IRISH VIRUS OUTBREAK UNDER CONTROL

According to Dr. Ann Cullinane, head of the virology unit of the Irish Equine Centre, the recent outbreak of the neurological form of the equine herpes virus is under control. "It has been contained," said Cullinane. "The virus has only been found on seven premises, and only 14 or 15 horses have shown clinical signs of the disease. Of the seven premises affected, only two are public stud farms; three are private studs with, I would say, less than 20 horses, one is a riding school and one a farm with just one mare and foal." Cullinane added that while there is no official quarantine, the farms involved have acted responsibly and voluntarily to restrict movement of their horses until the premises are cleared of the virus. "I would say the outbreak is winding down, and two premises should soon get the all-clear. We've been really lucky in this country; we have been remarkably free of this form of the disease for the last 10 years. We had only one case last year, and there have been years with no cases at all. Outbreaks occur irregularly, but the virus is endemic to every major horse population, and there have been outbreaks in France, Germany, the United Kingdom and South Africa this year."

LESTER PIGGOTT AVOIDS INJURY AFTER SCARE AT GOODWOOD

Jockey Lester Piggott escaped serious injury yesterday when he fell from his mount, Coffee N' Cream, in the Ralph Hubbard Nursery H. at Goodwood Racecourse. The spill came after the 58-year-old rider's saddle slipped; the head-first fall caused his helmet to come loose. Piggott was sent to St. Richards Hospital but a hospital spokesman said England's 11-time champion jockey suffered no serious injuries and would be kept overnight for observation only.

Sea Hero (Polish Navy), second in the 11-furlong Bowling Green H. last time out, stretches out another eighth looking for his first stakes win of the year. "He's run well on the turf; he has been consistent," said trainer MacK. Miller. "I think he can handle the distance, but soft turf? I'm not qualified to say. He's never run on it, but I think he'll handle it. He's a much more mature horse now, both physically and mentally. His mind is much stronger now." Highweight **Fraise** (Strawberry Road {AUST}) finished third behind Sea Hero in the Bowling Green in his last. The six-year-old performs well over a yielding turf course, as he showed last December in taking the GI Hollywood Turf Cup.

Tabasco Cat (Storm Cat), off since a victory in the June 11 Belmont S. will face a short field. As of Thursday, only two other starters had been confirmed. They are **Bay Street Star** (Silver Buck), winner of the G3 Colin S. at Belmont June 11 and third behind Holy Bull in the Dwyer in his last outing, and **Pleasant Dancer** (Pleasant Colony), whose lone win came in a maiden race at Aqueduct last November. Tabasco Cat returns to the races ready to run, said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He went up to my training center (in central California), which we think is a state-of-the-art facility. He took a little bit of time off, but we started him back in training July 7."

CHRB APPROVES OWNER AND TRAINER ORGANIZATIONS

The California Horse Racing Board responded Thursday to the mandate of a new state law by selecting the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) as the organization to represent owners in California and naming the California Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (CHBPA) to represent trainers, beginning next year. The CHBPA will continue to represent both owners and trainers until the end of the year, but AB 991 requires that as of Jan. 1, 1995, there shall be separate organizations representing thoroughbred owners and trainers. The statute also dictates that the percentage of purse money that currently goes entirely to the CHBPA will be distributed differently with two-thirds of that money going to the owners' organization and one-third to the trainers' organization. The TOC projects net revenue of \$777,777 per year while the CHBPA anticipates revenue of about \$420,000 from purses and another \$320,000 from recreation hall proceeds.

LAKEWAY BREEZES FOR ALABAMA

Lakeway (Seattle Slew) went five-eighths of a mile in :59 3/5 at Hollywood Wednesday, and despite a change in travel plans, is still scheduled to head east for the Alabama August 13. "I don't know right now how or when we're going to get there, but we're still planning to be there," said trainer Gary Jones. "The shipping company we deal with said they were sending a load on the second, and I've just found out they were talking about September 2." The three-year-old will work again August 1, and Jones said he hopes to have confirmed travel plans by then. Lakeway will face **Sovereign Kitty** (Sovereign Dancer), winner of a Saratoga allowance Wednesday, in the Alabama. Said her trainer, Rick Schosberg, "She looks good; she's bouncing around this morning. We're going to take a look and see what the big mare (Lakeway) does. If she's coming and she's 100 percent, we're all running for second money."

FIRST-NIGHT RESULTS OF FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA TWO-YEAR-OLD SALE

A total of 33 two-year-olds were sold during the first session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Two-Year-Old in Training Sale, which began Wednesday night, July 27, and concluded last night. Gross for the first session was \$1,186,000 for an average of \$35,939. The sales topper was a filly by Sadler's Wells out of 'N Everything Nice, a daughter of the top-class broodmare Sweet Tooth; the half-sister to stakes-placed I Like Secrets, who was consigned by Niall Brennan, agent, sold for \$130,000 to Burk Kessinger, Jr., agent.

JOHN FRANKS TO HOLD REDUCTION AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

Louisiana oilman John Franks, a dominant force in American racing and breeding for the past decade, will begin a major reduction of his large Thoroughbred inventory at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's Fall Mixed Sale in Lexington Friday, Nov. 4. Franks enjoyed his finest campaign as an owner and breeder in 1993, earning a third Eclipse Award as leading owner and topping the money won standings as a breeder for the first time. "It's time to cut the numbers down," said Franks. "My main enjoyment comes from racing. In the beginning it was more exciting to win with a homebred, but I can't honestly say that is the case anymore. There are too many headaches managing the number of horses that I've accumulated. My goal is to keep enough mares to supply a racing stable of 30 to 40 quality horses, or less." Franks has led the national money won list four times, and six times won more races than any other owner. He has been the leading American breeder in races won the last six years with the produce of a broodmare band that now numbers more than 300.

JOCKEY CLUB REQUIRES DNA-TYPING FOR STALLIONS

The Jockey Club announced yesterday that DNA-typing of 1994 covering stallions will be a requirement before 1994 Service Certificates are issued and no foals from mares covered by these stallions will be allowed registration until all DNA requirements have been completed. The announcement paves the way for the planned implementation of DNA-based parentage verification to replace blood-typing as a requirement for the registration of all North American Thoroughbred foals of 1995 and thereafter.

The victory marked only the 2nd in a stakes for trainer John Shirreffs. "Yes, the Pacific Classic (\$1,000,000 at 1 1/4-miles on the dirt, Aug. 13) is next," Shirreffs said. "That's what it is all about. You can count us in there."
