BROCCO WORKS AT CHURCHILL; PASSES VET

Brocco breezed five furlongs in the required 1:03 before Churchill Downs veterinarian Mitzi Fisher yesterday in Louisville. "I watched him pull up and I saw nothing wrong," said Fisher. "It was an awesome work on this track." A blood sample was taken and will be passed on to the California state veterinarians. Brocco was a bit tentative early in the work as he got a feel for the track, said trainer Randy Winick, but finished strong, going the final quarter in :23 2/5. Brocco is scheduled to work a mile Monday under Gary Stevens.

BONILLA TRIES A NEW SPORT

New York Mets third baseman Bobby Bonilla became a racehorse owner when he purchased three horses in partnership with Stewart Weissman at the March 8 and 9 Barretts two-year-olds sale. Bonilla, one of baseball's highest paid players, bought: **Fire Over The Draw** (Pirate's Bounty) for \$35,000; **Sovereign Draw** (Sovereign Dancer), \$25,000; and **Candi's Ruler** (Candi's Gold), \$34,000. The three will trained by 41-year-old Melody Conlon, who took out her trainer's license last month. Conlon met Bonilla through a friend who cares for Bonilla's riding horse at a ranch in Hidden Hills, California. The horse, a retired racehorse named Liberty Of Fiftysix, was previously owned by Conlon. "I've imagined looking up at the diamond vision between innings and seeing my horses run," said Bonilla, who was licensed at Hollywood yesterday.

A field of six is expected in the Ashland, including **Inside Information** (Private Account), Smith; **Private Status** (Alydar), Day; **Cinnamon Sugar** (IRE) (Wild Again), Sellers; **Her Temper** (Temperence Hill), no rider; **Lady Reiko** (IRE) (Sadler's Wells), Barnett; and **Bunting** (Private Account), no rider. Private Status worked a half mile in :49 yesterday morning at Keeneland; Bunting went the same distance in :48 2/5. Neil Howard trainee Private Status has won her last three starts, including the Bourbonette S. at Turfway April 2. Shug McGaughey trainee Inside Information, a half-sister to GI winner **Educated Risk** (Mr. Prospector), worked a bullet five furlongs in 1:01 handily at Keeneland Mon. Inside Information has won four of five lifetime starts, including the GII Bonnie Miss S. at Gulfstream in her last outing, for earnings of \$171,000 to date.

KEENELAND AVERAGE UP Cataclysmic, a son of Storm Cat--Miss Airon, by Damascus, topped the final session of the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds-In Training Sale Wednesday night. During the final session, 49 horses sold for \$4,199,000, an average of \$85,694. The average was up 15% over last year. Overall, 158 horses sold for \$11,571,500. The average, \$73,237, was up 14% over the inaugural sale last year.

GUINEAS FIELDS TAKE SHAPE A total of 29 colts were left in Britain's 2000 Guineas at Tuesday's final forfeit stage, while 23 fillies remained ready to contest the 1000 Guineas. The one-mile Classics will be run April 28 (1000 Guineas) and April 30 (2000) at Newmarket. The fillies are headed by American-breds **Mehthaaf** (Nureyev), **Coup de Genie** (Mr. Prospector) and the Irish-bred **Lemon Souffle** (Salse). Topping the list of colts are **Turtle Island (IRE)** (Fairy King), **King's Theatre (IRE)** (Sadler's Wells), **Suplizi (IRE)** (Alzao) and the American-bred **Colonel Collins** (El Gran Senor). Cash Asmussen has been drafted as a late replacement for British jockey George Duffield aboard the colt **Unblest** (Alzao). The next entry stage is five days before the race.

DOMINION NOMINEES SOUGHT Nominees for the second annual Dogwood Dominion Award, to be presented to a "behind-the-scenes, dedicated, working-type" in the thoroughbred industry are being sought by Dogwood Stables. The inaugural award was presented to Horace (Salty) Roberts in 1993, a founder of the Racetrack Chaplaincy and currently a parking-lot attendant at Monmouth and Hialeah. This year's award, \$5,000 and a bronze sculpture, will be presented July 18 on ESPN's Racehorse Digest. Nominations may be faxed to Lila C. Campbell at Dogwood--803-642-2747.
