## NEW YORK HORSEMEN BACK RACING

**BILLS** A prominent group of New York horsemen announced yesterday they are campaigning for the passage of two bills in the State Legislature to increase purses and lessen tax burdens on owners. Without passage, they warrant, the future of racing in New York is bleak. "We don't want another Roosevelt Raceway situation here," said trainer Dennis Brida, referring to the once-prominent New York harness track that is now closed. "We are trying to tell people our industry is in deep trouble and we have to do something to back our way out of it. We want these bills to pass because we have to start fixing New York racing." Brida appeared at a press conference along with Shug McGaughey, Bill Mott, Scotty Schulhofer, Phil Johnson, MacK. Miller, Mike Hushion, Rick Violette, Pat Kelly and New York HBPA President Al Fried Jr. One bill calls for the state to lower its take of total mutuel handle by one percent and to pass that money on to horsemen in the form of purses. Fried estimated that that would increase total purses by \$22 million. The other bill would eliminate the sales and use tax levied on all horses after they have made their 5th start in New York and eliminate all taxes on claims. Another group of New York horsemen will go to Albany Monday to meet with prominent state lawmakers. According to the NY-HBPA, New York purses have declined 18% since 1988 and the total number of licensed owners has dropped from 4,500 in 1989 to 1,600 in 1993.

## CHURCHILL DOWNS INCREASES PURSES

Churchill Downs Vice President, Racing, Jerry Botts announced yesterday that effective today, all overnight purses at Churchill will be increased approximately five percent. "This increase is a direct reflection of the success of our business," said Botts. "Our totals for the Spring Meet have been phenomenal on a national as well as local basis."

Who will get the mile and a half? **Amathos** (Cox's Ridge) has the breeding, and the country's leading trainer and jockey in his corner, but he is without a stakes win to his credit. Trainer Bill Mott saddles his first Belmont S. starter. **Brocco** (Kris S.), a troubled fourth in the Derby, skipped the Preakness to await the final leg of the Crown. He has worked well at Belmont, and his just-off-the-pace style is well-suited to the Belmont S. **Go for Gin** (Cormorant) had no problem carrying his speed a mile and a quarter in the Derby; trainer Nick Zito said, "One more shot of fire, that's all he needs. If he is the champion, then he will fire the shot." Three of the last four Belmont S. winners have skipped the first two races of the Triple Crown, including the '93 victor, Colonial Affair. Last year's winning trainer, Scotty Schulhofer, tries to make it two in a row with Triple newcomer **Signal Tap** (Fappiano); the colt has been first or second in five of six lifetime, but was off the board in his only stakes attempt, the GIII Flamingo. Trainer Charlie Whittingham looks for his first Belmont S. winner with **Strodes Creek** (Halo); Halo has sired two Derby winners, including Whittingham trainee Sunday Silence, but no Belmont S. winners; Sunday was silenced by Easy Goer in the '89 edition, finishing second. The Bald Eagle also sent out Derby winner Ferdinand to be third in '86, his only other Belmont starter. **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) will try to become the 16th three-year-old to complete the Preakness-Belmont double; '91 winner Hansel was the last to do it. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has sent out seven Belmont runners, but none have finished on the board. **Ulises** (Temperance Hill) is by the 1980 Belmont Stakes winner, but has shown little while finishing last in his last two starts; he has never won beyond six furlongs.

**Thoro-Graph Analysis**

The 1994 Belmont Stakes features a solid field of three-year-olds from one of the best crops racing has seen in years. Four of the seven runners figure to have a say in the finish, but we feel that one stands out in the crowd.

**Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) improved seven lengths in winning the Preakness; it was by far his best race, nine Thoro-Graph points faster than he ever ran last year, but he figures to bounce off that performance. Also, his pedigree indicates he will be better at sprint and middle distances--not at a mile and a half.

**Strodes Creek** (Halo) also ran the best race of his young life last time out, finishing second in the Derby, but he is lightly raced and had yet more room for improvement. He has had time to recover from his big effort, and is much less likely to bounce because of it.

**Brocco** (Kris S.) did not run his best in the slop at Churchill, but that is not what makes us wary of this one. While his breeding and running style are indicative of a good performance, we have to wonder why the lightly raced three-year-old did not make an appearance in the Preakness.

Which leads us to Derby winner **Go for Gin** (Cormorant). Except for one start at two, the colt has either run as good or better than his last in every career start; he simply never bounces. He brings to mind Triple Crown winner Affirmed, and his pedigree suggests he will get better as he gets older. The Belmont S., and the Eclipse Award, are his to lose. We like Go For Gin on top of Strodes Creek. *Thoro-Graph sheets, state-of-the-art performance figures, are used by many horsemen and professional handicappers to evaluate the ability of racehorses.
