SURGERY FOR THE WICKED NORTH

Trainer David Bernstein said yesterday that **The Wicked North** (Far North) was scheduled to undergo surgery at 2 p.m. at Chino Valley Equine Hospital for removal of a chip in his right front ankle. "I don't think it's a big deal," said Bernstein. "He came back from a cracked cannon bone which was worse than this." The Wicked North finished fourth as the 3-5 favorite in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup Sat. X-rays taken Sun. revealed the chip. Bernstein expects the five-year-old to be sidelined four to five months.

LURE BREEZES; SET FOR ENGLAND

Lure (Danzig), winner of the GI Caesar's International in his most recent try, breezed an easy half-mile at Belmont yesterday, going the distance in :49. "He galloped out a good five-eighths in 1:01," said Buzz Tenney, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey. "It was exactly what Shug was looking for--he did it just fine. I would guess he'll work a couple more times before he ships." The winner of the Breeders' Cup Mile for two years running will take on the Europeans in their own backyard this year, traveling to England for the July 27 GI £125,000 Sussex S. at a mile at Goodwood. Lure will fly to Woodbine on the night of July 21, then leave Toronto Friday night, July 22, on a flight for London's Heathrow Airport. "He's shipped well everywhere he's gone. He seems to thrive on it," said McGaughey, who will travel to England with jockey Mike Smith Sunday, July 24. "I hope to have him gallop over the track on Tuesday. The response to him coming has been very positive...they're really excited that we're coming over."

AS INDICATED OUT 'TIL FALL As Indicated (Czaravich) will not be ready for what was expected to be his next engagement, the Aug. 6 Saratoga Cup. Trainer Rick Schosberg said that the colt came out of his win in the Pimlico Special with a number of minor problems, including splint and stifle injuries. "It's nothing major, like broken bones," said Schosberg, "it's just that he outdid himself; he ran so hard that day. Things have been progressing slowly with him. He's back in training now, but we had to give him a little more time off than we wanted. Hopefully, we can still make the Woodward and the Jockey Club Gold Cup."

DELAHOUSSAYE TO UNDERGO SURGERY

Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye will undergo surgery Monday to correct the blocked nasal passage that has plagued him for the past several months. The rider will have two surgeries: a sinusotomy, which is a cleaning of the nasal passages, and a septoplasty, which will correct a deviated nasal septum. Delahoussaye said the sinusitis has caused him dizziness, dangerous drops in blood pressure and fatigue. "When you can't breathe through your nose, it affects your lungs," he said. "I'm happy that we're finally going to get this thing over with." The surgeries are expected to last between one and 1 1/2-hours; Delahoussaye could be back riding within a week.

PATTON PREPARES FOR LATE-SUMMER RETURN

Patton (Lord At War {ARG}), winner of three of five lifetime starts and second to Holy Bull (Great Above) in the Jan. 30 Hutcheson S., is training for a late-summer return to the races with trainer Sonny Hine at Monmouth. "He breezed :48 and change Wednesday," said Hine of the colt, who has been back in training for over two months since having chips removed from both knees after an 8 1/2-length allowance win Feb. 20 at Gulfstream. "According to the report, they were not weight-bearing chips, which is supposed to be good," said Hine. "They said at that time that we should give him three weeks in the stall and a couple of weeks of hand-walking. We elected to give him more time, and he's been in training since the end of April." Hine said that the colt's main objective is the Jerome H. Labor Day at Belmont, with a prep beforehand 'desirable' if he is ready in time.

CLEAN BILL OF HEALTH FOR BIEN BIEN

Bien Bien (Manila) tack-walked Thurs. at Hollywood and trainer Paco Gonzalez said a second set of X-rays also failed to reveal any fractures of the right front foot. Gonzalez said the heat that prompted the X-rays is gone. "He might have stepped on a stone," Gonzalez said. "That's all I can figure." The trainer added he planned to get a third set of X-rays and was going to remove the shoe and check for bruises.

PENCADER OUT FOR SEASON

Pencader (Caerleon), sixth in the Epsom Derby before finishing second to Foyer in Royal Ascot's King Edward VII S., has suffered an injury which seems set to keep him out of action for the rest of 1994. Owned by Robert Sangster and trained at Manton by Peter Chapple-Hyam, Pencader appears to have strained two tendons while competing in Tuesday's Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket. Chapple-Hyam said: "We'll know a lot more in three or four weeks, but it looks as if he's out for the season."

Stablemate **Road Rush** (Broad Brush) breezed an easy half-mile in :53 4/5. "He's always seems to go slow, he's not a big robust horse and doesn't really need a lot of work," said Vella. Canada's 1993 two-year-old champion **Comet Shine** (Fappiano) went three furlongs in :37 4/5 at Woodbine yesterday in his final Plate prep.
