WINTER STORM FORCES CANCELLATIONS

Snow and freezing rain in the Northeast and Midwest forced six tracks to cancel Wed.'s racing cards-- Aqueduct, Garden State, Beulah Park, Turfway Park, Suffolk Downs and Penn National.

GULFSTREAM PURSE INCREASES TOTAL 25 PERCENT

Effective Feb. 10, Gulfstream's overnight purses will have been boosted 25 percent since the meeting opened, Douglas Donn, track president and CEO, announced yesterday. "The unprecedented response to Gulfstream's racing programs, both on track and via simulcasting, is responsible for the increase," said Donn. For the first 28 days of the current meeting, Gulfstream commingled simulcast wagering totaled \$153,008,275, or a gain of 206 percent over the 1993 season. On track handle totaled \$49,890,903, or a gain of nine percent over 1993.

GOLDEN GATE EMPLOYS QUICK OFFICIAL

In order to give fans more wagering time between races, Golden Gate Fields instituted the "quick official" program beginning yesterday. The "quick official" will take place when stewards deem there were no incidents in a race to merit further review and no participants-- jockeys, trainers and owners-- indicate they wish to lodge an objection.

ANOTHER REVIEW STILL ACTIVE

Another Review (Buckaroo), who in 1992 captured the GI Californian at Hollywood and the GI San Bernardino at Santa Anita, remains active-- in Saudi Arabia, finishing third in Sun.'s Crown Prince Cup in Riyadh. While in America, Another Review was owned by Buckland Farm and trained by Chris Speckert.

SAN ANTONIO H.-GII, \$250,000, 4&up, 9f
1993 Eclipse Award-winning sprinter **Cardmania** (Cox's Ridge) galloped a mile yesterday at Hollywood Park and will ship to Santa Anita Sun. morning for the race. "We still think he can stay at a distance, but there's only one way to find out," said trainer Derek Meredith. "If it doesn't work out, we can always go back to sprinting." Laffit Pincay Jr., who was scheduled to ride **Slew of Damascus** (Slewacide), will instead be aboard 1992 San Antonio winner **Ibero (ARG)** (Cinco Grande). Slew of Damascus, winner of his last four starts, all graded stakes, will be handled by Pat Valenzuela. **Best Pal** (*Habitony) worked six furlongs Mon. at Hollywood in 1:11 4/5 handily. A trio of San Antonio probables worked at Santa Anita Sat. **The Wicked North** (Far North) went five furlongs in :59 3/5 seconds; **Star Recruit** (Al Nasr {FR}) was clocked in 1:14 for six furlongs; **Region** (Devil's Bag) breezed a mile in 1:41 3/5. Others scheduled to go forth in the San Antonio H. include **Fast Cure** (Cure the Blues), **Mojave Gold** (Woodman), **Have Fun** (Top-sider) and **Hill Pass** (Temperence Hill).

SANTA MARIA H.-GI, \$150,000a, 4&up, f&m, 8.5f
Southern Truce (Truce Maker), recently sold by Regal Rose Stable to Robert and Janice McNair of Houston, has suffered a quarter crack on the right foreleg and will miss the Santa Maria, said trainer Roger Stein Wed. "I could patch it up and run her, but I'm not," said Stein. "The year's too long. It pains me greatly to miss this race, because she's trained great."

ZIGNEW UNDERGOES SURGERY San Fernando
 S. winner **Zignew** (Danzig), fourth in Sun.'s Strub S.
 at Santa Anita, fractured his left front cannon bone in
 that race, apparently after crossing the finish line.
 "They put seven screws in the leg," said Eva
 Smithwick, wife and assistant to trainer Dan
 Smithwick Jr. The three hour and 10 minute opera-
 tion took place at Alamo Pintado in Solvang Mon.
 "He's not out of the woods yet," said his trainer. "It
 was a bad fracture, close to being a compound frac-
 ture, but the operation couldn't have gone any better.
 There's an outside chance he could be a racehorse
 again, but this is a critical period."
