## CALIFORNIA'S NORTH-SOUTH EXCHANGE

**A SUCCESS** North-south simulcasting generated a total handle of almost \$40 million on races exchanged between Hollywood Park and Golden Gate Fields during the first 46 days of the Hollywood Park spring/summer meeting. "In our estimation, the exchange of signals has been a success," said Hollywood Park Chairman R.D. Hubbard. "Clearly, it's significantly contributed to the on-track and off-track daily average gain that we've experienced, but we're fearful the preclusion of the legislation will negatively impact the remainder of the meeting." Patrons at Hollywood and its satellite sites wagered \$20,882,964 on 94 races from Golden Gate, an average of \$220,031. Hollywood sent 188 races to Golden Gate, generating a handle of \$18,684,259, an average of \$99,384. The exchange ended with the conclusion of the Golden Gate Fields meeting Sunday. Hollywood has averaged \$8.2 million through the first 46 days of the 68-day meeting, an increase of 14.2 percent from 1993. Golden Gate Fields experienced its best season in years, finishing with a 19 percent increase in total handle.

## TWINING MAY WAIT FOR SARATOGA

Trainer Scotty Schulhofer has been very honest with his desire to keep the undefeated **Twining** (Forty Niner) away from **Holy Bull** (Great Above). "If Holy Bull doesn't run in the Dwyer (at Belmont this Sun.), then we'll run in the Dwyer," said Schulhofer. "If Holy Bull runs in the Dwyer then we'll run in the Jim Dandy at Saratoga. I will enter him and we'll see what happens." Twining will blow out a half-mile Friday.

**NUMERICALLY DEAD** The 1993 "Ohio Horse of the Year" and "Champion Three-Year-Old Male" **Numerically** (Four Ten) was discovered dead in his stall at approximately 4 a.m. yesterday morning, it was announced by Thistledown VP Mike Mackey. "This is a terrible tragedy to lose a horse of Numerically's caliber," said Mackey. "We won't know what the cause of death was until tests are run." In Numerically's last race, he finished fourth as the highweighted favorite in the \$30,000 Western Reserve H. Sat., June 25. The roan gelding won 13 of 26 career starts for earnings of \$360,000.

"This is where we separate the men from the boys," said trainer Frank Alexander, who trains **Jump The Shadow** (Dayjur). "We're all guessing. Nobody has run against a winner so you don't know what will happen." Dogwood Stable's **Jump The Shadow** wired a field of maidens at Belmont June 10, registering the fastest five furlongs of the meet in :57.66. "He has incredible natural speed," Alexander said. "He has been working very well. I wouldn't swap places with anybody." Peter Brant's **De Niro** (Gulch) broke slowly in his first start May 25 and trailed the field by 10 lengths when they hit the far turn. He then exploded on the outside as the field turned for home and easily glided by his competition, bounding home to an eye-catching nine-length triumph. "I felt great after that race," said trainer H. Allen Jerkens. "He just does everything like he is an older horse."

## RACING ON THE SMALL SCREEN

When CBS-TV stepped very quietly back into the racing arena with the \$150,000 Hempstead Handicap from Belmont Park June 19, there was a great deal of concern at the network's sports department about the move.

Rightly so, too, because the race appeared at one stage to be down to three starters. Eventually, five made it into the gate and Georgia Hofmann's Sky Beauty raised her Belmont record to 10-10 by beating the Rokeby Stable's You'd Be Surprised by a neck in one of the best races of the year thus far.

Even in the warm afterglow of the Hempstead, the CBS folks seemed to find themselves in yet another quandary when its upcoming telecast of the \$500,000 Caesar's Invitational Handicap from Atlantic City on June 26 seemed stuck on the number three for five days: Star of Cozzene, Lure and Marco Bay.

CBS got very fortunate as six horses turned out and Lure ran a brilliant race to beat the gritty Fourstars Allstar a nose with Star of Cozzene another 1 1/2 lengths back. The network also carried the \$101,250 Jersey Shore Budweiser Breeders' Cup in which the Christiana Stables End Sweep got out of trouble and up to defeat Meadow Flight by a neck.

Come July 24, CBS and its cameras will be utilizing Saratoga as a backdrop for a two-hour telecast which will include the \$150,000 Go for Wand. That event, of course, is the scheduled next start for Sky Beauty, a filly that has won 12 of her 15 lifetime starts.

Perhaps you might have overlooked something in what CBS is doing: all the races it has carried thus far and is scheduled to do are Sunday events which fit into its new "Eye on Sports", a show which will be pressed into serious service this fall to make up for the network's loss of the NFL to the Fox Network.

Once, of course, CBS was racing on television, and its re-entry into the sport may be half out of need and half out of desperation. Or perhaps the timing is right because there is a ton of talk in the sports-television business that both ABC-TV and Chrysler are backing out of the Triple Crown after 1995.

Seemingly, ABC wants to keep the Derby and not carry the Preakness and Belmont. Don't be shocked by that, the races have been split before

with ABC doing the Derby and CBS handling the Preakness and Belmont. Rumors also have Buick stepping in to replace Chrysler, a strange development should it come to pass.

One of the major problems racing has with television currently is that the sport overdoses on the Triple Crown with all those "roads to Churchill Downs" and no Triple Crown winner emerging over the last 16 years.

In the world of racing the year certainly does not end with the running of the Belmont Stakes, even though that sometimes seems to be what television is telling us. Or, more importantly, what the racing industry allows television to tell us by failing consistently to schedule and package events to make them more interesting to television.

Scattered across the remainder of the summer and fall though are some 20 hours of televised races. By the time the year ends the New York Racing Association alone will have had races telecast by ABC, CBS, NBC and ESPN, a first for any jurisdiction.

And, as unlikely as it might have seemed a decade ago, Saratoga is now a six week meeting and on five of those weekends a national telecast will emanate from there. Fans will be able to see the Go For Wand (ABC), Alabama (ESPN), Travers (ABC), John A. Morris and Whitney (both ESPN).

What will be interesting to watch unfold in the next few weeks is exactly what television does with Lure's remarkable odyssey to Goodwood for the July 27 Sussex Stakes, one of Europe's top mile events. With a purse of some \$275,000 over an inverted "L" shaped course, Lure will be up against a field which should include Grand Lodge, Mister Baileys, Turtle Island, Bigstone, Sayyadati and others. Lure is the best known American horse to go after one of Europe's top prizes since Carry Back ran tenth in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe of 1962.

But Carry Back's trip was different because he had never run on turf before while Lure has won the last two runnings of the Breeders' Cup Mile, a race Europeans know very well because three Sussex winners since 1985--Rousillon, Warning and Zilzal have been favored to win it.

Even though the Sussex will be run on a Wednesday, it is one of those made for television sports stories that are so rare: the United States star trying to overcome vast differences of locale, footing and facing the enemy on his terms. It will be fascinating to see which network will build a racing show around Lure. No racing fan would dare miss it.
