EXERCISE RIDER CRITICALLY

INJURED AT GULFSTREAM Mary Rafferty, an exercise rider for trainer Allen Jerkens, was seriously injured in a training accident at Gulfstream Park Monday morning. Rafferty was breezing the four-year-old filly Vindication, who broke down just before the quarter pole and fell; the 41-year-old rider was unconscious when the paramedics got to her, and she is in critical condition at Hollywood Memorial Hospital. The filly was humanely destroyed. In an unrelated incident at the Florida track, two horses collided just after the break Monday morning, sending another rider to the hospital. Kelly Allen was jogging Butch Richard's trainee Medical Pro when the horse bolted to the inside rail and froze in the path of Hazy, breezing for trainer Nick Zito with jockey Donna Barton aboard. Allen was taken to Aventura Medical Hospital complaining of pains on the left side of her rib cage. Fortunately, both horses and Barton walked away from the accident.

ARDROSS DEAD Ardross (Run The Gantlet), winner of 14 races and over 400,000 pounds, died of a heart attack in England over the weekend. The 18-year-old had recently been named the leading National Hunt sire of 1992-93; during his racing career, he captured the Ascot Gold Cup twice, in 1981 and '82.

PINCAY EXPECTED BACK IN THE SADDLE

THURSDAY Jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. should be back in action Thursday, according to his agent, Bob Meldahl. Injured in a spill at Santa Anita Saturday, the veteran rider was still sore Monday morning, but Meldahl has accepted three mounts for Thursday's Santa Anita card.

I just wish the turf had been a little kinder for him because they say he doesn't like it soft."
