### NATIONAL BEST SEVEN DEBUTS MAY 30

TRA Commissioner Brian McGrath announced yesterday that the National Best Seven wager will debut Memorial Day, May 30, highlighted by Belmont's GI Met Mile and the GI Hollywood Turf H. Also included in the wager will be the Memorial S. from Sam Houston, the Gill Red Bank H. from Monmouth, the Gill Washington Park H. from Arlington, the Memorial Day H. from Calder and the Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. from Churchill. The National Best Seven will be offered weekly on Saturdays, except for holiday weekends such Memorial Day and the Fourth of July, when the wager may be moved to the holiday; the bet is subject to further approval by commissions and agreements with horsemen's groups.

### HORSEMEN TO SUPPORT BEST SEVEN IF REVENUES EQUALLY DIVIDED

The National HBPA and Horsemen's Marketing and Media have expressed concerns over the division of revenue proposed by the TRA for the National Best Seven. In a meeting with Commissioner Brian McGrath Thursday, the TRA informed the horsemen that they would like to adopt the current legislated percentages going to purses on a Pick 6-type bet, which has a takeout similar to that of the 25% takeout of the Best Seven. "The problem that horsemen have with that structure," said Barry Weisbord, President of HMM, "is that in some states, there is a substantial disparity between what tracks receive and what horsemen receive. For example, in New York, the horsemen receive 4% for purses while the tracks receive 13%." Horsemen are asking that the bet be divided like simulcasts, where tracks and horsemen split the revenue 50/50. "We think that is the right model to use," said Weisbord.

## Derby Preview cont.

**Soul Of The Matter** (Private Terms): Never off the board in six starts, the GI SW has never been beyond a mile and a sixteenth; second in the Lexington, his lone stakes win came in the mud at Santa Anita.

**Valiant Nature** (His Majesty): Winless in two starts this year, the GI SW chased Holy Bull home in second after making his bid at the quarter pole in the Blue Grass. Both career wins came on the front end.

**Powis Castle** (Rare Brick): Never worse than second, the Jim Beam runner-up is two-for-two at Churchill Downs, the only horse in the field to even start over the track.

**Holy Bull** (Great Above): Is the dosage nothing but bull? He had no trouble carrying his speed a mile and an eighth his last two, both GI's, but will be pressured today.

**Ulises** (Temperence Hill): Panamanian flash won his four SA starts by a total of 24 1/2 lengths; showed speed but tired when third in the GI Lexington, his lone U.S. start.

**Mahogany Hall** (Woodman): A winner of three of his first four starts, he closed some to be third in the Blue Grass but was 8 1/2 behind the winner; off the board in his only other graded stakes.

**Strodes Creek** (Halo): One of two in the field without a stakes win, he closed well to be third in the Santa Anita Derby; makes only his fifth career start. Trainer has two Derby wins.

**Go For Gin** (Cormorant): First or second in seven of nine, he was second best in the Wood Memorial; trainer won the '91 Derby.

**Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat): Game runner-up in the Santa Anita Derby, MGSW has won on the lead or from just off the pace. Team Lukas has one Derby winner.

**Brocco** (Kris S.): Never worse than second in six tries, he'll try to become the first Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner to take the roses. He is already the first to win the Santa Anita Derby.

**Smilin Singin Sam** (Smile): All three wins have been wire-to-wire; he was 22-1 taking the Remington Park Derby.

**Southern Rhythm** (Dixieland Band): Bounced back from his first off-the-board finish to win the Lexington; finished fourth in the Jim Beam--his lone try at a mile and an eighth.

**Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer): The other non-stakes winner has been second in graded stakes twice; he closed from the clouds to be second in the GI Arkansas Derby.

**Meadow Flight** (Meadowlake): Paid off at 26-1 when winning the Flamingo for his first stakes victory; it was his first try around two turns.

**Kandaly** (Alydar): Established closer was first or second in his first four starts, including the Louisiana Derby; made a run but faded in the Blue Grass.

The Derby profile that we've discussed has slow-developing two-year-olds getting down to good figures between Labor Day and the end of their 2-year-old year. All the Derby winners over the last 12 years have also run big races within six weeks of the Derby, usually their lifetime best. We've talked about the three-year-old spring pattern--stakes-level three-year-olds in the spring run two big races, then bounce, then run well. **Soul Of The Matter** (Private Terms), **Holy Bull** (Great Above) and **Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer) have just run well twice and figure to run worse this time. The ones who fit the pattern and are fast enough are **Go For Gin** (Cormorant), **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty), **Powis Castle** (Rare Brick) and **Brocco** (Kris S.), and we're playing them as a box. Any of those that are 10-1 or more wherever you're betting are worth a win bet. *Thoro-Graph sheets, state-of-the-art performance figures, are used by many horsemen and professional handicappers to evaluate the ability of racehorses. **BRITISH JOCKEY KILLED AT LINGFIELD**

British jockey Steve Wood died Friday after a spill at Lingfield Park. Wood, 26, was riding Kalar in the day's fifth race; he was pronounced dead with massive internal chest injuries at the hospital 20 minutes after the accident. Two other jockeys were involved but were not seriously injured. Wood is the sixth jockey to die in a racecourse accident in Britain since 1981. Last week, jump jockey Declan Murphy was severely injured in a fall at Haydock Park; Murphy was on the critical list for two days following the incident, but after surgery to remove a blood clot, the 27-year-old is now improving and has been moved out of ICU.

**ARLINGTON OPENS SUNDAY** Arlington International Racecourse begins its 1994 season Sunday, May 8. Racing will be offered Wednesdays through Mondays; first post is 1:00 p.m. with the exception of Fridays, when the first race goes off at 3:00 p.m. The 1994 Arlington stakes program is worth more than \$6 million. The meet will be highlighted by the International Festival of Racing, Aug. 27-28, featuring the GI Arlington Million and the GI Beverly D.
