"He is still on intravenous fluids and will remain under intensive care for some days yet," said stud director Justin Wadham. "While the veterinarians are pleased with his progress, optimism must remain cautious."

**LAKEWAY TO SARATOGA** Lakeway (Seattle Slew), winner of Sunday's Hollywood Oaks, will head next to either the \$200,000 Alabama S. for three-year-old fillies at Saratoga Aug. 13, or the \$750,000 Travers one week later, according to Marty Jones, son and assistant to trainer Gary Jones. Both races carry GI status and are run at 1 1/4 miles. The senior Jones is currently in Europe visiting clients.

**BEST PAL POINTS TO SAN DIEGO** Best Pal (Habitory) worked a mile in 1:37 3/5 yesterday at Hollywood for new trainer Dick Mandella. "He's doing real well," said Mandella of the 6-year-old gelding who has not raced since a 7th-place finish in the Feb. 13 San Antonio at Santa Anita. "We'll probably run him in the San Diego Handicap (July 30, 9 furlongs) at Del Mar."

**COLONEL COLLINS TO U.S.** Colonel Collins (El Gran Senor), who placed in the 2,000 Guineas as well as the Epsom and Irish Derbies this year for owner Robert Sangster, will be shipped to the California stable of Rodney Rash to prepare for a U.S. campaign. The colt will make his final European appearance in today's GII Prix Eugene Adam at Saint-Cloud. His first U.S. goal will be the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington Aug. 28. Owner Gary Tanaka purchased a majority interest in the colt, believed to be 75 percent, and said he will campaign the colt in the U.S. because "the racing there is year-round, the purses are bigger, and it tends to be less competitive." In '93, Tanaka purchased **Blues Traveller** (Bluebird), recent winner of the American H. at Hollywood. **User Friendly** (Slip Anchor), Europe's 1992 Horse of the Year whom Tanaka purchased in late 1993, will make her U.S. bow in Del Mar's Ramona H. **RANDY ROMERO RETIRES** Jockey Randy Romero has retired after a 20-year career as a jockey which gave him three Breeders' Cup wins, 3,823 total victories, and more than his share of injuries. "It's just a lot of wear and tear on all my bones," Romero, who has undergone 23 operations, told the Times-Picayune of New Orleans. Romero said he planned to become a bloodstock agent. A Louisiana native who won meeting titles at tracks from his home state to New York, Romero was notably plagued by misfortune. He suffered burns over 65 percent of his body in a fire at Oaklawn Park in 1983, broke a shoulder and eight ribs when Go For Wand broke down in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Distaff, and broke his left arm just above the elbow in a training accident in 1991.

**BRACHO APPEALS CANADA'S DECISION** The 1992 Eclipse Award-winning apprentice Jesus Bracho has asked the Ontario Racing Commission for a hearing on his request for a jockey's license in Canada. His application for a license to ride in Canada was recently denied. The hearing is scheduled for July 20. Bracho was suspended for 60 days in October, 1993 by the Calder stewards, who felt he had lied on his apprentice application. The Calder stewards said at the time of his hearing that Bracho had amassed more wins and had competed longer than he claimed on the application. In addition to the 60 days, the stewards recommended a lifetime suspension for the 26-year-old Venezuelan native to the Florida State Racing & Wagering Board. The State of Florida has not ruled on the lifetime suspension while it waits for the case to go through the appeals process.
