NATIONAL BEST SEVEN OFF TO SMOOTH

START The TRA was very satisfied with the operation and results of the inaugural National Best Seven, according to Commissioner Brian McGrath. A total of \$371,075.50 was bet at over 75 participating outlets. With a 50 cent base wager, this translates to over 740,000 bets. "The figures show the public has significant interest in the wager," said McGrath. There were 919 tickets with all seven winners, while 10,758 tickets carried six of seven. Because there was more than one winning ticket, the Jackpot Pool paid only when there is a single winning ticket carries over to this Sat.'s National Best Seven and totals \$19,481.40. Final wagering figures show California as the leading state with \$145,748.

KEENELAND TO CATALOG 287 FOR JULY SELECTED YEARLING SALE

Keeneland will catalog 287 horses for its 51st annual July Selected Yearling Sale, officials announced yesterday. The two-day sale will be held July 18 and 19. The total is eight more than the 279 horses catalogued in 1993. Danzig, the leading sire last year, is represented by more yearlings, 25, than any other stallion. Other sires with multiple yearlings in the sale include Mr. Prospector, 19; Nureyev, 15; Pleasant Colony, 9; Sadler's Wells, 3; Dayjur, 12 and Storm Cat, 6.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR HOLY BULL? Trainer Warren "Jimmy" Croll is still undecided about immediate plans for **Holy Bull** (Great Above), who defeated older horses by 5 1/2-lengths in Mon.'s Met Mile. "Well, yesterday before the Met I was 98 percent sure I wasn't going in the Belmont Stakes," said Croll. "But now the odds are just a little bit less. It all depends on the horse." Whatever course he takes, Croll is certain that he would like to be at Monmouth July 31. "The Haskell is definitely our long-range goal, if everything is all right."

THISTLEDOWN SUMMIT MEET HANDLE UP

The Summit Meet at Thistledown witnessed a 4.1 percent increase in daily average handle over its 1993 totals as the meet came to a close Monday. Total handle for the 1994 Summit Meet topped out at \$39,224,150, compared to \$34,598,979 for the 1993 Summit Meet, an increase of 13.4 percent. Total attendance increased 8.8 percent over last year, while daily average attendance remained relatively constant as 4,455 fans arrived in 1994 compared with 4,461 last season. The 51-day Thistledown Meet begins today and will be highlighted by the GI \$300,000 Ohio Derby June 18.

HAL KING DEAD AT 75 Hal King, whose accomplishments as a horseman were exceeded only by his popularity among his peers, died Sun. morning at Scripps Hospital in La Jolla, Calif. He was 75. His son, Don, 33, said the death came after a lingering illness. King entered racing as an owner when he attended a California Thoroughbred Breeders' Association sale at Hollywood Park and "raised my hand and bought a horse" in 1947. His first winner as an owner came in 1950 at Del Mar with Alis Thunder. His first winner as a trainer came in 1953 with She Don't Smoke in the Solano H. He trained Johnlee N' Harold, winner of the 1981 San Rafael S. King retired to Mexico in Feb. 1990 and had been serving as bloodstock agent and consultant to Sid and Jenny Craig since that time. Funeral services will be Thurs. at Temple Beth David in Temple City, Calif. King's ashes will be scattered over Santa Anita Park, his son Don said.
