FASIG-TIPTON SALES RESULTS A bay colt by Affirmed--Au Printemps (Dancing Champ) topped the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Selected Yearling Sale in Lexington yesterday. The colt, a full brother to Champion Canadian Grass Horse Charlie Barley and a half to Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Success Express (Hold Your Peace), was consigned to the sale by Highclere (Jeffrey Morris), Agent for Tri Star Stable, and purchased by Anthony Penfold for \$170,000. Anthony Penfold, as agent, also bought the second highest-priced yearling at \$140,000, a dark bay or brown colt by Roanoke--Miss Cabell Co. (Junction) who was featured in the sale's New Sire Showcase. A half-brother to two stakes winners, the colt was consigned to the sale by Brereton C. Jones, agent. Overall, 180 head were sold for a gross of \$5,645,000, versus 144 sold for a total of \$4,550,500 in 1993. The sales average of \$31,361 indicated a stable market, as it was down only 0.8 percent from last year's average of \$31,601.

DELAHOUSSAYE OFF UNTIL DEL MAR Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye will take off the final six days of the Hollywood Park meeting and resume riding when Del Mar opens July 27, on the advice of his doctor. "I saw him (Dr. Glenn Weissmann) on Monday and he advised me to take the rest of this meet off," said Delahoussaye Wed. morning. The jockey, who had been troubled by sinusitis the past few months, underwent surgery June 11 to correct the problem. "It's coming along good and I'm feeling a lot better," Delahoussaye continued. "My sinuses are still draining, which is normal, and I'm healing slowly, but the doctor said it's not slower than normal. But I don't want to take any chances on coming back too soon after having the operation. I'm doing some light activity and I plan to work a couple horses tomorrow (Thursday)."

TEST S.-GI, \$150,000, 3yo, f, 7f

Penny's Reshoot (Turkey Shoot), winner of her last three starts including the Gil Prioress S. at Belmont June 18, worked four furlongs Mon. at Belmont in a bullet :46 4/5. "She's doing absolutely perfect," said trainer John DeStefano. "This filly has really improved since the Prioress. I'd like to see her win the Test for her new owner, Sidney Port. He bought half of the filly after she won the Prioress, so this race will be the first time she runs for him." Shug McGaughey trainee **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), second in the Prioress after a three-month layoff, will try to turn the tables on Penny's Reshoot. "Heavenly Prize has been in Saratoga since last Wed. because we wanted to get her settled in early," said Buzz Tenney, assistant to McGaughey. "She worked five-eighths up there on Saturday, but she wasn't clocked. She is said to have breezed good and she cooled out just fine. She's training good and we expect a real good run from her in the Test." The field, in post position order, is as follows: **Miss Bid Flash** (Horse Flash {FR}), **Heavenly Prize**, **Miss Ra He Ra** (Rahy), **Saxuality** (Dynaformer), **Night and Dreams** (Fappiano), **Penny's Reshoot**, **Strategic Maneuver** (Cryptoclearance), **Twist Afleet** (Afleet).

VANITY H.-GI, \$300,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 9f

Wayne Hughes' **Trishyde** (Nureyev) will miss the Vanity due to an injury to a splint bone in her left foreleg, trainer George Vogel said Wed. Vogel doesn't believe the injury is serious, but he wants to review another set of X-rays before going on with the mare. "We need to make sure there isn't a crack (in the bone)," he said. Vogel said Hughes' **Wendy's Daughter** (Halo), assigned 112 pounds, will start in place of Trishyde. **Southern Truce** (Truce Maker) worked seven furlongs Mon. in 1:24 2/5 at Hollywood in preparation for the race; she will carry 115 pounds and be ridden by Gary Stevens. **Golden Klair** (GB) (Damister), winner of this year's Gil A Gleam H. and Gil Hawthorne H., both at Hollywood, went five furlongs in 1:03 2/5 at Santa Anita yesterday morning. The other confirmed starters are **Andestine** (Native Prospector), 117 pounds; **Exchange** (Explodent), 118; **Mz. Zill Bear** (Salutely), 114 and **Potridee** (ARG) (Potrillazo {ARG}), 114.

BRACHO DENIED CANADIAN LICENCE

Frank Drey, President of the Ontario Racing Commission, said jockey Jesus Bracho was denied a jockey's license by his commission yesterday. "We feel his matter with the state of Florida should be cleared up before we can grant him a license," said Drey. "We also feel it is incumbent on the state of Florida to take care of their own matters and not pass them on to another racing district." Bracho, the 1992 Eclipse Award-winning apprentice jockey, was suspended by the stewards at Calder Race Course for falsifying data on his apprentice application.
