### DEHERE FRACTURES CANNON BONE

Dehere (Deputy Minister) suffered a potentially career-ending injury Friday morning during a workout at Palm Beach Downs, fracturing his right hind cannon bone. Owner Robert Brennan said that the 1993 Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old's condition was not considered life-threatening, but that the colt would not start again this year, and may be retired permanently. "This morning he worked three-quarters of a mile at Palm Beach Downs," said Brennan Friday. "It was his last major work for the Florida Derby, and he did it in 1:13. We thought he had had another nice work, but returning to the barn he was sore and became increasingly more lame cooling out. We did treat him with Bute and Banamine and took some X-rays. In technical terms, he has a commutated lateral condylar fracture of the third metacarpal. In layman's terms he has a fracture of the right hind cannon bone just above the ankle." Brennan said that Dehere was resting in his stall with a stabilizing bandage for support, and that additional X-rays would be taken to determine if he is a candidate for surgery. "Depending on the placement of the bones, there is a possibility of putting some screws in," said Brennan. "If not, he would be retired immediately. He is clearly out of the races for this year and we are evaluating it over the next few days. Our only interest right now is to make Dehere comfortable. It is very sad news for us, and demonstrates once again how fragile these athletes are." Brennan emphasized that the Dehere Foundation, partially supported by Dehere's racetrack earnings and formed to combat inner-city violence, would continue with a \$3 million personal guarantee on Brennan's part. Dehere won his last start, the Feb. 18 Fountain of Youth at Gulfstream.

Many race handicappers are picking **The Wicked North** (Far North) in this one, but there are real questions about his ability to negotiate the distance, as well as his ability to stand the effects of his latest effort, a lifetime best. **Region** (Devil's Bag) finished behind **The Wicked North** in the San Antonio H. after a troubled trip. His previous three starts were all very strong and make him the most solid horse in the race, although he's not our pick. Starting in September, **Kissin Kris** (Kris S.) traveled from Canada to Louisiana, then to California, east to Florida, then back to California for last month's Strub. As we have discussed before, very few horses run well after shipping to California unless they have time to acclimate, and **Kissin Kris** ran pretty well, considering. Now he's had another month on the grounds and should be ready to run his best race, which is better than that of anyone else in here. We like him to win, and we'll play an exacta box with **Region**. *Thoro-Graph sheets, state-of-the-art performance figures, are used by many horsemen and professional handicappers to evaluate the ability of racehorses. **FLORIDA HBPA BLOCKS HIALEAH**

**SIMULCAST** Representatives of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association have refused to sign a contract with Hialeah Racetrack, set to open March 17, which will prevent the track from sending its simulcast signal outside of Florida. The problem stems from Hialeah's rate of takeout. "We asked Hialeah to cap their takeout at 18 and 25 percent, the highest rates charged in the state outside of Hialeah," said Florida HBPA President Kent Stirling. "John Van Lindt (Hialeah's vice president) told us they were going to charge the same rate as last year, 23 percent for straight wagers and 28 percent for exotics. When we went to our board of directors, they voted 12-2 not to sign a contract with Hialeah. The decision will cost the horsemen running at Hialeah a lot in purse money, but we think it's something we have to do." Van Lindt declined to comment.

**BROCCO TO SKIP SAN RAFAEL Brocco**

(Kris S.) was not entered in Sunday's \$150,000 San Rafael, and will instead point for the \$200,000 San Felipe March 20, according to trainer Randy Winick. "He's about 85 percent," said Winick. "This isn't a setback at all because our main objective has always been the (April 9) Santa Anita Derby and then, hopefully, the (May 7) Kentucky Derby." Winick said Brocco will work seven furlongs Sunday, weather permitting. "The horse is doing great, and with the extra work he'll be fit enough to run a good race in the San Felipe."

**SARDULA TO PASS SANTA ANITA OAKS**

Eclipse Award juvenile filly runner-up **Sardula** (Storm Cat) will skip the Santa Anita Oaks next Sunday, said trainer Brian Mayberry. "She's perfectly all right," said Mayberry, discounting a rumor that the filly had been coughing. "You can run out of horses, but you can't run out of races. We're pointing her to the (May 6) Kentucky Oaks."

**PORTLAND MEADOWS SETS RECORD**

**HANDLE** Oregon's Portland Meadows established a new one-week handle record of \$2,385,534 during the 22nd week of the track's 30-week 1993-94 season. The new record handle, which includes live and simulcast racing from Feb. 21 through Feb. 27, is the second weekly handle record set this season. The previous record of \$2,375,658 was set during Breeders' Cup week, Nov. 1 to Nov. 7, 1993. Portland Meadows is enjoying a successful season, which has led to five purse increases since the beginning of the meet, Oct. 2.

**Pistols and Roses** (Darn That Alarm) looks to put together two wins in a row for the first time in memory after upsetting in the Feb. 5 Donn. "It's a mood thing with him," said jockey Heberto Castillo Jr. "If he fires, he is a great horse to ride. If he doesn't, he can give you a headache." **Devil His Due** (Devil's Bag) carries three pounds less than he did in the Donn last out when he finished seventh. "I can't believe that much weight can make any difference either way," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "It is not a big switch like years ago when one horse would get in with 132 and another horse would get in with 105. The luck of the race, the break and how a horse feels on that particular day is a lot different than one or two pounds." **Migrating Moon** (Silver Buck) may try blinkers for the first time Sunday. "We always thought that he may need them because he waits on horses and he hesitates when passing horses," said trainer Ralph Ziadie. "The first thing Jose (Santos) said when he got off of him after the Donn was that this would be a much better horse with blinkers. So, now that we are facing the cream of the crop, we will have to pull out all the plugs." **Strolling Along** (Danzig) goes for his fourth consecutive stakes victory for trainer Shug McGaughey. "He likes this track and wants to run that far, which might be something some of the others in there don't want to do," said McGaughey.
