### CARDMANIA RECOVERING FROM SURGERY

**Cardmania** (Cox's Ridge), the '93 champion sprinter, is doing well after surgery to place two screws in his fractured left hind cannon bone. "He came out of the surgery in good order," said trainer Derek Meredith. "He'll be up at Alamo Pintado for two or three weeks and then we'll bring him back to our property in El Monte. From there, who knows? The doctor said his chances for complete recovery are good and that maybe he could race in nine or 10 months."

### BIEN BIEN BREEZES

Turf specialist **Bien Bien** (Manila) breezed a half mile at Santa Anita Friday in :48, handily, but it has not yet been decided if the five-year-old will make his next start in Monday's San Luis Obispo or the March 5 Santa Anita H. "We can't do both," said co-owner Trudy McCaffery. "If we miss (the San Luis Obispo), then we'd consider running in the Big 'Cap." Weather and track conditions will be major factors in the decision; Bien Bien has not run well on soft turf, but he did win the GII Swaps S. on the dirt at Hollywood in 1992.

### "MONDAY MADNESS" AT GARDEN STATE

**PARK** Garden State Park will shoot for a simulcasting record Monday, Feb. 21, when it simulcasts entire afternoon cards from 11 race tracks across America. On a normal day, the New Jersey oval carries racing from four to eight tracks. "We had to add to our equipment and have been preparing for it for more than a week now, but our television department says it's definitely a go," said Garden State Simulcasting Director Thomas Burke. Added General Manager Richard Orbann, "We aren't aware of any track that on a single afternoon has attempted to simulcast as many as 11 full-card programs from other tracks. But we're betting that our fans will really enjoy the constant action and be up to the challenges."

Fountain of Youth longshot **You and I** (Kris S.) may have a new owner. Eclipse Award-winning trainer Bobby Frankel was in Florida Thursday evening to look at the colt and present trainer Stan Hough says the sale is all but final. "If he is sold, I don't think he will run (Saturday)," said Hough. "I hate to lose him, but I am part owner, and that is my business." Hough did not disclose the purchase price.

Entrymates **Dehere** (Deputy Minister) and **Warm Wayne** (Affirmed) galloped at Palm Beach Downs yesterday. Trainer Reynaldo Nobles had planned on breezing the pair, but did not because of the muddy track. "I don't breeze horses in the mud," said Nobles, adding, "I spoke to Mr. Brennan and told him I didn't like the track and I didn't like what I have done with them for the past two days. I told him I would not run them; the decision has been left to him. I think he is trying to buy time to see how the weather breaks. We'll play it by ear."

### Thoro-Graph Analysis of the Fountain of Youth By Jerry Brown

The 1994 three-year-olds promise to make up for past years--and then some--and several of the top contenders from what may be the best crop of our era will be at Gulfstream Saturday.

**Holy Bull** (Great Above) may be favored in the Fountain of Youth off his sensational figure in the Hutcheson, but this may be a case of too much, too soon. Very few horses in the history of the game have been able to run that big a figure and not be knocked out by it. Holy Bull should bounce, which doesn't necessarily mean he will lose, but makes him vulnerable.

**Go for Gin** (Cormorant) has developed nicely, and along with Brocco is one of the two most likely to win the Derby in May. We thought he would be short for his seasonal debut in the Preview, but instead he ran very well and with a huge workout since, should be coming up to his best race to date.

**Dehere** (Deputy Minister) is still living off his reputation as a two-year-old. He reminds us a lot of Arazi, and while he may have a decent year, he's unlikely to win the Fountain of Youth from an outside post and unlikely to win a classic.

While Go for Gin is clearly the most likely winner, the value in the race, should he start, is **You and I** (Kris S.). The colt's last only looks weak because Holy Bull ran a hole in the wind, and he may be pointing to the best race of his life. By Kris S., he should be okay in his first try at two turns and he will be a big price. We will be making a win bet on You and I, and protecting with an exacta under Go for Gin.
