TRAINING ACCIDENT AT SANTA ANITA **Bold Current** (Little Current), a seven-year-old gelding trained by Craig Lewis, was killed, and Korrin Wardlaw, the exercise rider aboard Bold Current, was hurt in a training accident on Santa Anita's main track 7:30 a.m. Wed. Also injured was **Maisonsaire** (Maison), a four-year-old trained by Richard Mandella and partially owned by Wilt Chamberlain, while narrowly escaping the accident were **Moulin du Cadet** (It's Freezing) and jockey Kent Desormeaux. Bold Current and Moulin du Cadet were working in company when Maisonsaire, who had been jogging on the outside part of the track under Per Anders Graberg, became spooked and suddenly moved backwards toward the rail. Moulin du Cadet was on the inside and was able to avoid Maisonsaire. But Bold Current and Wardlaw weren't as fortunate, and plowed into the hind quarters of Maisonsaire. Bold Current suffered a broken neck and died on the spot. Wardlaw landed on his left side and was taken to Arcadia Methodist Hospital complaining of lower back pain and numbness in his left leg. Maisonsaire suffered a badly bruised or fractured hip, and Graberg walked away unhurt.

CANAVERAL TO FLAMINGO Hialeah Racing Secretary Sam Abbey reported that Morven Stud's undefeated **Canaveral** (Relaunch) will be a definite starter in Sun.'s GIII Flamingo S. Trainer Frank Brothers said that if the chestnut colt were to be 'impressive' in the Flamingo, his next start would be the May 7 Kentucky Derby. "We would train up to the Derby," said Brothers. "I might get criticized for that, but I can live with it." The trainer had considered taking Canaveral to the Blue Grass, but said he felt the Flamingo was a more logical step. "The Flamingo would be the more conservative way to go," said Brothers, who sent out the 1991 Derby favorite, **Hansel** (Woodman), who finished 10th, but went on to win the Preakness and Belmont. "I've had more luck being conservative instead of being bold." Should he go on to Kentucky, Canaveral would be attempting to become the first Derby winner with four or fewer starts under his belt since **Regret** won the Derby off three starts in 1915.

Penny's Reshoot (Turkey Shoot), a half-sister to **Daimon** (MSW, \$222,912, by Strike Gold), has never finished out of the money in four career starts. "We bought her in Kentucky in the fall of 1992 for \$15,000 (at the Keeneland Sept. yearling sale)," said trainer John DeStefano. The filly has rewarded them by winning \$59,703 to date, including a second-place finish in her most recent start, the Feb. 27 Ruthless S, to Comely entrant **Dixie Luck** (Dixieland Band). "She was sick for that race," said DeStefano. "We scoped her after the race and found out she had an infection in her lungs; it just never surfaced." Penny's Reshoot worked five furlongs in 1:01 over the Belmont training track last Thurs. in preparation for her return.

CHURCHILL DOWNS APPLIES FOR INDIANA OTB SITES Churchill Downs Management Company yesterday submitted applications to the Indiana Horse Racing Commission for the right to operate four off-track betting facilities in Ft. Wayne, Indianapolis, Merrillville and Jeffersonville. The announcement was made by CDMC President Jeffrey M. Smith. "Our proposal calls for the construction of premiere facilities that not only satisfy the Commission's requirements, but that will bring first class entertainment opportunities to Indiana," said Smith. Three of the proposed facilities- in Ft. Wayne, Indianapolis and Jeffersonville- will include construction of new buildings on property purchased by the CDMC. An existing structure in Merrillville is to be renovated for OTB use. Total combined cost for all facilities is estimated at \$12 million, and are to open May 1995.

LAKEWAY A LATE TRIPLE CROWN

NOMINEE California trainer Gary Jones has made undefeated **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) a late nomination to the Triple Crown. Lakeway, bred and owned by Mike Rutherford, has won two Grade I stakes, the Las Virgenes and Santa Anita Oaks, in four lifetime starts. Jones also nominated **Marconi** (Sadler's Wells), who broke his maiden March 5 at Santa Anita in his first start in this country after one start as a two-year-old in Ireland. Late nominations to the Triple Crown close midnight Sat., April 2.

ILLINOIS COCAINE STUDY RESULTS Scientific studies conducted by the Illinois Racing Board indicate that cocaine may produce stimulatory effects in racehorses at doses small enough to evade detection in post-race urine samples. The Illinois Racing Board security staff began collecting tongue-ties from harness horses following races at Hawthorne Jan. 20. A blood and urine sample was also collected from each horse. From 28 tongue-ties collected Jan. 20 through Jan. 22, six tested positive for cocaine. The IRB then resumed collection of tongue-ties at Hawthorne on a random basis. They also collected tongue-ties from thoroughbreds at Sportsman's Park and from standardbreds at Fairmount Park. By the end of March, 222 tongue-ties had been tested and 33 cocaine positives, involving 26 different harness and thoroughbred trainers, had been confirmed as positive. In all but one case, urine and blood samples have tested negative. The IRB imposed penalties against the trainers involved.

KEENELAND SIMULCASTS TO HIALEAH

Hialeah simulcast coordinator Richard Sacco reported that the South Florida track will be receiving a feature race each day from Keeneland during the Lexington, Ky. track's meet April 8 through April 29. The race-a-day schedule from Aqueduct will continue through April 7. Keeneland will be dark on Tuesdays during its three week meet and on those days, Hialeah will pick up a feature from Pimlico.
