CHBPA COMPLETES BYLAW CHANGES The board of directors for the California Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association announced yesterday that it has accepted an advisory from its membership and that all but one of the 18-member board has agreed to resign upon the election of a new board; the election will be held on or before June 24. In addition, Brian Sweeney, who has served as Interim Chief Operating Officer since Jan., 1993, has advised the board that he plans to step down at the end of this board's term. The latest modification to the CHBPA completes the bylaw changes recommended by the California Horse Racing Board, which also advised that the makeup of the 18-member board be 12 owners and six trainers; that an owner-director be defined as someone who owns at least 25 percent of a horse and that his horse(s) make six starts per year; and that assistant trainers will no longer be eligible to become voting members of the organization. "Through the adoption of these proposals, hopefully we are putting an end to organizational distractions which have plagued us," said CHBPA President Chris Clark. "We feel we can now focus on more important issues such as getting more fans involved in racing and improving the economics of the people who put on the show--the owners."

SOUL OF THE MATTER BREEZES AT SANTA ANITA Burt Bacharach's *Soul Of The Matter* (Private Terms), winner of the San Felipe S., worked a half-mile on the turf Thursday in :50 3/5 around the dogs with Kent Desormeaux up. Trainer Richard Mandella said the colt would have one more work before his next engagement in the April 9 Santa Anita Derby. Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner *Brocco* (Kris S.), second as the favorite in the San Felipe, is set to work seven furlongs this morning.

LAKEWAY BRUISES FOOT, STILL POINTING FOR KENTUCKY OAKS

The undefeated three-year-old filly **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) is still on schedule to make the May 6 Kentucky Oaks despite having a pus pocket removed from her right front hoof Wednesday. "Her next scheduled work is the 5th (of April), so the prognosis of her making the race is very good," said trainer Gary Jones. "I wouldn't have put up \$6,000 (nomination fee) otherwise."

FLORIDA WINTER DATES BILL ON THE

TABLE A Florida House bill calling for alternating winter dates between Hialeah and Gulfstream Park made it over another hurdle Thursday. The bill, which calls for Hialeah to run the Jan. through March dates one year and Gulfstream the next, made it through the House Finance and Taxation Committee, the second of three required committees, by a vote of 18-3. The bill will move on to the House Appropriations Committee Tuesday, Apr. 5. If passed there, it would then be sent to the Senate for approval. The Florida legislative session is scheduled to end April 8; it is unlikely the legislators will extend the session.

SAM HOUSTON STABLE AREA OPENS

FRIDAY The grand opening of Sam Houston Race Park, the first Class 1 racing facility in Texas, is set for April 29; the Sam Houston stable area will open Friday. "This is one of the days we have all waited for," said General Manager Jim Murphy. "Every day the facility has been looking more and more like a racetrack, but Friday, when the horses start to arrive, it becomes a reality. Monday morning (Apr. 4), horses will actually be working out on the main surface for the first time."

Trainer Pete Vestal has a three-horse entry for the Rebel. "You never know how a stakes in the spring for three-year-olds will develop," said Vestal. "**Dish It Out** (Naevus) has a world of speed. In fact, you can't rate him. He won't relax. If there isn't much other speed, he stands a real good chance. If there is a sharp early pace, **Jaggery John** (Blushing John) likes to come from the middle of the pack. **Squire Jones** (Seeking the Gold) always lags with the trailers early and makes the one big run late. Anyway the race unfolds, I should have a colt for the situation." Two colts expected from Californian connections were not entered in the race; trainer Richard Cross was not happy with **Pollock's Luck's** (Polish Navy) final breeze, six furlongs in 1:17 Sunday, and did not ship. **Argolid** (Saros {GB}) did ship into Oaklawn, but will wait for the Arkansas Derby.
