VIRUS OUTBREAK IN IRELAND Studs in County Kildare, one of Ireland's main breeding areas, are under curfew after an outbreak of equine herpes virus (EHV1). The Irish Ministry of Agriculture has advised owners to take precautions by vaccination against the killer disease and the Irish Equine Centre is now unable to cope with the number of swab tests it is being asked to carry out. Leading stud managers are blaming the outbreak, already responsible for the deaths of at least four horses, on the effects of European unification. There are no restrictions on the movement of horses within the European Community and no quarantine. Hubie de Burgh, of Hamdan Al Maktoum's Derristown Stud, said, "We are mere pawns in the middle of a chess game. We can take precautions but the damage is done before it gets to us. Brussels (where the EC rules are made) is not being strict enough about the movement of horses."

KING'S THEATRE HEADS TO YORK; ERHAAB IS RESTED King's Theatre (IRE) (Sadler's Wells), hero of Sat.'s King George and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S., looks set to reappear in York's Juddmonte Int'l. Aug. 16. The three-year-old, who, like the rest of the field, had to overcome the eccentric passage of a riderless Ezzoud (IRE) (Last Tycoon {IRE}), came out of the G1 event "terribly well" according to trainer Henry Cecil. The Newmarket handler added, "We may go to the Juddmonte next. Then I will give him a rest and bring him back in the autumn for the Champion S. and the Arc." The latter two races are still possible targets for Epsom Derby winner Erhaab (Chief's Crown), whose collision with Ezzoud two furlongs from home Sat. left him with a knee injury which will take time to heal. John Dunlop, trainer of Erhaab, said, "He must have got a fair old bang, there is bruising and a small wound on the outside of his near knee. He will be rested now before we prepare him for the autumn."

Sunday, Saratoga

JIM DANDY S.-GII, \$125,000a, 3yo, 9f

Preakness and Belmont S. winner **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) is expected to arrive at Saratoga this morning, according to Todd Pletcher, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He's been training fine out in California," Pletcher said. "Wayne will be coming with the horse. He'll probably work once here at Saratoga before he runs in the race." Trainer John Campo Jr. reports that the Jim Dandy is the next stop for **Pleasant Dancer** (Pleasant Colony). "We're pointing for it," said Campo. "Everything is going well with him. He's got the breeding to run all day, and still have that kick at the end. I know that Tabasco Cat is the horse to beat, but he has to speak for himself. We're going to take a shot and hope for the best." With a small field expected, trainer Bill Mott is considering sending out Colin S. winner **Bay Street Star** (Silver Buck). Scotty Schulhofer, trainer of Jim Dandy nominees **Signal Tap** (Fappiano) and **Unaccounted For** (Private Account), said he is unlikely to be saddling a horse in the Jim Dandy. "I doubt very seriously if either one will run," Schulhofer said. "I'll find an allowance race for them."

Saturday, Saratoga

SWORD DANCER H.-GI, \$250,000, 3yo/up, 12fT

Trainer Bill Mott will saddle **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}), who won this event in 1992. "He'll blow out before the race," said Mott. "He had most of his work down at Belmont, but he'll work one more time." **Turk Passer** (Turkoman), who upset the July 2 GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont at odds of 31-1, will try for his second stakes victory. "We're all set; we've got our fingers crossed," said trainer Tony Margotta. "Sometimes you look at the board and say maybe I'm crazy, but we're not the type of outfit who goes in those races just to run. He's never done better than he is right now; he's peaking. This is where all the work pays off." **Royal Mountain Inn** (Vigors), a GII winner who took an allowance at Belmont in his last, is a possible starter. "We're thinking about the Sword Dancer, but we're not definite," said Ruth Hargreaves, assistant to trainer Barclay Tagg. "We were looking for an allowance race for him, but there are none in the first condition book for him. Maybe there will be one in the second book."

MISS INDY ANNA RETIRED Miss Indy Anna (Apalachee), a four-year-old filly with seven wins and three seconds from just 10 career starts and earnings of \$349,175, has been retired due to chips in her knee, owner Charlie Matses announced yesterday. The MGSW was second, beaten a head, in the GI Test last year; in her last race, she finished second to Classy Mirage in a Belmont allowance race July 13. Trained by Ned Allard, the filly was favored in each of her career starts. "I've had the good fortune of racing a very exciting filly and I don't want to compromise her ability by taking unnecessary chances," said Matses. "I'll examine all of my options for her new career as a broodmare before making any decisions.

LAUREL POSTS SLIGHT GAIN FOR '94 SUMMER MEET; PIMLICO OPENS TODAY

With the help of a strong handle on De Francis Dash Day and Memorial Day weekend, Laurel Race Course posted a slight half-percent increase in total handle for its 30-day summer meet, which ended Sunday. Although marginal, the improvement is considered significant after the loss of several races due to severe weather, and considering the oppressive summer heat and a change in the simulcast schedule. Last year, Laurel offered simulcast wagering on racing from New York and California; this year, with the exception of three racing days from Saratoga, those signals were not taken. "Considering the weather and the revision in our simulcasting policy, the increase is indeed of significance," said Maryland Jockey Club President Joe De Francis. "More important, the momentum is continuing forward. The results, so far, are extremely encouraging." The Laurel Summer Meet marks the third consecutive increase in handle this year at a Maryland Jockey Club meeting. Jockey Mark Johnston edged Edgar Prado to take the Laurel riding title with 38 wins, while King Leatherbury led the trainers with 15. Conditioner Richard Small was the meet's leading stakes winner with two. Racing moves to Pimlico today for a 38-day meet. The Pimlico Summer Stakes schedule consists of 13 races worth more than \$900,000.

HOOSIER PARK REQUESTS 1995 THOROUGHBRED DATES

The owners of Hoosier Park, Indiana's first parimutuel racetrack which is set to open September 1 for a 55-day harness meet, have requested dates to conduct Thoroughbred racing in 1995. The request was made by officials of the track's parent company, Anderson Park, Inc., which is wholly owned by Churchill Downs Management Company. The application, filed with the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, asks for a 42-day Thoroughbred meet from Labor Day weekend through early November.
