SNURGE BECOMES BRITAIN'S ALL-TIME LEADER Seven-year-old **Snurge** (Ela-Mana-Mou) became Britain's all-time leading money earner with his fourth-place finish in Sunday's Group II Gerling-Preis at Cologne, Germany. The winner of the '92 Rothmans International passed Pebble's record and has now won 1,185,491 pounds, but his record is already in jeopardy. Should Sayyedati win this weekend's Yasuda Kinen in Tokyo, she would recapture the top spot for Pebble's trainer, Clive Brittain.

REMINGTON PARK FIGURES A strong final weekend that saw nearly 25,000 fans pass through the turnstiles and wager close to \$4 million over the two days brought the 65-day 1994 Remington Park Spring Meeting to a close Sunday. Attendance at the meet totaled 493,313 for a daily average of 7,589, down 10.5 percent from '93; total handle came to \$71,590,896 for a daily average of \$1,101,521, down 7.3 percent from last year.

BROADWAY JOAN VOTED NEW YORK BROODMARE OF THE YEAR Richard M. Bomze's **Broadway Joan** (Bold Arian), dam of New York-bred Horse of the Year Fourstars Allstar and three-time champ Fourstardave, was the unanimous choice as New York Broodmare-of-the-Year. The 15-year-old was also voted the award in '90 and '91.

NYTB TO PUSH FOR CHANGES IN NEW YORK The Board of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. has voted unanimously to seek passage in the legislature of a bill which would change the laws governing how the New York breeding industry is regulated. The major change proposed would eliminate the every-other-year breed-back requirement for full-time resident broodmares. Currently, the industry is regulated by The NY State Thoroughbred Breeding & Development Fund Corp., a public benefit corporation whose Board and senior staff are government appointees. Unlike most states, breeders in New York have no authority to shape the rules governing foal eligibility. "The overall thrust of this legislation is to turn the affairs of the breeding industry over to the breeders themselves, as is the case in virtually every major state where incentive programs are in effect," said Dr. Douglas Koch, DVM, president of the NYTB.

LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Jockey Chris McCarron, riding **Go For Gin** (Cormorant) in competition for the first time, decided to go for it from the gate and surprised many with his wire-to-wire win in the Kentucky Derby. The colt's connections were confident, but not cocky going into the race. "I did think the horse would perform better than many thought, but even an arrogant type like myself refused to suggest that we would win," said co-owner Joseph Cornacchia. "I wanted to be competitive and I hoped he'd run his race, but even I shied from thinking that he would do what he has in fact done." The winner will be shipped to Pimlico today or tomorrow, and will again meet **Holy Bull** (Great Above), **Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer), **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat), and **Powis Castle** (Rare Brick) in the Preakness; **Soul of the Matter** (Private Terms), **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty) and **Brocco** (Kris S.), are also possible. "It's 60-40 he'll go," said Brocco's trainer, Randy Winick. "He came back good and he's eating good, but as much as I'd like to win a Triple Crown race, I don't want to kill the horse."

New faces in the second leg of the Crown will be **Kandaly** (Alydar), **Numerous** (Mr. Prospector) and **Silver Goblin** (Silver Ghost); Arkansas Derby winner **Concern** (Broad Brush) and stablemate **Looming** (Broad Brush), Illinois Derby victor **Rustic Light** (Country Pine), **Polar Expedition** (Kodiack) and **Shiprock** (Ga Hai) are also taking a look at the race.

Trainer Scotty Schulhofer won last year's Belmont S. after skipping the first two legs of the Triple Crown with Colonial Affair; the Hall of Famer sent out undefeated **Twining** (Forty Niner) to win the GII Withers for his fourth straight on opening day at Belmont; the royally bred three-year-old will now point for the Peter Pan (May 29), the race his older stablemate used as a stepping stone to the Belmont last year.
