PRE-RACE DERBY EXAMS EXPANDED Horses scheduled to run in the '94 Kentucky Derby will be part of a comprehensive veterinary program, including regular examinations the week prior to the Derby, a compilation of each horse's recent medical background and a consultation with each horse's trainer and private vet. The program will be overseen by the Kentucky Racing Commission's veterinarians Dr. George Mundy and Dr. Mitzi Fischer. "This program addresses the special needs of horses who come from all over the country to run in a very special race- the Kentucky Derby," said KRC Executive Director Bernie Hettel, who added that the welfare of both horses and jockeys was behind the expansion of normal pre-race procedures.

BACK TO THE RACES FOR BERTRANDO

1993 Champion Handicap Male **Bertrando** (Skywalker) has 35 mares in foal at River Edge Farm in California where he stands for a \$20,000 fee, according to Eddie Nahem, who co-owns the horse along with Marshall Naify. "He'll be back right here at Barn 61 on May 15," said Nahem Wed. morning at Hollywood Park. "He was booked to 70 mares but we pared it in half. He's been galloping for six months and he's up to a mile and a half. A couple days a week he goes two miles." Bertrando is expected to be back racing before the Hollywood season ends Mon., July 25.

CHAMPION MARES ON COMEBACK TRAIL

Two-time Eclipse Award-winning mare **Paseana (ARG)** (Ahmad) has resumed training after missing five weeks with a foot injury. Trainer Ron McAnally said he hasn't yet targeted a comeback race for the seven-year-old. Trainer Neil Drysdale said 1993 Eclipse Award-winning three-year-old filly **Hollywood Wildcat** (Kris S.) is scheduled to return to action in the Gil Hawthorne H. May 29. Hollywood Wildcat had been bothered by a cough and hasn't raced since finishing third in the La Canada S. at Santa Anita Feb. 5. "She's back in training and she's doing really well," said Drysdale. "We're aiming for the Hawthorne."

HIALEAH TURF CUP-GIII, \$200,000, 3&up, 12f(T)
The Hialeah Turf Cup, cancelled last Sun. because of heavy thunderstorms that washed out the last three races on the program, will be run this Sat., April 30, and will be redrawn today with all 29 original nominees eligible. "With **Strolling Along's** (Danzig) departure, we felt a new draw might add a little zip to the race," said John Van Lindt, Executive VP of Hialeah. A field of six, led by highweights **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}), **Awad** (Caveat) and **Strolling Along** were set to go postward last Sun. before the cancellation. Highweight **Fraise** (124 pounds) and **Awad** (116) are expected to stay on at Hialeah this week and run Sat. **Strolling Along** left the track Tues. by van for Belmont Park.

Sunday, Hollywood Park

JOHN HENRY H.-GII, \$150,000a, 3&up, 9f(T)
Eddie Delahoussaye has been engaged to ride Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Arcangues** (Sagace {FR}), who has been assigned top weight of 122, in the John Henry. "Arcangues is right on target for the race," said Chris Baker, assistant to trainer Richard Mandella. "His works have been very encouraging." The six-year-old, who has not started since the Nov. 6 Breeders' Cup, worked five furlongs on Hollywood's fast main track yesterday in 1:00 1/5 handily. Confirmed starters as of Wed.: **Arcangues**, 122; **Misil** (Miswaki), 119; **Earl of Barking** (IRE) (Common Grounds {GB}), 118; **Mashaallah** (Nijinsky II), 118; **Kingdom Found** (The Bart), 115; **Tinners Way** (Secretariat), 114. Kentucky-bred **Mashaallah**, a GI winner in Italy, Ireland and Germany, will be making his U.S. debut in the John Henry.

NBC TO TELEVISION BC PREVIEW THROUGH

'99 A six-year agreement for NBC to televise the New York Racing Association's Breeders' Cup Preview Day was announced today by NYRA, NBC and Breeders' Cup Ltd. Held three weeks prior to the Breeders' Cup, the preview is the second richest day in American racing, with purses totalling more than \$2.5 million. NBC, which televises the Breeders' Cup, has also broadcast the first two runnings of the preview from Belmont Park. The event will be held Oct. 8 this year.

