HOLLYWOOD CASINO OPENS TODAY

The Hollywood Park Card Casino will officially open its doors this afternoon at 1:30 p.m. PDT. The 24-hour casino, the first of its kind to be built at a race-track in the United States, was completed in May but its opening was delayed by prolonged licensing procedures. It is part of the \$100 million Hollywood Park expansion first announced in 1992 by Hollywood Park Chairman R.D. Hubbard, which also includes the already-completed Golf and Sports Center and a proposed Music Dome, retail complex and Inglewood Police station. The Hollywood Park Casino is expected to draw 7,000 patrons for opening day; it features 140 live-action tables with a variety of California casino games as well as poker. The site also includes a gourmet restaurant, 300-seat sports lounge, health club, private 24-hour karaoke suites and live entertainment. Inglewood residents approved the casino in 1992 and will now be the recipients of sizable tax revenues and over 2,000 new jobs, according to Hollywood Park officials. The casino is owned by the Hollywood Park Operating Company and will be managed by Pacific Casino Management.

DEFRERE SUFFERS FRACTURE AT

MONMOUTH Two-year-old **Defrere** (Deputy Minister), the full brother to champion **Dehere** who was to make his debut for the Due Process Stable at Monmouth Park Sunday, suffered a condylar fracture of his right front cannon bone during a workout at the Jersey oval Thursday morning; he underwent surgery at the New Jersey Equine Clinic yesterday afternoon. "He went to Monmouth for a blow out--we were planning to run him in a maiden race Sunday," said Due Process general manager John Perrotta. "He went a half-mile in :46 4/5 in hand, very nice. He just took a bad step and was lame when he pulled up. The exercise girl said he was really reaching out; I guess he hyperextended and ended up with a fracture and a chip on the front of the same ankle. There was no displacement. Dr. Scott Palmer is putting screws in the leg (Thursday) afternoon; he will also take out the chip. The prognosis is unknown until after the surgery." Ironically, brother **Dehere** (Deputy Minister) had screws removed from his right hind leg Monday. "He's doing terrific," said Perrotta.

Mack. Miller trainee **Sea Hero** (Polish Navy) finished third in the June 18 Brooklyn H. over Belmont's main track in his last start. "I was testing him in that race to see how he would do, and he did run well," said Miller. "I don't believe he'll have a problem with the distance of the Bowling Green. He hasn't run that far on the turf, but he's won classic races on the dirt and he's run up to a mile and a half on the dirt." **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}) was second in the Gill Hialeah Turf Cup in his last effort April 30. "My horse is not a speed horse, so he was a little closer in that race in usual," said trainer Bill Mott. "He probably won't be that close in the Bowling Green."

TABASCO CAT TO JIM DANDY Trainer D.

Wayne Lukas announced yesterday that plans have changed for Preakness and Belmont S. winner **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat). The 3-year-old will make his next start in the Jim Dandy at Saratoga, rather than going directly to the GI Travers. Explaining the decision to prep in the Jim Dandy instead of the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, Lukas said, "There is a great deal of difference in the money, but I'd like to make one ship and settle in. If we were to run at Monmouth, we would have to ship from California to Monmouth the Saratoga. If we go in the Jim Dandy, we get a race over the track. Money aside, this is a better deal for us. We're not dodging **Holy Bull** (Great Above); it's just in our best interest to do it this way." The two top three-year-olds are still on track for the Travers at Saratoga August 20.

BROCCO BACK IN TRAINING Trainer Randy

Winick said BC Juvenile and Santa Anita Derby winner **Brocco** (Kris S.) returned to training Wed. at Santa Anita and hopes to make the Swaps S. at Hollywood July 23. "We'll see where he is after a week," said Winick yesterday. "I wouldn't rule out the Swaps. I'd say there's a 50-50 chance, maybe 75-25 we'll take a shot at it. He's got to get two, maybe three works into him and we have three weeks to make the race." Trainer Ron McAnally confirmed Thurs. that **Valiant Nature** (His Majesty) is still pointing to the Gill Swaps. Valiant Nature handed Brocco his first defeat in last year's Hollywood Futurity.

SUBURBAN WORKS Wallenda (Gulch) breezed four furlongs in :48.78 at Belmont yesterday morning in preparation for Mon.'s GI \$150,000 Suburban H., to be decided at 10 furlongs over the Elmont, NY track. Candidate **West By West** (Gone West) went five furlongs on Belmont's inner turf course in 1:04.84 with the dogs up. Also breezing over the inner turf was **Colonial Affair** (Pleasant Colony), who covered a half-mile in :49.23.

RULING REQUESTED ON GULFSTREAM TAX

CREDIT George Stuart, Secretary of Florida's Department of Business and Professional Regulations, has asked the state's Attorney General to rule on an \$800,000 tax credit Gulfstream Park took to supplement purses during their three-day 1992 Breeders' Cup meeting. According to Stuart's letter to the Attorney General, Gulfstream was entitled to \$415,243 in tax credits. But instead, the track took the maximum \$800,000 credit. Stuart contends Gulfstream owes the state a \$384,757 refund.
