STROLLING ALONG RETIRED *Strolling Along* (Danzig), a graded stakes winner in each of his three racing seasons, has been retired due to a minor injury. The four-year-old was on the board in 12 of 19 career starts for earnings of \$450,852; he won the GI Futurity at Belmont at seven furlongs on the dirt at two, the GIII Lawrence Realization at a mile and a half on the grass at three, and the GI Gulfstream Park Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. at a mile and a quarter on the dirt at four. Campaigned by his breeder, Ogden Phipps, *Strolling Along* was purchased late last year by a group headed by Richard Golden, George Strawbridge and George Harris; it has not yet been determined where he will stand stud.

EXPANDED SARATOGA MEET OPENS

FRIDAY Saratoga Race Course's expanded 1994 meet opens Friday, July 22 for 34 days of racing featuring 34 stakes races. There will be 10 Grade I events including the highlight of the meeting, the \$750,000 Travers S. for three-year-olds August 20, which could feature three of the top three-year-olds in the country: Holy Bull, Tabasco Cat, and the reigning queen of the distaff set, Lakeway. Making its New York debut at Saratoga will be the new Autotote Probe system, a self-serve mutuel machine with clearer graphics which can be converted to teller operation. During the meet there will be seven days with nine live races and a simulcast stakes; 16 days with 10 live races; and 11 days with nine live races. The first race every Wednesday and Thursday will be a steeplechase, followed by nine live flat races. Tuesdays are dark, and first post at Saratoga will be 1:00 p.m.

In a relatively short period of time, the De Francis Dash has become the definitive summer sprint, bringing together horses from coast to coast, and three-year-olds to try their elders. Add to that allowance conditions which create a wide spread in the weights, and you have a true handicapping challenge.

Blushing Julian (Mt. Livermore) ran a huge figure at Laurel in February, earning a big check in the GI General George S., but he has also earned a weight assignment that makes it almost impossible to win here. **Never Wavering** (Wavering Monarch) has won his last three, but would have to run considerably faster than he ever has before to make it four.

This one probably comes down to **Cherokee Run** (Runaway Groom) and **You and I** (Kris S.). Cherokee Run has become a machine, cranking out good figures in all his starts this year; since he hasn't won a stakes in over a year, he also gets a big break in the weights. You and I, who looked like he might be the best two-year-old in the country last year, tailed off badly this spring before returning with a huge performance Belmont Day in the Riva Ridge S.

It's always dangerous to play a horse right after the best effort of his life, but You and I may be able to bounce a little and still win, and he should be a bigger price than Cherokee Run. 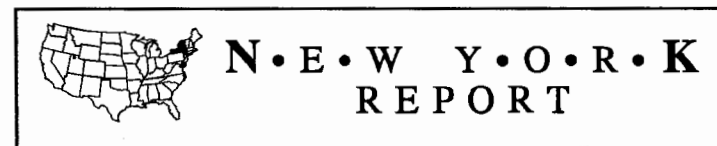

PHILADELPHIA PARK VP RESIGNS Paul

Jenkins, vice president of racing and racing secretary of Philadelphia Park, has resigned, citing the track's year-round racing schedule, which he said has taken "a great toll, both mentally and physically." Track General Manager Don Johnson will serve as acting racing secretary until a replacement can be found. Philadelphia Park has maintained a 12-month racing schedule for the past four years, but will close from August 8 through August 25 for general repairs to the facility: a \$200,000 track resurfacing and \$250,000 of backstretch improvements.
