993, five of them Grade I events, and earned a season-leading \$2,619,014. After his victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf, he was sold to Shigeyuki Okada. Okada raced Kotashaan in the Japan Cup, in which he finished second. After the race, Kotashaan was retired to stud duty in Japan.

GARDEN STATE BANS SHIPPERS The New Jersey Racing Commission yesterday ordered a directive prohibiting all out-of-state Thoroughbred horses from shipping into Garden State Park to race because of the outbreak of a deadly form of herpes among horses stabled at Belmont Park. The NJ Racing Commission specifically named Belmont, Aqueduct, Philadelphia Park, Penn National and Delaware Park as tracks from which horses are not allowed to ship.

GARDEN STATE CONTINUED The NJ Racing Commission's directive also spelled out, "All horses shipping in to NJ tracks from locations other than the embargoed tracks must present a valid health certificate containing a certification from a licensed veterinarian stating that the horse has not come into contact with horses that may have been exposed to the virus." The directive, which is effective immediately, was ordered on the advice of the NJ Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Health. Test results from Cornell University's laboratories on several horses stabled at Belmont provided preliminary indications that the horses are inflicted with equine viral rhino-pneumonitis, but it will take at least another week before the test results can be confirmed.

SANTA ANITA UPGRADES SATELLITE INFORMATION Simulcast locations will now receive any jockey, weight, gelding or bleeder medication and late scratches through the television signal carrying the races from Santa Anita. Since Feb. 3, the late changes are being shown in a moving display across the bottom of the video screen. This is of particular importance to simulcast sites that take multiple signals because the sound is on only during the races at many of those sites. Among the multiple signal locations are the numerous race books in Las Vegas.

DOVE HUNT TO ENGLAND Will Farish's three-year-old turf specialist **Dove Hunt** (Danzig), winner of last year's GIII Laurel Futurity and GIII Pilgrim S., has been moved to John Gosden's Newmarket yard in England, where he will be pointed towards the 2000 Guineas and the English Derby. Dove Hunt's turf ability and the limited number of opportunities in the U.S. for turf horses are the major reasons behind Farish's decision to switch the colt to a British trainer.

GOLDEN GATE RACES TO GO UP ON

SATELLITE Beginning today, horse racing fans from across the country with satellites will be able to pick up replays of the Golden Gate Fields races. The races will go up on Spacenet 4, Channel 4, from 6 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. PST.
