PURSE REDUCTIONS AT SAM HOUSTON

Jim Murphy, General Manager of Sam Houston Race Park, has announced a reduction in purses for the final two weeks of the inaugural season. Three stakes affected are the Wildflower H., the Maxxam Gold Cup and the Texas Heritage S., to be run on June 12, 18 and 19, respectively. Also, two races have been eliminated: the June 18 Manatee S. and the June 19 Bye Y'all S. Daily purses will also be adjusted for the remainder of the meeting. "Our per capita is less than we would like, so we have to make the necessary modifications," said Murphy. "We're committed to work as hard as we can in the various areas that will enhance our purse account for the future."

RAFTERY DEAD AT 79 Nationally renowned race-track photographer Jim Raftery died Wed. afternoon at Hollywood Medical Center in Hollywood, Fl. after a brief illness at age 79. Raftery was official track photographer at all three South Florida tracks and the New Jersey tracks for over 40 years. Born Jan. 29, 1915 in Everett, Mass., Raftery was a jockey in his youth. His daughter Peggy Sue is married to jockey Bobby Lester, and granddaughter Jan Perret is the wife of jockey Craig Perret. Grandson Jimmy Edwards is a former jockey who won the 1975 Eclipse Award as an apprentice.

PREAKNESS PATER *Ulises* (Temperence Hill) has been declared a non-starter in the Preakness after missing a scheduled work and schooling session in the gate Tuesday morning at Belmont. *Ulises* was fractious in the gate at the Derby...Pat Valenzuela, who rode Sunday Silence to victory in the 1989 Preakness for trainer Charlie Whittingham, will replace an ailing Eddie Delahoussaye aboard **Numerous** (Mr. Prospector). Whittingham said that Delahoussaye had a flu-like condition that requires rest. "The doctors told him not to ride," said the trainer. "They want him to take off a week or so. He didn't feel well in Kentucky, and he missed some days in California. Patrick's ridden a lot of good races for me. He's a good money rider."... **Numerous**, **Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer) and **Polar Expedition** (Kodiack) are all expected to breeze Thursday morning. VALIANT NATURE TO RUN PREAKNESS

DAY? Valiant Nature (His Majesty) may run on Preakness Day, but it won't be at Pimlico. The 13th-place finisher in the Kentucky Derby will probably run at Hollywood Park, where he is undefeated in two starts. Valiant Nature was assigned highweight of 122 pounds for the GIII Will Rogers H., to be run Sat. at 1 1/16 miles over the Hollywood Turf.

CALL FOR CHANGES AT EPSOM

Leading British trainers are calling for changes in the entry conditions for the Epsom Derby which prevents late-developing horses from making the Classic. There are currently two entry stages for the Derby-- the first for yearlings and the second (costing a £10,000 supplementary fee) for three year olds three months before the race. However, following a series of top trial wins by non-entered horses, several handlers have called for a revised system. Henry Cecil, who won the Derby last year with Commander In Chief, is now unable to run Cicerao, who defeated current Derby favorite Erhaab in April. "I believe a £10,000 entry only two weeks before the Derby would be a good idea."

THE ZEN OF ZITO or WHAT MAKES NICK TICK

Dracula, devils, angels. Good vibes; negative energy. Dreams. Omens. Superstitions. Life in Nick Zito's shedrow is a continuous mystical experience.

"Horses pick up on the vibes," said Zito, the trainer of Kentucky Derby winner Go for Gin. "You're a product of your environment."

He has been that since his childhood, since his dad taught him to beware people who wore perpetual frowns. "My father used to say get away from them-negative energy," Zito said. And so Zito does his best to keep his-- and his horses' vibes positive.

This personal Zen is a curious mixture of superstition, religious beliefs and old-fashioned, blue-collar ethics. He believes hard work is the key to success, but he seeks good racing luck in heads-up pennies and rituals. When he gets it-- he thanks God.

"I gotta," Zito said.

He is bringing Kathy Garcia, the pony girl who escorted Strike the Gold to the track for his Kentucky Derby victory, out of retirement to pony Go for Gin to the gate of the Preakness. Zito wore the same tie for Derby 120 that he wore for Derby 117--red with white horses. "But I won't wear it for the Preakness," Zito said. "Because I wore it the last Preakness and Strike the Gold lost."

He asked Daily Racing Form reporter Steve Haskin if he could borrow the stopwatch he used in Louisville again in Baltimore. Haskin genially agreed. Only problem is Zito can't find it. "It's around," Zito insisted.

Now, all he needs to do to keep his roll going is to find a heads-up penny and have a good-omen dream. He and a couple of friends combined to find three good luck pennies at Churchill, and he had two good-vibes producing dreams, one in which he saw Go for Gin cross the finish-line first, and another in which Jeff Lukas hugged him.

But all he's got to show for his nights in Baltimore so far is one "semi-dream"-- you know, one of those nighttime images so fuzzy you can't be sure if you dreamed it or wished you'd dreamed it.

"I didn't want to say anything in front of a group of reporters because it was just a semi-dream," Zito confided. "But I sort of dreamed it rained Friday night."
