PURSES UP, TOTAL HANDLE DOWN AT THE FAIR GROUNDS

The Dec. 19 fire which destroyed the Fair Grounds grandstand and caused the New Orleans track to close for 18 days, also accounted for a drop in the total handle for the 1993-94 meet, which ended yesterday. Racing 77 days as compared to 86 days for the previous year's meeting, the Fair Grounds handled \$116,155,078, down 5.8 percent from '92-'93. On-track handle was down 32.3 percent. On a positive note, the track did show a gain in total average daily handle, which was up 5.2 percent this year; average daily purse distribution was \$166,142, up 33.3 percent and an all-time record at the Fair Grounds.

LAUREL HANDLE POSTS MAJOR GAIN FOR '94

Despite severe weather which caused 13 racing cancellations, Laurel Race Course posted a 39 percent increase in total wagering for 1994; handle rose to \$104,998,111 for the 52-day meet which concluded Sunday. Average daily handle was up 24.4 percent. Over the entire winter meet (Oct. 5 through March 27), trainer King T. Leatherbury saddled the most winners, 86, and jockey Larry Reynolds led the riders with 135 victories. Trainer Richard Small led all trainers in stakes wins with five added-money races to his credit. Maryland racing moves to Pimlico today.

EMERGENCY MEETING OF THE ILLINOIS RACING BOARD

There will be an emergency meeting of the Illinois Racing Board Wednesday, March 30 at the State of Illinois Center in Chicago. The meeting was requested by staff for the adoption of emergency rules governing pre-race cocaine testing, and for modification of penalties in cases that are pending.

GII \$200,000a San Bernadino H., 4yo/up, 9f

Nine olders horses are expected to contest the mile-and-an-eighth San Bernadino. Heading the field is the 1994 GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Stuka** (Jade Hunter); the Gary Jones trainee is four-for-11 lifetime and is closing in on the \$1 million earnings mark with \$847,675 already in the bank. GII San Pasqual winner **Hill Pass** (Temperence Hill) looks for his second victory of the year; the five-year-old was also second in the GIII William P. Kyne H. at Bay Meadows and third in the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita in four starts this year. He will face Kentucky-bred **Misil** (Miswaki), Italy's Champion Miler in 1991 and the top-weighted older horse in that country at 7.5 to 9.5 furlongs in 1992. The six-year-old makes his first start in the U.S. In his most recent outing, he was seventh, beaten just 4 3/4-lengths, in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe last October; he is now under the supervision of Hall of Fame trainer Charlie Whittingham. Also pointing for the race are **Lottery Winner** (Apalachee), winless in three starts this year but a 3x stakes winner in 1993; **Dare To Duel** (Kris S.), second in the Rising Market S. at Santa Anita this year; **Furiously** (Danzig), third in the GIII Potrero Grande in his '94 bow and a GSW in '92 and '93; **Gavel Gate** (Gate Dancer), a winner of three of his 10 career starts looking for his first stakes win; MSW **Star Recruit** (Al Nasr {FR}), off the board in his two starts this year; and **Tinner's Way** (Secretariat), a European import who has two seconds, including his placing in the GIII Arcadia H. this year, in four U.S. tries.

LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Irgun (Sunny's Halo) burst into the Triple Crown picture with a powerful six-length score in Saturday's GII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. After breaking his maiden at first asking at Santa Anita, the Marianne Chase colorbearer came back to finish second to Santa Anita Derby prospect Strodes Creek, then shipped to New York to make his stakes debut and his third start; he will stay in town for the GI Wood Memorial at the Big A April 16. The second and third finishers in the Gotham, **Bit of Puddin'** (Obligato) and **Jesse F** (Conquistador Cielo), will also make start in the Wood.

THIS WEEK'S TRIPLE CROWN PREPS

GII \$600,000 Jim Beam S., 4/2, 9f, Turfway Park

Expected for the Jim Beam are three of the top four finisher's from Oaklawn's Southwest S.; the winner of the Battaglia Memorial S., and two of the top three from San Rafael at Santa Anita.

The Arkansas shippers are Southwest winner **Southern Rhythm** (Dixieland Band); the show horse, **Polar Expedition** (Kodiack), who had his winning streak stopped at six in his last start but was giving away 10 pounds to the winner; and the D. Wayne Lukas trainee **Chimes Band** (Dixieland Band), fourth in the Southwest. Southern Rhythm was beaten just a head in his only start at two; he returned in Feb. to break his maiden, then took an Oaklawn allowance by eight before his 2 1/2-length triumph in the Southwest.

Powis Castle (Rare Brick), was just a length behind Tabasco Cat in the San Rafael, his three-year-old debut; the Kentucky-bred has never been worse than second in five career starts. **Shepherd's Field** (Spectacular Bid), winner of the GII Norfolk at two, was another 18 lengths back in the San Rafael, his first start since he was sixth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

The winner of the Battaglia Memorial, **Mahogany Hall** (Woodman), has a record of three wins from four starts; the Battaglia was his stakes debut.

\$125,000 Rebel S., 4/2, 8.5f, Oaklawn Park

Dogwood Stable's **Dish It Out** (Naevus), second in the Southwest S. at Oaklawn, and **Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer), second in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last year, head the field for this Arkansas Derby prep. Dish It Out set the pace in the Southwest before giving way to winner Southern Rhythm; he stretches out another sixteenth for the Rebel. Blumin Affair made his three-year-old debut in a Santa Anita allowance March 20, finishing fourth. Two other California-based colts will ship for the race. **Argolid** (Saros {GB}), third in the Louisiana Derby last time out, has been on the board in all five lifetime starts. "The horse is still in Louisiana," said trainer Bob Baffert.

"He was a little leg weary after the Louisiana Derby, but he's a lot sharper now than he was before the race. If all goes well, we'll run in the Arkansas Derby (Apr. 23) after that." Coming in from California for this race is **Pollock's Luck** (Polish Navy), who showed speed in the San Rafael before tiring to be fifth.

GIII \$200,000 Flamingo S., 4/3, 9f, Hialeah

Probable starters for the Flamingo include **Signal Tap** (Fappiano), a Gulfstream allowance winner March 12. The Scotty Schulhofer-trained colt has been on the board in all six career starts. Also getting ready for the Flamingo is **Amathos** (Cox's Ridge), a rallying fifth last time out in the GI Florida Derby; **Senor Conquistador** (Conquistador Cielo), second in the GIII Swale S. on the Florida Derby undercard; the Due Process entry of **Warm Wayne** (Affirmed), fourth in the GII Fountain of Youth, and **Youthful Legs** (Explodent), winner of the Citation S.; and 18 1/2-length Lord Avie S. victor **Bay Street Star** (Silver Buck).

NEW WAGERING SYSTEM AT ARLINGTON

Arlington VP and General Manager Robert Bork announced that beginning today, AmTote International's Spectrum System will be on-line at Arlington International Racecourse's Trackside and Arlington in Waukegan, Ill. Said Mutuels Director Gil Carmichael, "The primary advantage is that it will be easier for us to handle common pool wagering from out-of-state." Carmichael also cited several benefits for mutuel clerks, which include built-in calculators, a "help menu", and up-to-the-minute information regarding open pools, minutes to post, live runners and race results. The new system will be active for simulcast wagering for one month before live racing comes to Arlington May 8.