OBS SECOND SESSION RESULTS The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company held the second session of its four-day Spring Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale Tues. There were 155 horses sold for a gross of \$1,746,400 and an average of \$11,267, down 7.4 percent from the 1993 second session average of \$12,169. Tuesday's highest-priced two-year-old was a bay filly by Medieval Man--Sovrana (Sovereign Dancer). The filly, who was bred in Florida, was consigned by Jessie and Stacy Longoria and purchased by Raymond Wennik for \$43,000.

LEADING BROODMARE DEAD **K D Princess** (Bold Commander), dam of Horse of the Year, Champion Three-Year-Old Colt and Belmont S. winner **Conquistador Cielo** (Mr. Prospector), died of an apparent heart attack yesterday at Walmac Farm. The 23-year-old mare had produced a **High Brite** (Best Turn) colt April 24. Her 11 foals also included stakes-placed runners **Mr. Prosperous** (Mr. Prospector) and **Opposite Abstract** (Alydar). **K D Princess** was herself stakes-placed as a runner, finishing third in the GIII Orchid H. and three other stakes for earnings of \$68,293.

STARS CLASH IN PRIX GANAY Sunday's Prix Ganay at Longchamp promises to be Europe's first major international clash of 1994. The GI event, run at 10 1/2 furlongs, brings together '93 Arc de Triomphe winner **Urban Sea** (Miswaki), Oaks winner **Intrepidity** (Sadler's Wells) and St. Leger winner **Bob's Return** (IRE) (Bob Back). The '93 Prix du Jockey-Club winner **Hernando** (Nininski) was also expected in the Ganay, but will miss the race after a training setback.

REMINGTON ANNOUNCES PURSE CUTS Pursues for the final seven days of Remington Park's 1994 Spring meeting, which ends Sun., May 8, have been cut five percent across the board. The purse cut goes into effect Sat., April 30. "We've been forced to cut purses because we've used monies from our advertising budget to fight the lottery," said Remington Park Executive VP and CEO David Vance. "That has caused us to lose ground on-track, but it is an absolute necessity if we want to protect the future of our industry in this state."

FLYIN' J. BRYAN TO DRYSDALE BARN Joseph B. Fenley's San Vicente BC S. winner **Flyin' J. Bryan** (Ogygian) was among four horses transferred from trainer Doug Peterson's barn to Neil Drysdale's, Peterson confirmed Wed. at Hollywood Park. "This kind of thing happens in racing, and of course I'm sorry to lose the horses," said Peterson. "But I think it's more important to keep the owners in the game, even if it's with another trainer." In addition to **Flyin' J. Bryan**, the horses moved to Drysdale's barn include **Bryan's Ruler** (Alleged), a two-year-old **Storm Cat** colt and a two-year-old **Gulch** filly. Drysdale said he had no race in mind for **Flyin' J. Bryan**, whose most recent start resulted in a last-place finish in the April 9 Santa Anita Derby. "I imagine it would be quite a while before we see where he's going," said Drysdale.

C.T.H.S. SALES RESULTS The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, British Columbia Division, held its Spring Horses of Racing Age Sale April 25 at Hastings Park. A total of 46 horses were sold for a gross of \$385,600 and an average of \$8,382.61, down 5 percent from the 1993 average of \$8,831.25. The highest price of the sale, \$30,000, was shared by two colts. **Free Wheeler**, an unraced two-year-old by Lord Chilly--Pull Together (Impressive), was purchased by Coyote Creek Farm. An unnamed bay colt by Northern Baby--Room for the Sauce (Sauce Boat) was bought by Darlene Tupouzis.

