### CAUTHEN, CROLL TOP HALL OF FAME

**INDUCTEES** Warren A. "Jimmy" Croll, the owner and trainer of this year's Derby favorite, Holy Bull, and Steve Cauthen, who swept the Triple Crown aboard Affirmed in 1978, head the list of 1994 inductees into the Hall of Fame, it was announced yesterday. Other inductees include: **Arts and Letters**, Horse of the Year in 1969; **Ta Wee**, champion sprinter in 1969 and '70; **Eight Thirty**, a top handicap horse in the pre-World War II era; and **Flatterer**, champion steeplechase horse from 1984-'87. The inductions will take place Aug. 8 at the National Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs, NY.

### ALL-WEATHER HURDLING TO END IN U.K.

Hurdle racing in Britain will no longer be held on all-weather tracks after a specialist group set up to investigate the sport's future released findings Tuesday citing it as too dangerous. All-weather hurdling has been under close scrutiny this year after a series of equine fatalities caused a suspension of racing in Feb. Tuesday's findings--that there was no single cause of the deaths, but that the toll (13 in the first few weeks of 1994) was too high--are expected to be rubber-stamped next week at a meeting of the British Horseracing Board.

**HOUSTON OFF TO GOOD START** The seven-year-old stallion **Houston** (Seattle Slew) registered his first winner from his first starter yesterday when **Lass Martini**, a two-year-old filly out of the multiple stakes-winning Three Martinis mare Hasty Lass, won a three-furlong maiden event at Hialeah. Houston, a GII winner of \$240,632, has 69 foals in his current two-year-old crop. He stands at Walmac International in Lexington, Kentucky for \$15,000 live foal.

**Meadow Flight** (Meadowlake) worked a half-mile Wed. morning in :53, turning in fractions of :27, :40 1/5, and out the 5/8ths in 1:08, under Shane Sellers, who will be aboard the colt Saturday. "As laid back as he is, he is eligible to do that," said trainer Jim Ryerson of the leisurely move. "He needs company to get in gear."

**Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms) breezed a half in :49 3/5 under Kent Desormeaux, turning in fractions of :26 3/5, :38, and galloping out in 1:02 2/5. "I couldn't pull him up," said Desormeaux. "He really wanted to do more." Trainer Dick Mandella was pleased with the move. "The workout was exactly as planned. We weren't looking to set any worlds on fire, just to put some air in him," said Mandella.

**Holy Bull** (Great Above), the Derby favorite, returned to the track for the first time since his five furlong work Mon. Owner/trainer Jimmy Croll said the colt "bounced home" after the 1 1/2-mile gallop, adding, "He showed this morning that he's good and sharp."

**SADLER'S WELLS FERTILITY WOES** The world's leading stallion, **Sadler's Wells** (Northern Dancer), is suffering fertility problems, having been noticeably slower in getting his mates in foal this year after covering 112 mares last season. His connections are mystified over the problem with Sadler's Wells, whose stud fee at Coolmore in Ireland is reputed to be 100,000 Irish pounds. Bob Lanigan, Coolmore's general manager, said, "All the veterinary advice is that the horse is going through a difficult patch for reasons which are inexplicable. To the best of their tests, they can find nothing wrong. But we are confident he will be all right." The stallion's top progeny in Europe include In The Wings, Old Vic, Opera House and Salsabil. Fort Marcy H. winner Adam Smith was his most recent GSW in the U.S.

**BEST PAL BACK AT THE TRACK** Golden Eagle Farm's **Best Pal** (\*Habitony) returned Sat. from John and Betty Mabee's farm in Ramona, Ca. to Hollywood Park and new trainer Dick Mandella. "He's jogging already," said Mandella's assistant Chris Baker Wed. "He was turned out for three months and did just about nothing for 2 1/2 months, but he seems happy. He's carrying a lot of flesh and he's in good shape." Mandella expects the all-time leading California-bred money earner at nearly \$5 million to get back to competition in about three months. Best Pal had been trained by Gary Jones until March, when he and Mabee parted company.

