## MOTT SETS NEW SINGLE-SEASON WIN

**RECORD AT GULFSTREAM** Bill Mott became the winningest trainer at a single meeting in Gulfstream Park history Mon. when he sent out Madeleine Paulson's favored **Dahlia's Dreamer** (Theatrical {IRE}) to win the ninth race, an allowance at about a mile and a sixteenth on the turf. The win was Mott's 32nd of the season, topping the old mark of 31 set by Tom W. Kelley in 1987. This has been an exceptional meeting for Mott, who has five stakes wins. Among those scores is a triumph by **Scuffleburg** (Cox's Ridge) in the GI Gulfstream Park H. and three by **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {FR}) in the GIII Appleton H., the GII Canadian Turf H. and the Fort Lauderdale H. He also sent out **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}) to win the GII Pan American H.

## GOLDEN EAGLE FARM, JONES PART

**COMPANY** The successful owner-trainer team of Golden Eagle Farm and Gary Jones have parted company. Jones, who saddled **Best Pal** (\*Habibony) for Golden Eagle owners John and Betty Mabee to win the 1992 Santa Anita H. and supervised the California-bred gelding for most of his career as he earned more than \$4.7 million, recently had just two horses for the Mabees: **Majestic Style** (Nureyev) and **Beautiful Gem** (Mr. Prospector). "He's not going to be the trainer for Mr. Mabee at the moment," said Gayle Van Leer, racing manager of Golden Eagle Farm, of Jones. "We'll see what happens down the road." Van Leer noted that the Mabees and Jones had separated as owner-trainer once before some years back, and added the latest breakup was not due to any single incident. Jones saddled Beautiful Gem to a fourth-place finish in Sun.'s Santa Anita Oaks behind another of his trainees, the undefeated **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew). Beautiful Gem is now in the barn of trainer Rodney Rash, Van Leer said. Majestic Style's new trainer is Richard Mandella.

Trainer Christopher Clement will saddle both the highweight **Trampoli** (Tremolino) and **Snow House (IRE)** (Vacarme). Clement said of Trampoli, "She is a top class mare. She won her last three, is doing well and looks great." Trampoli has not raced since Jan. 1, when she took the La Prevoyante H. at Calder by 2 1/2 lengths. "She was due to run in The Very One, but it came off the grass," Clement explained. "We tried to run her a couple of times at a mile and three eighths, but the races didn't go. She has been running well fresh in the past. She was off for two and a half months before she won the La Prevoyante. I am not worried." Stablemate Snow House (IRE) will be making her first start in the United States. The five-year-old, who has won eight of 13 starts in France, arrived in Clement's barn at Payson Park in Dec. "I know it is ambitious to run her in a Grade II when she hasn't run in this country," said Clement. "But I like her and we'll see what happens. She has not been impressive in her works in the morning, but not many mares who go long on the grass do work impressively in the mornings, especially at Payson."

**O'BRIEN'S HIGH COURT CLAIM** Vincent O'Brien has launched a London High Court action against insurers who are refusing to pay out over the loss of 1981 English Derby winner **Shergar** (IRE) (Great Nephew {GB}). O'Brien, along with his wife Jacqueline, John and Susan Magnier and Robert Sangster, has registered his claim as a joint owner of the Coolmore Stud, which held three 250,000 pound shares in the stallion, whose value was estimated at 10 million pounds. **Shergar**, thought to have been abducted by the IRA, has never been found after disappearing from his Irish base in February 1983.
