CHBPA ELECTION RESULTS The California HBPA held its 1994 election for Board of Directors yesterday. The owners elected to the Board are Gerry Behman, Gary Burke, Ron Charles, Marianne Chase, Ed Friendly, Bart Heller, Charles Kenis, Alan Landsburg, Marvin Malmuth, Jack Owens, Mace Siegel and Samantha Siegel. Trainers elected to the Board include Dan Hendricks, Richard Mandella, Ed Moger Jr., Sandy Shulman, Noble Threewitt and Jack Van Berg. "The elections were a total vindication of our position," said new Board member Ed Friendly. "A year and a half ago, we formed Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) to protect the owners' interests. We put 18 on the ballot, and 17 of those were elected. Eight TOC members are now on the HBPA board. That's a clear indication that the HBPA board is not thought well of by their own members." The first meeting of the new board is scheduled for Wed., June 29, at the Westin Hotel, Los Angeles.

TRA BOARD ACTS ON UNIFORM LICENSING, STANDARD SADDLE CLOTH COLORS The Thoroughbred Racing Association's Board of Directors passed a resolution at its quarterly meeting at Hollywood Park yesterday supporting the RCI's goal of initiating a uniform owners' licensing program. The Board also adopted a standard color scheme for saddle cloths at those track utilizing them as a means of horse identification for racing fans. Because of the increase in the amount of races being telecast, many tracks have implemented different color saddle cloths for each program number, but there has been a lack of uniformity in which color is used for which number. Under the color scheme adopted by the TRA Board, its member tracks utilizing multi-colored saddle cloths will coordinate them as follows: No. 1-Red; 2-White; 3-Blue; 4-Yellow; 5-Green; 6-Black; 7-Orange; 8-Pink; 9-Turquoise; 10-Purple; 11-Grey; 12-Lime.

**News Continued.****EXERCISE RIDER IN CRITICAL CONDITION**

Exercise rider Fiona Larson was listed in critical condition at Washington Hospital Center yesterday following a Monday morning training mishap at the Shenandoah Downs training center in West Virginia. The mishap occurred when Larson's mount, Drummer's Turn, became fractious during a morning workout, throwing the exercise rider solidly to the track. The 19-year-old Boston, Mass. native was transported via Charles Town Races ambulance to nearby Jefferson Memorial Hospital with suspected head injuries and was immediately transferred by MedStar to Washington Hospital Center. Drummer's Turn was unhurt.

LAKEWAY AND SARDULA ON COURSE FOR REMATCH

It is beginning to appear as if the eagerly anticipated **Sardula** (Storm Cat)--**Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) rematch will take place in the GI Hollywood Oaks Sunday, July 10. In fact, Lakeway's trainer Gary Jones said Sardula will be the one who decides where Lakeway runs. "Basically, wherever Sardula runs, we'll run. That's how you win championships; by beating the best," said Jones. In their only matchup to date, Sardula edged Lakeway by a head in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 6. Although it has already been speculated in print that Sardula stands to be favored in the rematch, Jones isn't worried. "That could be the case, but I know who I like," he said.

ARCANGUES, BAILEY REUNITED FOR GOLD CUP

Jerry Bailey, who piloted Daniel Wildenstein's **Arcangues** (Sagace {FR}) to a \$269,200 win payoff in the 1993 Breeders Cup Classic, will be aboard again in the Hollywood Gold Cup, trainer Richard Mandella said Wed. morning. Arcangues was ridden by Eddie Delahoussaye in his two races since the Nov. 6 Classic, winning the John Henry H. May 1 and finishing fifth in the Hollywood Turf H. May 30. Delahoussaye has been plagued with sinusitis for several months and has been riding intermittently during that period. But Mandella said Delahoussaye's physical condition was not a factor in making the change. "Bailey rated him (Arcangues) nicely in the Classic, and we wanted to try him back again," Mandella said.

RIVER DOWNS INCREASES PURSES

River Downs Racing Secretary Warren Wolf announced a \$300 per race increase in purses which represents a 5.5 percent increase in the daily purse distribution. The minimum purse is now at a record high of \$3,800. "Two years ago our minimum purse was \$2,800 and now we're at an all-time high of \$3,800, that's quite an endorsement for the 'Twin Seven SuperCard' format," said Wolf.
