CROLL, CAUTHEN IN HALL OF FAME

"To be inducted in Racing's Hall of Fame is the greatest honor a trainer could receive," said Warren "Jimmy" Croll yesterday during his speech at the Hall of Fame inductions in Saratoga Springs, NY. "When I was told about this at Churchill Downs this spring, I actually cried. I'm especially grateful for all the wonderful people I've met throughout my career, people I call my friends. I know without their help and work, I could not be here today. From the bottom of my heart, I say thank you." Jockey Steve Cauthen also spoke, saying, "My riding career was very exciting, but being elected to the Hall of Fame has crowned my career as a jockey, and I'd like to thank the fans, who made me feel as if I was doing something important. I have received many, many awards in my career, but because this comes from the people in my industry, it is special." Elliott Burch, who trained inductee Arts and Letters, told the crowd on the Hall of Fame's lawn, "He was the best horse I ever trained, and I trained a lot of good ones. When the chips were down, he was always there."

DREA TO LEAVE CANADIAN RACING According to a report in Sunday's edition of the Toronto Star, Frank Drea, the most powerful individual in Canadian horseracing, will lose his job as chairman of the Ontario Racing Commission next month when he comes up for what was expected to be automatic reappointment. Drea has held office since 1985, wielding vast influence in Canada and throughout North America. It is expected that Vice Charman Henry Addison will take over for the time being, but the provincial cabinet minister, Marilyn Churley of Consumer and Commercial Relations, plans to name a permanent successor early in 1995. One candidate's name that has surfaced prominently already is Norman "Pete" Hardy, honorary chairman of the Toronto Bluejays baseball team, who headed the commission in the early 1980's. Drea, an Ontario Cabinet Minister in a progressive-Conservative government was named to the Ontario Racing Commission Chairmanship in 1985 by then Premier David Peterson, a Liberal. Drea's tenure was extended once by Bob Rae's NDP Regime, but the decision now apparently is to replace him. The Toronto Star story had no comment or attribution from Drea.

Saturday, Del Mar

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 10f
Bertrando (Skywalker), last year's wire-to-wire winner of the Pacific Classic, had his last major drill for Saturday's event yesterday. The five-year-old horse breezed seven furlongs under jockey Patrick Valenzuela, going in a steady 1:26 2/5. Co-owner Ed Nahem felt confident after the work, pointing out the easy nature of the exercise. "He jumped right down on the rail with Pat," said Nahem. "We'll step on the pedal Saturday, not today." **Stuka** (Jade Hunter), who went seven furlongs Sunday in 1:25 4/5, has been confirmed as a Classic starter. Marty Jones, assistant to trainer Gary Jones, said of the four-year-old, "He came out of the work great and Laffit (Pincay Jr.) will ride." At this time, the nationally televised (ESPN) race is expected to have eight runners: **Bertrando**, **Stuka**, **Best Pal** (*Habitony), **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band), **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold), **Silver Music** (Silver Ghost), **Slew of Damascus** (Slewacide) and **Tinners Way** (Secretariat). Four-year-old French import **Risen Roman** (Risen Star) is considered an outside possibility. Post-positions will be drawn Wed. morning. Asked if the post position for **Bertrando** is of concern, Nahem responded, "We're not concerned at all. With this horse it doesn't matter what post he has."

Saturday, Saratoga

ALABAMA S.-GI, \$200,000, 3yo, f, 10f
MGI winner **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew) "covered ground effortlessly" according to her trainer Gary Jones in her workout over Saratoga's main track yesterday morning, in which clockers caught her in 1:25.69 for seven furlongs. "I'm very happy," said Jones. "I purposely worked her without her blinkers. She gawked a bit in the first quarter because she wanted to look over the grounds a bit. But my main concern was how she finished up. She handled the track fine and never broke a sweat."

Trainer Mike Stidham knows he'll be in tough company when he sends GI Coaching Club American Oaks winner **Two Altazano** (Manzotti) in the Alabama. "I think we'll need some racing luck in our favor to beat Lakeway, but that's what racing's all about," he said. "Everything's going fine. We shipped Two Altazano from Monmouth Park last week. Basically, we don't have any works scheduled for her. She's been having long gallops and finishing up with two-minute licks." Other possibilities for Saturday's GI test include **Sovereign Kitty** (Sovereign Dancer), **Lady Reiko** (IRE) (Sadler's Wells) and **Jade Flush** (Jade Hunter). Trainer Tom Skiffington reported that recent allowance winner **Cinnamon Sugar** (IRE) (Wild Again) is a doubtful starter.

MINER'S MARK RETIRED **Miner's Mark** (Mr. Prospector), winner of the 1993 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, has been retired following a seventh-place finish in Saturday's \$250,000 Saratoga Cup, according to trainer Shug McGaughey. "Our decision was we would try him there," McGaughey said. "If he didn't run any better, he wouldn't go any further." McGaughey said that no decision had been made regarding where the horse will stand stud. "We're in the process of deciding what would be best for him," the trainer added. **Miner's Mark**, the first foal out of the undefeated champion older mare of 1988 **Personal Ensign**, won six of 18 starts for earnings of \$967,170.

GULFSTREAM RAISES TAKEOUT Gulfstream Park President Doug Donn notified the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering yesterday that his track's 1995 takeout rate would be 20 percent for both straight wagers and exotics. The South Florida track's takeout on straight wagers was 18 percent during its last meeting. Gulfstream's 20 percent takeout for straight wagering would make it the second highest in the country behind Hialeah Park.

LOUISIANA DOWNS ALTERS FALL RACE

SCHEDULE Louisiana Downs will alter its fall racing schedule to Thursday through Sunday beginning October 13 and running through the balance of the meet, ending Sunday, November 13. The four-day race week replaces the previously planned Friday through Monday schedule. Due to numerous requests, the track will also add Quinella wagering to every race beginning Saturday, August 13. "These changes make a lot of sense to us," said Louisiana Downs General Manager Ray Tromba. "Thursdays are the best day of the week, while Mondays are the slowest. Quinellas were extremely popular during the Fair Grounds OTB meet and have always been in demand by our patrons."

SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND FOR FLORIDA

FRESHMAN SIRES Two freshman stallions standing in Florida sired their first stakes winners this past weekend. The **Material Boy**, a gray colt by **Prospector's Gamble** (Crafty Prospector), took Saturday's Primer Breeders' Cup S. at Pimlico by 3/4-length. A GI winner of \$621,559, **Prospector's Gamble** stands at Hart Farm in Morriston, Florida for \$5,000 Live Foal. "We own the **Material Boy**. He was bred and raised on our farm," said Susan Hart. "We also own and stand the stallion, which makes the victory even better." **Prospector's Gamble** has five winners with six wins to date, and is among the leading national freshman sires in earnings, number of wins and stakes-winners. Also having his first stakes winner Sat. was **Pentelicus** (Fappiano), whose filly **Cottage Flower** was a four-length winner of the Florida Stallion S.--Desert Vixen Division at Calder. **Pentelicus**, who stands at Ocala Stud Farm for \$3,000 Live Foal, is a three-time stakes-winning sprinter of \$267,742. He has three winners of six races to date, including **Cottage Flower**, who is undefeated in three starts.
