### SURGERY FOR BALANCHINE

**Balanchine** (Storm Bird), winner of the Epsom Oaks and Irish Derby this season, underwent surgery Wednesday night to relieve an obstruction in her small intestine. Simon Crisford, who manages Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin Racing team from its base at Newmarket's Dalham Hall Stud, said: "Balanchine is receiving intensive post-operative treatment. Her progress so far is satisfactory, but constant monitoring of her condition will hopefully determine a favorable outcome." A spokeswoman for the stud added, "It has come about as the most terrible shock and we have not even thought about the filly's future racing career at this stage. The only thing concerning us at present is her health and, until she has fully recovered, no decision can possibly be taken about a return to racing."

### GOVERNOR CUOMO AT BELMONT PARK

**TODAY** Governor Mario Cuomo will be at the Belmont Park paddock at noon today for a ceremonial signing of the Omnibus Racing Bill, as well as the Program Bill which is aimed at reforming the structure and administration of New York's Thoroughbred breeding and incentive program. Program Bill #315 will eliminate the breed-back rule for full-time resident mares; foals born in the state will be qualified as New York-breds as long as their dams meet residency requirements, regardless of where the stallion they are bred back to stands. The bill will also expand the Board of the New York State Breeding and Development Fund Corp. from five members to 11, appointing six New York breeders to the Board. "We got more than we expected; I think we did very well," said Bill Corbellini, executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, Inc. "We'll get the opportunity to have input from the breeders, to have their ideas heard and acted upon."

**BELMONT FALL SCHEDULE SET** Thirty-eight stakes worth \$6.4 million will be run at Belmont's 40-day Fall Championship meeting, which will offer 14 Grade I stakes, the highest concentration of any New York meet. The highlights: Super Saturday, comprised of six Grade I's and total stakes purses of \$1.5 million featuring the \$500,000 Woodward at 1 1/8 miles will be held Sept. 17. Breeders' Cup Preview Day October 8 will feature the \$750,000 Jockey Club Gold Cup at 1 1/4 miles for older horses as well as four other Grade I stakes. Three turf stakes have been added to the fall schedule--the Sept. 3 Belmont Breeders' Cup H. (formerly run at Saratoga), the Sept. 18 Jamaica H., moved to the grass, and the Oct 1 Rare Perfume, also run on the turf for the first time. Two juvenile races, the Futurity and Matron, will be increased to a mile from seven furlongs and the Champagne and Frizette will be run at 1 1/16th miles.
