CARDMANIA FRACTURES CANNON

BONE Eclipse Award-winning sprinter Cardmania (Cox's Ridge) suffered a fractured cannon bone in his left hind leg and will be out of action indefinitely, trainer Derek Meredith said Friday. "I still can't believe it," said Meredith. "He galloped this morning (Friday) and then he walked back to the barn good. In fact, I went ahead and entered him for (Sunday's San Antonio)." Meredith said he detected a limp while cooling out the eight-year-old gelding and that subsequent x-rays revealed a fracture of the cannon bone; indications are that Cardmania will probably need surgery and may be out of action for at least six months.

Saturday's Santa Maria marks the start of Paseana's (Ahmad) campaign to become the leading distaff money earner of all time. Although she repeated as champ last year at six, Paseana's figures were a couple of steps off her five-year-old form, and now that she is seven she figures to slow some more. That, combined with the fact that she is coming off a layoff and spotting significant weight to a talented younger filly means we have to pick against her. **Sensational Eyes** (Roman Majesty) didn't debut until the summer of her three-year-old year, but quickly developed into a top filly, running a real big one in October's Cal Cup. The resulting bounce buried a lot of people at 3-5 in her next start, but in the one after that, her last race, she made a forward move that leads us to believe she is cycling to her best. *Thoro-Graph sheets, state-of-the-art performance figures, are used by many horsemen and professional handicappers to evaluate the ability of racehorses. Hall of Fame jockey Eddie Arcaro will be Mary Ryan's featured guest on the Saturday, Feb. 12 edition of the "Inside Track" paddock show. The program will start at noon. Arcaro, who retired from riding in 1961, won 4,799 races during his 31-year career, including five Kentucky Derbies. In all, he participated in 58 Triple Crown events and is the only rider to pilot two winners of the series, Whirlaway in 1941 and Citation in 1948. Arcaro was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1958. The "Inside Track" is free of charge for all attending Gulfstream Park.
