THE WICKED NORTH'S D.Q.

APPEALED Owner Philip Hersh has filed an appeal with the California Horse Racing Board on the disqualification of **The Wicked North** (Far North) from first to fourth in Saturday's Santa Anita Handicap. A hearing is likely to be held within 30 days, according to steward Tom Ward. "I'm extremely disappointed," said trainer David Bernstein. "I didn't see enough to warrant a disqualification. It's an unfortunate incident, and it isn't good for racing. On the positive side, the horse came out of the race and we will point him to the (April 16) Oaklawn Handicap."

RECORD \$17.4 MILLION BET ON BIG 'CAP CARD AT SANTA ANITA A Los Angeles Turf Club record \$17,485,563 was wagered on Saturday's Santa Anita Handicap card, the second highest handle in track history. Saturday's total is exceeded only by the \$36,264,799 bet on the Breeders' Cup Day program Nov. 6. A total of \$8,202,350 was wagered on Saturday's 57th running of the Big Cap, also a record.

HOLY BULL BREEZES Holy Bull (Great Above) worked five furlongs in a bullet :59 1/5 in his final prep for Saturday's \$500,000 Florida Derby. "He did it handily," said trainer Jimmy Croll. "He is ready."

AQUEDUCT STAYS ON INNER TRACK

Racing will remain on Aqueduct's inner track at least through Sunday, March 13 due to the effects of the severe winter, according to NYRA Vice President of Racing, Terry Meyocks. Due to the switch, the distance of next Saturday's \$100,000-added Bay Shore Stakes will be shortened to six furlongs. "The main track will be re-evaluated the middle of the week to determine its status for the following week," said Meyocks. A field of seven to nine is expected in the Bay Shore.

STRODES CREEK TO SANTA ANITA DERBY, FLYING SENSATION OUT Charlie Whittingham may have found his Derby horse in **Strodes Creek** (Halo), who moved his career record to 2-for-3 with an impressive win in Saturday's third race at Santa Anita. "He's an impressive animal to look at," said Whittingham, who last won the Santa Anita Derby with another son of Halo, Sunday Silence, in 1989 en route to a win in the Kentucky Derby. "He's a big horse and he knows it. But he's learning and he's becoming more mature. The grandstand was packed with people down at the rail, more than I remember in a while, but it didn't bother him." **Flying Sensation** (Flying Paster), the morning-line third choice in the San Rafael Stakes, was scratched from the race after developing soreness on Friday and will miss the Santa Anita Derby as well. "I breezed him three furlongs Friday and when we came back to the barn, I didn't suspect a thing," said trainer David Warren. "But an hour and a half later, he was sore. We had him x-rayed and he was clean as a whistle, but we're taking him to the Nuclear Medicine Building Monday to get some nuclear images taken." Warren said he hoped the injury was simply a pulled muscle in his right front elbow or shoulder.

DEHERE TO UNDERGO SURGERY

Dehere (Deputy Minister), who came out of a six-furlong workout Friday at Palm Beach Downs with a fracture of the right hind cannon bone, will undergo surgery at an undetermined Palm Beach-area clinic Monday or Tuesday, according to John Perrotta, general manager for Due Process Stables. The surgery will be performed by Colorado veterinarian Dr. Wayne McKilrath. "Mr. Brennan's main hope is to return Dehere to the races," said Perrotta. "We are hoping that the surgery will be successful and there will be no damage to the joint surface. We have to play it by ear but we are hoping for a 100% recovery. Some horses recover better than others, but he is a very intelligent horse and he is not the type to thrash around and hurt himself." Explained Nobles of the decision to treat the colt locally, "We didn't want him to travel too far and risk further damage. Dehere is receiving medication and is resting as well as can be expected."

DEVIL HIS DUE WITHDRAWN FROM GULFSTREAM PARK HANDICAP

Devil His Due (Devil's Bag) was withdrawn from today's Gulfstream Park Handicap. According to trainer Allen Jerkens, "He had a little blood in his nose when he came back from a little work (Saturday) morning. He scoped clean. There was no blood in his trachea. It may be sinus trouble. The vet was very surprised there was no blood when he scoped him. Although he scoped clean and probably is alright, Devil His Due is too valuable to run and take a chance."
