NEW SCARE FOR BALANCHINE Balanchine (Storm Bird), winner of the Epsom Oaks and Irish Derby, is involved in another sickness scare. The three-year-old filly, who underwent surgery for an intestinal obstruction three weeks ago, was being treated Tuesday night following further signs of colic. However, Godolphin Manager Simon Crisford said, "She responded quickly to treatment and is now back home from the vet's in Newmarket." Balanchine's connections intend to put her back under tack in mid-October and assess her future after a month. Then, if it is believed she she should resume serious training, she will be shipped to Dubai for the winter. Were she to race in Britain in 1995, she will be one of 20 horses to carry advertisements on their silks. The Maktoum string has obtained backing from Emirates Airlines and will be the first major ownership team to enter this style of sponsorship under recently introduced British Horseracing Board regulations. Godolphin's association with the airline begins this week when Cezanne, winner last out in York's Magnet Cup, carries the flight-company's logo in the Group 3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock.

JOCKEYS' GUILD CALLS FOR NEW FUNDING The Jockeys' Guild has issued a formal proposal to the TRA recommending that jockeys' insurance be funded by one tenth of one percent of the total Triple Crown handle. The Jockeys' Guild insurance fund, which provides health coverage to Guild members, was only paid about \$1,500 from a 1994 Triple Crown betting handle that exceeded \$100 million, according to a statement released yesterday by John Giovanni, national manager of Jockeys' Guild, Inc. The \$1,500 represents \$5.75 paid to the fund for each of 261 starting horses on days the events were run. The \$5.75 flat fee is stipulated in the current contract between Jockeys' Guild, Inc. and the TRA as compensation for media rights of Jockeys' Guild members. "Without these media rights, Churchill Downs, Pimlico and Belmont would not be able to participate in the simulcast agreements that make these huge revenues possible," said Giovanni. "Surely the jockeys' insurance fund, which last year ran a deficit of almost \$800,000, deserves fair payment, something beyond the thousandth of a percent the fund received last year."

EDDIE READ H.-GI, \$300,000a, 3yo/up, 9f
Inner City (IRE) (Bob Back), a MSW in both England and Italy, breezed five furlongs over the Del Mar turf yesterday morning in 1:01 4/5 for trainer Gary Jones. In his North American debut June 29, the five-year-old won a turf allowance at Hollywood by a length.

SORORITY S.-GIII, \$200,000, 2yo, f, 6f
Trainer D. Wayne Lukas reports that **Cat Appeal** (Storm Cat), who broke her maiden by 9 1/4 in her first try at Saratoga July 23, is training well. "I'm leaning towards running her in the Sorority S. for two reasons, the distance and the purse," Lukas said. **Fort Pond** (Fortunate Prospect) ran a close fourth in the July 24 Colleen S. at Monmouth in her last start, and trainer Sonny Hine feels she has plenty of reasons to move forward. "She ran fairly good for fourth, and just got beat a picture for third," said Hine yesterday. "She lost ground and hadn't run in a period of time. They found blood in her trachea so she'll run on Lasix this time. We breezed her this morning a quarter, they caught her pulling up in :35 2/5. I was pretty pleased, and she scoped clean after the work." Scotty Shulhofer trainee **Stormy Blues** (Cure the Blues) will be the likely favorite; the filly galloped to a 16-length maiden victory at Belmont July 1 in her only start. Also probable for the Sorority are **Risk The House** (Prospectors Gamble), **A Real Eye Opener** (Cutlass), **The Administrator** (Afleet) and **Impassion** (Shadeed).

LAKEWAY TO ARRIVE AT SPA SATURDAY

After some initial travel confusion, **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) is scheduled to arrive in Saratoga this Saturday to begin preparations for the Aug. 13 GI Alabama S. The winner of the Hollywood Oaks in stakes record time (1:46 4/5) in her last start, Lakeway will work either six or seven furlongs Monday at Saratoga. The three-year-old filly returned home with the GI Mother Goose S. trophy from her last New York venture.

SARDULA POINTS TO DEL MAR OAKS

Mr. and Mrs. J.S. Moss' Sardula (Storm Cat), winner of six of her nine lifetime starts for earnings of \$878,085, will make her next trip to the post in the GI Del Mar Oaks August 21, according to trainer Brian Mayberry. The MGI-winning filly got a feel for the Del Mar surface when she breezed a half-mile in :49 1/5 last Thursday morning. "She has a fondness for Del Mar; she loves the atmosphere," said Mayberry. Sardula is currently two-for-two at the seaside track, as she broke her maiden there last summer by 10 lengths before taking the GII Del Mar Debutante S.

JUVENILE FILLY STARS ON COURSE FOR

REMATCH Mark Blakey, assistant to trainer Phil Hauswald, confirmed yesterday that GIII Astoria Breeders' Cup winner **Unacceptable** (Irish Tower) will skip the GI Adirondack for two-year-old fillies August 10 at Saratoga. "Mr. Hauswald wants to wait until the end of the meet and run her in the Spinaway," said Blakey. "She's doing real good right now, and she'll work during the beginning of next week." In her last outing, Unacceptable finished second as the odds-on choice to **Changing Ways** (Time for a Change) in Saratoga's opening day feature, the GII Schuylerville. Meanwhile, trainer Roger Attfield reported that Changing Ways may also skip the Adirondack in favor of the Aug. 29 GI Spinaway. "She definitely will run in the Spinaway," said Attfield. "That's the race we're heading her towards." Attfield's charge is scheduled for light work in the next few weeks. "She'll just have an easy schedule," he said. "She's so aggressive anyway."

SILVER MUSIC TO PACIFIC CLASSIC

Trainer Wallace Dollase said Lauren Cohen's three-year-old colt **Silver Music** (Silver Ghost) will be supplemented for \$30,000 to the \$1,000,000 Pacific Classic scheduled for August 13 at Del Mar. Dollase made the decision yesterday morning after he was pleased by the gray colt's five-eighths breeze (1:01 3/5) with jockey Chris Antley aboard. Silver Music scored the biggest win of his career last out when he captured the GI Swaps S. by four lengths. The Swaps, run July 23 at Hollywood, was contested over the same 10-furlong distance as the GI Pacific Classic.

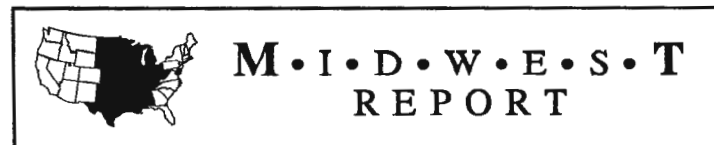
