AMERICAN TEAM WINS DUBAI JOCKEY

CHALLENGE The second Dubai International Jockeys' Challenge took place at Nad Al Sheba Friday, with victory in the four-race event going, as in 1993, to the American team which this year consisted of Chris McCarron and Mike Smith. McCarron took the individual title with two victories and two thirds; Greg Childs of Australia was second and Mick Kinane, representing Europe, finished third. The morning-line favorite Johnny Murtagh, a native of Ireland but riding for the Dubai team, was sixth. Last year, Americans Gary Stevens and Kent Desormeaux won the event.

There are also nominees from New Zealand, Dubai, France, Australia, Ireland, Hong Kong and Great Britain.

Thoro-Graph Analysis

The three-year-old division's second team faces off for a lot of money in this year's renewal of the Gotham. It is an interesting handicapping exercise, requiring the player to transpose form from various tracks and at different distances.

There are two graded winners in the field, and we don't like either. Neither **Popol's Gold** (Strike Gold) or **Prank Call** (Phone Trick) have ever run a figure good enough to take this and there is no real reason to think either will improve today.

There are three main contenders here, one of which is **Irgun** (Sunny's Halo), who is shipping in from California with only two career races, but the second was excellent and was at today's distance. The other two are local. **Mr. Shawklit** (Afleet) ran a big figure in his last start at two, rested, and came back with a decent effort. His best gives him a shot.

Bit of Puddin (Obligato) was purchased privately in December, and in his first start for his new owner he won a state-bred stakes. He then shipped to California, which resulted in a poor effort and a fever. Since recovering, he has trained well and his good races put him right there. We'll try an exacta box in the Gotham--Irgun, Mr. Shawklit and Bit of Puddin. *Thoro-Graph sheets, state-of-the-art performance figures, are used by many horsemen and professional handicappers to evaluate the ability of racehorses.
