### FAIRPLEX OPENS FRIDAY IN SATELLITE

**EXPERIMENT** Fairplex Park in Pomona, Calif. will open Fri. for satellite wagering on Santa Anita races in an experiment through April 25, the end of the current Santa Anita meeting. The Fri. opening is subject to the final approval of the California Horse Racing Board. Santa Anita previously has declined sending the racing and wagering signal to Fairplex because of the geographical proximity of the two facilities. Clifford C. Goodrich, President of Santa Anita Park, said that Fairplex agreed to pay an "impact fee" to offset anticipated loss of business at Santa Anita from fans who will instead go to the Pomona fairgrounds. "At the end of our meeting, all parties involved will decide what will be the policy for the future," said Goodrich.

### HIALEAH OPENS TODAY

Hialeah Park in Hialeah, Florida opens its gates today, kicking off 58 days of live racing through Sun., May 22. Post time is 1 p.m. daily and Mondays will be dark. The meet will showcase five graded stakes events, including the GIII Widener H., GIII Hialeah Turf Cup H. and GIII Flamingo S. for three-year-olds. The combined total of 23 stakes are worth nearly \$2 million. This year's Interstate Wagering program will include Aqueduct on a five race per day basis through March and full card simulcasting to the Ontario Jockey Club, Meadowlands, Monmouth, Philadelphia Park and Laurel Race Course. A new Information Booth and Service Center, including lottery ticket sales, is located in the Clubhouse lobby. Marketing Director Steve Bovo has announced that the Florida Lottery will have a \$1 million drawing at Hialeah in May.

### BIG 'CAP APPEAL RESCHEDULED AGAIN

The hearing date of the Santa Anita H. appeal now has "tentatively" been returned to this Sat. That was the original date set for the appeal of **The Wicked North's** owner, Philip Hersh and trainer David Bernstein, to be heard by California Horse Racing Board officer Steven Schwartz. The date was later moved to the week of April 17. The appeal concerns the disqualification of **The Wicked North** (Far North) from first to fourth in the Big 'Cap.

**SAN FELIPE S.-GII, \$200,000a, 3yo, 8.5f** Trainer Ron McAnally said **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty) may have one more short workout before the race. "We might work him a half-mile or a quarter-mile Thurs. or Fri.," said McAnally yesterday. "But he's ready to run." Trainer Randy Winick said Tues. of Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner **Brocco** (Kris S.), "He galloped today and he went great. He ate up good, he's feeling good, his temperature is good. He's ready." Trainer Wesley Ward reported that **Unfinished Symph** (Aloha Prospector), who breezed seven furlongs in 1:31 3/5 yesterday at Santa Anita, will run. The Maryland-bred has won two of three lifetime starts and will be making his first stakes attempt. The field of probables also includes **Numerous** (Mr. Prospector), **Strodes Creek** (Halo) and **Pollock's Luck** (Polish Navy). **Numerous**, a full brother to **Jade Robbery** (G1-France, by Mr. Prospector), worked five furlongs in :58 Tues. on Santa Anita's fast main track.

### CALIFORNIA HOPEFULS

Winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile with Brocco last November was one of trainer Randy Winick's greatest moments in racing. Only one thing, he says, could top it.

"Winning the Kentucky Derby is more important to me than any Breeders' Cup race," Winick said at his Santa Anita barn the other day as Brocco prepared for his three-year-old debut in the San Felipe Stakes this Sunday.

Since the advent of the Breeders' Cup in 1984, no Juvenile winner has gone on to capture the roses in Louisville the following May. One of the chief reasons, Winick and other trainers point out, is the difficulty of getting horses ready for peak performances late in their two-year-old seasons and early in their three-year-old campaigns.

D. Wayne Lukas has learned this lesson the hard way, winning three consecutive runnings of the Juvenile from 1986-88 with, respectively, Capote, Success Express and Is It True, but getting only one of them-- Capote-- to the Kentucky Derby, and then only for a dismal 16th-place finish in which the colt was eased.

Lukas trainee Tabasco Cat ran third in the 1993 Juvenile, but Lukas says he believes by not over-racing the Storm Cat colt he will have a live animal on Derby Day.

"He's run two races this year and will run once more, in the Santa Anita Derby, before we ship to Kentucky," Lukas says, recalling Tabasco Cat's winning efforts in the El Camino Real Derby at Bay Meadows in January and the San Rafael Stakes at Santa Anita on March 6.

Winick says running Brocco in the Breeders' Cup wasn't even in the original plans for the colt he purchased out of a two-year-olds-in-training sale early last year for movie mogul Albert Broccoli.

"We were buying a horse we could race as a three-year-old," Winick recalls. "We thought even if he raced only once at two, or not at all, that this was the type of colt who would be best when he ran longer distances as a three-year-old."

"But he developed so quickly, and started training so well at Del Mar last summer, we felt we could give him some seasoning and not hurt him for later on. It turned out great, obviously, but if he hadn't shown an inclination for wanting to run as a

two-year-old we wouldn't have rushed him," Winick maintains. "This year was what we were pointing for all along."

Unusual happenstance also resulted in Best Pal's appearances in both the 1990 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Belmont Park and the 1991 Kentucky Derby.

"When I started with him, there were no expectations at all," recalls Ian Jory, the original trainer of the modestly-bred gelding who has earned more than \$4 million.

"When he started running well at Del Mar, we felt let's see how he'll do in some of the big stakes leading up to the Breeders' Cup even though he wasn't eligible," says Jory, who to that point had worked mostly as an assistant to fellow Briton John Gosden. "Then he continued to do well, so the owners (John and Betty Mabee) put up the money."

Best Pal ran sixth in the Breeders' Cup, but was a close second to Strike the Gold in the Run for the Roses six months later.

If anyone has a slant on winning Breeders' Cup races and the Kentucky Derby, it's Charlie Whittingham, who won two Kentucky Derbies and two Breeders' Cup Classics during the 1980's.

Two horses, Ferdinand and Sunday Silence, accounted for all four victories, but neither ran in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

Whittingham, who will turn 80 on April 14, has in fact prepared only one runner, the gelding Bold Second in 1987, for a Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Three days before that race at Hollywood Park, Bold Second broke a leg and was retired.

"It's more important to me and to the people I train for, like Arthur Hancock, to have a horse win the Kentucky Derby than the Breeders' Cup (Juvenile)," says Whittingham. "For breeding value, nothing beats winning the Derby."

In Numerous and Strodes Creek, Whittingham has a pair of developing three-year-olds who could yet turn into legitimate Triple Crown threats. "I've taken it easy on them because I don't want to burn them out early," the venerable trainer goes on.

Winick, Brocco's trainer, admits he backed off his Kris S. colt after Valiant Nature upset him in the Hollywood Futurity, perhaps depriving him of an Eclipse Award. "I thought of running him earlier than this (the upcoming San Felipe), but then he had a little setback in training, so we felt it was best to follow the plan of running once before the Santa Anita Derby and then going to Louisville. It was the plan we had all along and we hope it works."

We'll know by late afternoon Sunday.
