KEENELAND SALES CONCLUDE The two-day Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale concluded Tuesday night with a sale-topping bay filly by Mr. Prospector out of 1988 champion three-year-old filly and Kentucky Derby winner Winning Colors bringing \$1,050,000 from H. Nakamura/Pegasus Bloodstock. The lone seven-figure yearling to pass through the ring, the filly was consigned by Gainesway Farm, agent for Gainesway Thoroughbreds Ltd. Gainesway also consigned the sale-topping colt by Forty Niner out of Gana Facil, a half-brother to Unbridled which attracted the high bid of \$900,000 during Monday's evening session. Overall, the median average for the sale rose 14.2% to \$180,000. The average price was off less than one percent, down to \$233,325. Over the two days, 194 head sold for a gross amount of \$45,265,000. Last year, 208 head passed through the ring for a gross of \$48,970,000. At Tuesday's afternoon session, a bay colt by Danzig out of champion older mare Queenina (Mr. Prospector), brought a high bid of \$500,000 from Gainesway. The colt was consigned by King Ranch Farm, agent. Tuesday evening's high-priced colt was a grey/roan colt by Pleasant Colony out of Minstrella, consigned by Lane's End Farm, agent for Spring Hill Farm, and purchased by D. Wayne Lukas for \$750,000. The two Tuesday sessions saw 89 head pass through the ring for a gross of \$20,995,000. The average price of \$235,899 was down 8.3% from last year.

Friday, Saratoga:

SCHUYLERVILLE S.-GII, \$100,000a, 2yo, f, 6f
The traditional Saratoga opening day stakes event will be highlighted by the presence of Ward C. Pitfield's **Unacceptable** (Irish Tower), winner of her two career starts, including a 6 3/4-length victory in the GIII Astoria Breeders' Cup S. at Belmont June 22. "She's doing real well," said trainer Phil Hauswald. "She shipped back to Louisville after that race and had a couple of good breezes there. She arrived here (Saratoga) last Friday. She's in good shape and will blow out Thursday morning." Hauswald seems optimistic about his filly's chances in the Schuylerville, which is a half-furlong longer than the Astoria. "Whenever you stretch out a young horse, you wonder if she will continue to carry her speed out. In both her two races horses have come to her and she continued to run away from them, so I think she'll carry on. I couldn't be asking her to do any better right now." The 10-horse-field will include, in post-position order: **Unacceptable**; **Clever Thing** (On to Glory), **Susan's Choice** (Storm Cat), **Changing Ways** (Time for a Change), **Phone Bird** (Phone Trick), **Pinpoint Control** (Cryptoclearance), **Pretty Discreet** (Private Account), **Petrouchka** (Red Ransom), **Twist a Lime** (Copelan) and **Artic Experience** (Slewpy).

SANFORD S.-GIII, \$100,000a, 2yo, 6f

The 81st running of the Sanford S. will join the Schuylerville on Saratoga's opening day card; the race will feature budding star **De Niro** (Gulch). In his last start, the Allen Jerkens trainee unleashed a powerful run in the stretch to take the GIII Tremont Breeders' Cup after spotting the field numerous lengths at the start. "He hit the side of the gate," said Jerkens. "He came from way out of it and beat some nice horses. It's always good to have a horse that can run the last part of the race." Six juveniles have been entered. They are, from the rail out: **Fritch** (Demons Begone), **Boone's Mill** (Carson City), **Northern Centaur** (Centauress), **De Niro**, **Criminal Bundle** (Criminal Type), **Montreal Red** (D'Accord).

LURE'S OVERSEAS TRIP CANCELLED

England's Ministry of Agriculture has denied Lure (Danzig) a waiver to enter England to compete in the July 27 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood; the five-year-old had been scheduled to leave New York Thurs. for London. Lure was vaccinated against EVA (Equine Viral Arteritis) in August of last year before competing in the Arlington Million. The vaccination causes him to test positive for EVA. Horses found positive for the virus are prohibited from entering England, and English regulations do not currently provide a waiver for those testing positive as a result of being vaccinated. "(Trainer) Shug (McGaughey) had made all the shipping plans, and I was under the impression that everything was okay and so was he," said Seth Hancock, president of Claiborne Farm, Lure's owner. "On Friday we received a fax stating that because he had positive blood, he would not be allowed in the country. I'm disappointed, but I have a hard enough time running Claiborne Farm. I can't be worried about what they're doing in England." Hancock said Lure will "probably" run next in the \$100,000 Bernard Baruch at 1 1/8 miles over the Saratoga turf August 12. According to the NYRA Racing Office, **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {FR}) is also pointing to the race. After the Bernard Baruch, plans call for Lure to be rested until the Kelso H. on Belmont's Breeders' Cup Preview Day in October, to be followed by an unprecedented bid for his third straight Breeders' Cup victory in the Mile at Churchill Downs November 5.

ANDERSON PARK REFILES OTB

APPLICATION FOR MERRILLVILLE Officials of Anderson Park Inc., which is wholly owned by Churchill Downs Management Company, yesterday refiled an application to operate an OTB facility in Merrillville, Indiana, according to Anderson Park President Jeffrey Smith. "We refiled our Merrillville application because of the positive impact that facility could have on live racing in Indiana," Smith said. The new Merrillville application contemplates thoroughbred and mixed breed racing in 1995 at Hoosier Park racetrack. It also guarantees that five percent of handle on out-of-state races imported to the satellite facility will go toward horsemen's purses. Hoosier Park, located in Anderson, is scheduled to open Sept. 1. The track will conduct a 55-day standardbred meet this year.

NATIONAL BEST SEVEN PRODUCES RE-

CORD HANDLE Saturday's 50-cent National Best Seven wager generated a handle of \$672,084.50, a record for its eight-week existence. The handle, which was taken from more than 75 participating outlets, was nearly \$300,000 higher than the National Best Seven's previous record handle and represented over 1.2 million individual wagers.

HALL WINS DOMINION AWARD: Howard Hall, known as "Gelo" to his many friends around the racetrack, has been selected as the recipient of the second annual Dogwood Dominion Award, given each year to an unsung hero in the racing industry. Hall, who has been involved in racing for 50 years and has held nearly every job there is around the racetrack, is currently a placing judge at Laurel and Pimlico. Hall has befriended virtually everyone he has come across in his many years in the sport and is one of those rare people who gets along with everyone. "He has been a general goodwill ambassador in racing," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "Because of the extraordinary number of lives he has affected in the industry, he is surely one of the most popular people ever to be on the racetrack." Hall will receive a cash award of \$5,000 and a bronze sculpture of the race horse Dominion at a luncheon in Saratoga Aug. 10. In case you were wondering, the name "Gelo" has nothing to do with a dessert. It is short for "Angelo," the name of of Hall's older brother. Thus he was Little Angelo, later shortened to "Gelo."