## DERBY RHYTHM

The owners of Kentucky Derby entrant **Southern Rhythm** (Dixieland Band) are planning to go to Louisville Saturday to see their horse Run for the Roses. All eight of them.

Southern Rhythm, who is out of the Mr. Prospector mare Prospector's Queen, was purchased for \$47,000 at the 1992 Keeneland September Yearling Sale by a partnership of three men from Texas, Ted Keefer, Bill Heiligbrodt and Walter (Buddy) New.

"We've campaigned about eight or 10 stakes horses together," said Keefer Thursday from his Shady Oak Farm. "Our first horse made over \$500,000." That was Appealing Breeze, a colt by Breezing On, who won the GIII Fairmount Derby and nine of 14 races for earnings of \$553,327.

The partnership buys most of its racing prospects at yearling auctions, which is where Southern Rhythm first caught Keefer's eye. "I thought he was an extremely well-bred colt and I thought he was awfully well-balanced. He came right from the sale to my training center. He was very impressive before he ever left me. When I sent him to my brother (trainer James Keefer), we took our time with him. We ran him once in the fall as a two-year-old and he showed us all indications of being a good horse. So we let him mature and get a little growth and time on him and then came out with him."

After finishing second in his debut as a two-year-old, Southern Rhythm came back at three to win four of five starts, including the \$100,000 Southwest Stakes at Oaklawn March 12. "Right after we won the Southwest there was a lot of interest in him," said Keefer. "Even before that, people wanted to buy him. But I didn't want to sell him until he won a stake and we found out how he'd run around two turns. When he was as impressive as he was, then I had them coming out of the woodworks wanting to buy him. Johnny Jones saw the race on tape and called me immediately. He was really impressed with the horse, so we worked out a deal where his farm and his people could buy him and have the right to stand him at Walmac."

The deal with Johnny Jones of Walmac International brought in five new owners for the colt. Constance M. (Connie) Sczesny became involved when she received a phone call from R.D. Hubbard, her late husband's former business partner in AFG Industries. "Mr. Hubbard called and asked me if I would like to do this or not," said Sczesny. "So I said yes. I'm very interested in breeding and I just thought the breeding was great. That was what attracted me more to it than anything else. I hadn't been able to

see him race."

A trip to Keeneland for the GII Lexington Stakes, which Southern Rhythm won by 2 1/2-lengths, gave Sczesny her first chance to see the colt in action. "It was wonderful," she said. "It brought back memories of Fire the Groom." Fire the Groom, a Blushing Groom (FR) mare that Sczesny owns in partnership with Hubbard, won the GI Beverly D. and earned \$785,698. "She liked to stay in the back too," continued Sczesny, "and I'm thinking, 'When are they going to move, when are they going to move?' But then when they do move, it's just wonderful."

It was Mr. Hubbard, owner of Hollywood Park and Ruidoso Downs, who first introduced Sczesny to the business of breeding and racing Thoroughbreds. "My husband and I got our start when we were invited to go to the Kentucky Derby with Mr. and Mrs. R.D. Hubbard," said Sczesny. "So we started going to that, and then we went to some sales and really got interested in that aspect of the industry, and then lo and behold, before we knew it, we were part owners of the farm." The farm is Crystal Springs, located on Georgetown Road in Paris, Kentucky. "Fire the Groom is at the farm and she is in foal," said Sczesny. "And one of the other ones that we're waiting to get back on the track is Fit to Lead (GII winner by Fit to Fight). She's been getting some R&R. She deserves it. When Mr. Mandella says she's ready, that's when she'll go."

Sczesny first met both Southern Rhythm and his other owners at the Lexington Stakes April 24. "He's just really a beautiful horse," she said. "I've met the other owners from Texas and they're great people. As far as I know, all eight of us are planning on going to the Derby. I'm just really, really all fired up for Saturday. I think he has as good a chance as anyone else."

One thing's for sure. If Connie Sczesny, Ted Keefer and Southern Rhythm should find themselves in the winner's circle this first Saturday in May, they will not be standing there alone.