GARDEN STATE PARK BUDWEISER BC SPRINT CHAMPIONSHIP-GIII, \$150,000, 3&up, f&m, 6f Trainer Allen Jerkens' **Classy Mirage** (Storm Bird), Phil England's **Apelia** (Cool Victor) and Californian Bob Baffert's **Arches of Gold** (Strike Gold) will head a small but highly talented field of six. **Classy Mirage** is on a roll, having won the GII Distaff H. and GII Bed o' Roses H. at Aqueduct in her last two starts. "If she can win Fri. night, I certainly think she would have to be considered among the top fillies in the country," said Jerkens. "I don't expect it to be easy because there are some pretty good fillies in the field. But you have to compete to win." **Classy Mirage**, who has been assigned 119 pounds, will ship down from NY the morning of the race and will be ridden by Robbie Davis. **Apelia**, Canada's champion sprinter in '93, will be making her first start since finishing 14th in the Breeders' Cup Sprint last Nov. Regular rider Larry Attard will come in from Canada for the mount. GIII winner **Arches of Gold** has run only twice this year, in GI and GIII stakes, finishing second each time. She and **Apelia** will share highweight of 120 pounds. Other entrants are **Gooni Goo Hoo** (Gone West), 110, **Code Blum** (Lost Code), 113 and **Sister Dell** (Castle Guard), 109.

Powis Castle (Rare Brick): The Vistas Stables runner worked a mile over a rain-drenched Churchill Downs strip in 1:41 1/5 yesterday morning. Fractions for the work, accomplished after more than two hours of steady rain, were :26 2/5, :52, 1:16 4/5 and out the 1 1/8-mile in 1:58. "We had to work today because the forecast called for more rain and it would be a quagmire tomorrow," said trainer Rodney Rash. "With the heavy track today, I didn't want to take the bottom out of him by going a mile and an eighth. It was a good work over the track, but he has worked well when the track is cuppy, when it's wet, dry, whatever. However it comes up Derby Day won't worry me." Rash said the colt will have a blowout sometime next week.

Smilin Singin Sam (Smile): Dogwood Stable's Remington Park Derby winner had a six-furlong work postponed because of weather and galloped two miles instead with trainer Niall O'Callaghan up. "I thought the track was a little bit sloppy and we are not in any hurry," said O'Callaghan. "We are caught up. We've got a few days in hand now and he'll probably work tomorrow and if not he can go Friday. He's dead fit and in good shape. I'm not worried."

Blumin Affair (Dynaformer): The Arkansas Derby runner-up returned to the track for the first time since Sat., jogging two miles at Churchill Downs. Trainer Jack Van Berg is not scheduled to arrive in Louisville from California until Fri. or Sat.

Brocco (Kris S.) and **Go For Gin** (Cormorant): Mr. and Mrs. Albert Broccoli's Brocco galloped 1 3/4-miles over the sloppy Churchill Downs track Wed. morning. Wood Memorial runner-up Go For Gin galloped 1 3/8-miles over the same surface.

Meadow Flight (Meadowlake): Wed. morning's deluge in Louisville forced trainer Jim Ryerson to postpone a six-furlong work for the Flamingo winner. Instead, Meadow Flight galloped 1 5/8-miles. "We will just take it day to day with the weather," said Ryerson. "He worked a real good mile a week ago (1:40 2/5 April 20), so we can deal with that. We can wait until Fri. if we have to." Ryerson said Shane Sellers will ride the colt in the Derby.

Southern Rhythm (Dixieland Band): The Lexington S. winner galloped 1 1/4-miles Wed. morning at Churchill.

Holy Bull (Great Above): The early favorite for the Derby galloped 1 1/2-miles Wed. morning at

Keeneland. Plans call for the Blue Grass S. winner to continue galloping the rest of the time he remains at the Lexington track. Owner/trainer Jimmy Croll said the colt will be shipped to Churchill Downs Sat. after training that morning at Keeneland. A Mon. workout is scheduled for Holy Bull at the Downs. "He certainly is doing well right now," said Croll. "He's coming into the race the way I want him to. All we've got to do now is keep our fingers crossed the next 10 days."

Valiant Nature (His Majesty): The Hollywood Futurity winner and Blue Grass runner-up is scheduled to work this weekend at Churchill Downs, according to trainer Ron McAnally, who will arrive in Kentucky Thurs. "It's going to depend on the track condition," said McAnally from his Hollywood Park barn yesterday. "He's scheduled to work Sat., but we might change it to Sun. if the track is bad. But the horse is fine. Everything's going good."

Ulises (Temperence Hill): The third-place finisher in the Lexington was scheduled to be shipped from Keeneland to Churchill Downs Wed.
