**TRAINER:** Warren (Jimmy) Croll, Bobby Frankel, Willard Proctor, Virgil W. (Buddy) Raines, Mel Stute.

**MODERN ERA MALE:** Needles, Arts and Letters, Exceller, Manila, Swoon's Son.

**MODERN ERA FEMALE:** Ta Wee, La Prevoyante, Mom's Command, Bold 'n Determined, Bowl of Flowers.

**PRE-WORLD WAR II ERA:** Borrow, Eight Thirty, Granville, Mad Hatter, Ballot.

The Hall of Fame Induction Ceremonies will take place on the grounds of the Museum Aug. 8, 1994.

### FIRST TIMED WORKOUTS RECORDED AT SAM HOUSTON

The first two horses to gallop over the main racing surface at Sam Houston Race Park Mon. were **Marastani** (Shahrastani) and **Mysterious Moon** (Far North) from the Tom Amoss racing stable. Those same two runners were the first Thoroughbreds to record timed workouts over the main surface Tues. morning. Marastani completed his six furlong workout, which began at 8:20 a.m., in 1:14 flat, with Mysterious Moon finishing 1/2-length behind him. Richard Guidry, the exercise rider aboard Marastani, was complimentary regarding the racing surface. "Marastani got a good hold of the track from the start and seemed to glide over the surface," he said. "The thing I noticed most about the track is that you can't even hear the horse's feet hitting the ground."

### Saturday, Santa Anita

**SANTA ANITA DERBY-GI, \$500,000, 3yo, 9f**  
Overbrook Farm and David P. Reynolds' **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) worked six furlongs at Santa Anita in a bullet 1:12 flat Tues. morning in his final preparation for the race. "The work was fine, he did okay," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "All he'll do now is gallop the rest of the week." Tabasco Cat, winner of five of eight lifetime starts for earnings of \$383,037, is undefeated in two outings this year in the Gill El Camino Real Derby and Gil San Rafael S. "He's had a pretty good schedule all the way along this year," said Lukas. "I like the way everything has gone so far." **Fly'n J. Bryan** (Ogygian) shipped to Santa Anita after working five furlongs in :58 3/5 Mon. at Hollywood Park. Trainer Doug Peterson continues to sing the praises of the colt, who has yet to win a race over seven furlongs. "One way or another, this colt is going to Kentucky," said Peterson. "If not for the Derby, then for the Breeders' Cup Sprint next fall." Fly'n J. Bryan was a \$40,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase and a \$110,000 Fasig-Tipton Florida Feb. two-year-old. **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), who defeated Santa Anita Derby entrants **Brocco** (Kris S.) and **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty) in the Gil San Felipe S. last out, jogged yesterday and will breeze at 8:30 a.m. Wed., trainer Richard Mandella said. Mandella indicated the work will probably be on dirt, which would be the West Virginia-bred's first workout on dirt since Feb. 23. The colt's last four works have all been on turf.

According to trainer Scotty Schulhofer, Twining will skip the Kentucky Derby and be pointed for the Withers S. in May at Belmont. His record moves to 3-3-0-0, \$48,000.

The full to Miner's Mark (GI, \$948,250) trailed by better than 33 lengths in his first start of the year at Gulfstream March 12. **STONER CREEK** (Cryptoclearance) and **ALYDAWN** (Alydar), coupled in the betting at odds-on, finished 3rd and 8th respectively. Our Emblem's new record is 5-2-0-0, \$34,090.

## LITTLE BROTHER

On a leisurely morning last week at Palm Beach Downs, a gorgeous son of Deputy Minister and Sister Dot paraded around Reynaldo Nobles' shedrow, eager to stretch his legs on the neighboring training track.

But it wasn't Dehere, who is recovering from surgery to repair a fractured hind leg bone. The Eclipse champion two-year-old of 1993 walks only five minutes a day, and spends the rest of his mornings devouring his hay rack. Dehere is too busy eating to pay any attention when his full brother struts past his stall door.

Defrere, French for "the brother," is a two-year-old who has negotiated his first month of training in marvelous style. Defrere is larger than Dehere and is already well-muscled, with both size and definition in his chest, shoulders and hind end.

He is obviously athletic, and bounces around the shedrow and training track with the cockiness of a horse who knows he's good. He also has a heart-shaped shock of white hair on his forehead, adding flair to his star-quality presence.

When Defrere and three of his classmates went through their 1 1/2-mile gallop, Defrere bounced playfully at the rear of the pack, bucking and kicking and generally enjoying himself. While the others, led by a good-looking chestnut son of Halo, galloped with good work ethics, Defrere kept pace while maintaining the attitude of a little boy set loose in a sand box.

He can walk the walk, but can he talk the talk?

In the third official workout of his career, Defrere, like Dehere a homebred product of Robert Brennan's Due Process Stables, breezed a quarter-mile over Palm Beach Downs' deep training track in :24. To put that in perspective, the best three-year-old work at Calder that day was :36, equal to Defrere's galloping-out time on the slow training track at Palm Beach Downs.

Defrere will be the last Deputy Minister--Sister Dot for a while. Sister Dot has a Storm Bird filly at her side, and is in foal to Seattle Slew. When she drops that foal she will be bred to Danzig.

Dehere will get his first set of post-surgery X-rays today. If they show good recovery, Nobles and Due Process Stable will continue their efforts to get Dehere racing again by next year. Any serious setback along the way will likely mean the end of Dehere's racing career, and the beginning of his breeding career as a stallion at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky.

Thankfully, Defrere has come along just in time, fueling the greatest commodity in horse racing. Hope.
