SCHEDULE Twenty stakes worth nearly \$2.5 million highlight the 1994 Monmouth Park meet set for May 29-Sept. 4. The 72-day meet features 13 graded races, including the GI \$500,000 Haskell Invitational July 31 and the GI \$250,000 Iselin H. Aug. 21. The Oceanport, New Jersey track increased the purse of the GI Molly Pitcher, scheduled for June 4, from \$150,000 to \$200,000; the GI \$100,000 Post-Deb S., June 26, has been renamed to honor former Monmouth Park chairman Reeve Schley, Jr., who passed away last year. For the first time this year, Monmouth Park will take simulcast signals Mondays and Thursdays during the live meet.

BAZE INJURED Northern California-based jockey Russell Baze suffered a broken bone in his left hand Mon. when, in an angry outburst, he punched a wall in the jockey's room. "I hit the wall and the wall hit back," joked Baze, who is sporting a splint. The splint allows Baze to continue to ride while a cast would have sidelined the jockey for four weeks. Baze punched the wall following Mon.'s second race at Golden Gate Fields when his mount **Nostalgically** (Nostalgia's Star) was disqualified from first and placed second for bumping **Current Pleasure** (Little Current) in deep stretch. Since sustaining the injury, Baze has gone five-for-11 (through Wed.'s card) and is leading the standings by one race over Vann Belvoir, 32-31.

MIKE LEE ENDS RIDING CAREER Jockey Mike Lee, injured in a spill at Calder Race Course Nov. 12, returned to the track for the first time since the accident yesterday, but sadly announced he will not be returning to the saddle. Lee, who suffered compressed fractures of several vertebrae and underwent surgery Nov. 23, was released from the hospital Jan. 28. The release came two-and-a-half months earlier than expected, but despite the speedy recovery doctors have strongly recommended that he end his riding career. "It's very tough for me to be here," said Lee during his visit to Gulfstream Park. "I want to ride, but I cannot do that. The doctors told me if I fall again, it could be devastating. I have no choice but to accept what they said."

FRAISE BREEZES FOR PAN AMERICAN Fraise (Strawberry Road), looking for a repeat in the GI Pan American H. at Gulfstream in two weeks, breezed a strong mile over the Gulfstream turf yesterday. Working around the "dogs", the five-year-old went the distance in 1:34. "I was happy with today's work; he's coming along nicely," said trainer Bill Mott. Mott added that the promising three-year-old **Lahint** (Woodman) is back in training after missing several days because of a fever, but did not say where the full brother to GI winner Hansel would start next.

OHIO TRACKS REACH SCHEDULING AGREEMENT Ohio's three thoroughbred tracks, Thistledown, Beulah Park and River Downs, have reached an agreement on their racing formats for the spring and summer months, which was approved by the Ohio State Racing Commission Feb. 16. Under the arrangement Thistledown, which opens March 5, will participate with Beulah in an "8&7" plan of live races combined with simulcasts from each other's tracks; River Downs will join those two tracks April 15 and repeat last year's successful "7&7" formula. The agreement calls for six days of racing with Thursday dark.
