OJC ANNOUNCES EXECUTIVE

APPOINTMENTS Pat Keenan, president and CEO, has announced several changes in the executive offices of the Ontario Jockey Club. John Whitson, formerly general manager, was named vice president of Thoroughbred Racing Operations; Gerard Spoor, who also held the title general manager, was appointed vice president of Racing Operations in the harness division. Jim Plauntz was named vice president of Customer Services. Keenan also announced that David Gorman has had his title changed from vice president of Simulcasting and Teletheaters to vice president of Corporate Development. The administrative changes were made as a result of the resignation of Rick Cowan, executive vice president and chief operating officer; Cowan, who leaves office Sunday, April 3, has taken a position with Autotote Systems.

BROCCO IN SANTA ANITA DERBY BREEZE

Trainer Randy Winick pronounced **Brocco** (Kris S.) "100 percent ready" for the Apr. 9 Santa Anita Derby after a seven-furlong workout at the Arcadia, California oval yesterday morning. With regular rider Gary Stevens up, the colt went in 1:27, handily. "He galloped out a mile in 1:41 and he went the last quarter in :24 flat," said Winick. "It was just what I wanted. He'll have a half-mile blowout, probably Wednesday." Also on Santa Anita's Friday work tab were Charlie Whittingham's Santa Anita Derby duo of **Strodes Creek** (Halo) and **Numerous** (Mr. Prospector), who worked seven furlongs in company in 1:25 3/5, handily, with Strodes Creek just in front from the inside at the wire. Trainer Richard Cross had **Pollock's Luck** (Polish Navy) out for a mile work yesterday, and announced that the colt would be entered for the Santa Anita Derby after he was clocked in 1:37 3/5. "He worked very well, and we think he deserves another chance," said Cross.

Sent off as the 2-1 favorite, Dixie Luck, a half-sister to Ole Atocha (Mari's Book), GSP wnr. of \$239,580 and Lucky Delight (Miswaki), SW of \$109,970, sat behind the pacesetters, then unleashed her drive under jockey Filiberto Leon to get up in the final yards for the victory. "Any time you can win, it's nice," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "I had a lot of concern about the distance. Filiberto gave her a real patient ride. He and Jimmy (his son and assistant) did a great job with her over the winter." The three-year-old filly paid \$6.40; she will make her next start in the Acorn S.

STAR OF COZZENE BACK ON TRACK

Tomaeato Farm's **Star of Cozzene** (Cozzene) is back in training at Hollywood Park under the scrutiny of trainer Mark Hennig. "He's just galloping right now, and he's actually doing really well," said Hennig. "We've been letting him come along at his own pace, which isn't very quick. It takes a long time to recover from that trip to Japan and we want to give him all the time he needs." The six-year-old made his last start in the Japan Cup, finishing fifth. "Our long-range plans obviously are to go back to the Japan Cup," Hennig added. "He has Japanese owners and that's the race we're aiming at. Other than that, we haven't targeted any races. But it would be nice to try and win the Arlington Million again, and he could even run at Hollywood Park before then."

Jim Beam: Thoro-Graph Analysis

Over the past few years the Jim Beam has become a truly important Derby prep, and although this year's field does not feature big names it definitely does feature contenders for the big dance.

The morning-line favorite, **Southern Rhythm** (Dixieland Band), comes off two impressive performances, the latest in his first try at two turns. But three-year-olds tend to put together two good ones in the spring, then bounce the next time. Additionally, Southern Rhythm got a huge pull in the weights last time, an advantage he will not have this time.

There are three live bodies in the Beam. **Polar Expedition** (Kodiack) not only has good figures, but as the lone speed from the rail he should enjoy an uncontested, ground-saving trip. **Powis Castle** (Rare Brick) and **Road Rush** (Broad Brush) are very similar--they both ran four times as juveniles, returned with strong efforts in their three-year-old debuts and have had ample time to recover and prepare for this.

A winner of four of his 11 lifetime starts, the four-year-old last hit the wire first in a Santa Anita allowance in November. Second choice on the morning line is **Tinners Way** (Secretariat), another four-year-old who is looking for his first NA win; he was a 2x stakes winner in England.
