FLY'N J. BRYAN COLICS A case of colic may have prevented **Fly'n J. Bryan** (Ogygian) from running his best in Sunday's San Rafael, according to trainer Doug Peterson. The colt finished fourth, beaten 19 lengths as the 7-10 favorite in the five-horse field. Peterson said that jockey Corey Black had told him that the colt didn't feel quite right warming up, and that his own suspicions had grown post-race. "He didn't look good when he walked off behind me," said Peterson. "When I got him back to the barn he continued to take some steps that were off behind. I went ahead and got him cooled out, and then the horse colicked very bad. We treated him and walked him and took care of him and got him through that kind of a long evening." Peterson said that the incident wouldn't set the colt back any, but may alter his plans somewhat. "If he'd have won the race or run good, he'd have gone on the Jim Beam or the Blue Grass, but I think now maybe we'll look for something a little softer; let him get back to his winning ways and also have confidence again."

LET'S ELOPE RETIRED Dennis and Margaret Marks' Australian champion mare **Let's Elope** (Nassipour) has been retired due to a hairline fracture of the right front cannon bone. She will be sent to Kentucky where she may be bred to Danzig.

BARRETT'S SALE UP The average price, \$37,268, was up 39.1% over last year's figure of \$26,674 at the Wednesday preferred session of Barretts' annual March sale of two-year-olds in training. Seventy-one horses were sold for gross revenue of \$2,646,000, up from \$1,440,400 in '93, an increase of 83.7%. The median price, \$30,000, was up 25% over last year's \$24,000.

California shipper **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o'Gold) blew out three furlongs in a bullet :34 yesterday, two seconds faster than the next fastest work. "He handles this track super," said trainer Grant Hofmans. "I caught him galloping out in :46 3/5." **Lahint** (Woodman) edged **Canaveral** (Relaunch) out of a definite spot in the race, with an earnings edge of \$32,770 to \$27,000. Preference is given first to graded stakes winners, and then to horses who have accumulated the highest total earnings.

1993 FLORIDA-BRED CHAMPIONS

ANNOUNCED Two Breeders' Cup winners and three offspring of Kris S. (Roberto) were among the divisional champions announced by the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' And Owners' Assoc. yesterday. **Brocco** (Kris S.), winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile was named champion two-year-old colt; MSW **Cut the Charm** (Cutlass), champion two-year-old filly; Haskell winner **Kissin Kris** (Kris. S), three-year-old colt; Breeders' Cup Distaff winner **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.), three-year-old filly; **Birdonthewire** (Proud Birdie), the winner of three straight stakes in New York, took both handicap male and sprint honors; **Turnback the Alarm** (Darn That Alarm), handicap female; and **Carterista** (Dr. Carter), turf horse. The Horse, Breeder and Broodmare of the Year will be announced at the FTBOA Awards Banquet March 19. Kris S. stands at Prestonwood Farm in Versailles, Ky.

U.S. BREDS STILL STRONG IN BRITISH

CLASSICS More than 42% of the horses entered for Britain's first four Classics of 1994 were bred in America. In all, 179 out of a total 424 colts and fillies entered in those events bear the suffix (USA). Newmarket's 2,000 Guineas was the most popular draw, with 45 of 87 entries (52%) bred in the United States. Weakest from an American standpoint is the Epsom Oaks, with only 30 of 96 (31%). The other figures are: Newmarket's 1,000 Guineas, 38 of 90 (42%) and the Epsom Derby's 66 of 151 (44%).

FUMO DI LONDRA MAY RETURN HOME

Fumo di Londra (Indian Ridge), purchased by Jenny Craig as a Christmas present for her husband, Sidney, may be returned to England following his last-place finish in Sunday's San Rafael, where he was beaten 31 lengths. "The dirt bothered him," said trainer Ron McAnally. "I think there's a good chance he'll go back to England. I'll discuss it with the Craigs and we'll make a decision."

PIMLICO ANNOUNCES STAKES SCHEDULE

The 119th running of the \$500,000 Preakness S. May 21 highlights a 28-race, \$3.375 million stakes schedule released yesterday by Pimlico Race Course. Preakness 'All Star' week begins with the Grade I, \$600,000 Pimlico Special and the \$200,000 Pimlico Distaff Saturday, May 14. Twelve stakes races will be spread over seven racing days during the week. The Preakness, middle jewel of the Triple Crown, will be televised live by ABC Sports. Pimlico will offer a total of nine graded stakes during the 56-day meet, which begins Tuesday, March 29.

When I see a horse pulling the rider on the turn, just dragging him up like he did, it says a lot about a horse. Judging from the way he's been acting around the barn, at worst I think he can run as good as that last race."
