SARATOGA SALE SHOWS GAINS Last night's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale continued on an upward trend. There were 65 yearlings sold for a gross of \$6,934,000 and an average of \$106,677, up six percent from last year's second session average of \$100,673. The combined numbers for Tuesday and Wednesday nights first two sessions also showed an increase, as 121 yearlings brought a total of \$12,490,000 and an average of \$103,223. This represented an 8.1 percent rise from the first two sessions of 1993, when 89 horses brought \$8,496,000 for an average of \$95,461. Last night's session topper was a chestnut colt by Miswaki--Mrs. Penny (Great Nephew). Mrs. Penny, the champion two and three-year-old filly in England, has produced stakes winners Northern Park and Mrs. Jenney to date. The Miswaki colt, consigned to the sale by Eaton-Williams, agent for Overbrook Farm, was purchased for \$520,000 by Centennial Farms. The second highest price of \$390,000 was commanded by a bay colt by Gulch--Selling Sunshine (Danzig). Lane's End, agent, consigned the colt, who was purchased by John R.S. Fisher. Other transactions of note: Edith LiButti of Lion Crest Stable purchased a full brother to current juvenile sensation DeNiro for \$285,000, and Wizard Stables paid \$170,000 for a half-brother by Opening Verse to three-time leading North American sire Danzig. The sale's third and final session will commence tonight at 8 p.m.

ESPN'S "RACING TO THE BREEDERS' CUP" BEGINS SATURDAY The 1994 "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" series on ESPN debuts this Saturday with the live broadcast (5-6 p.m. EDT) of the \$1 million Pacific Classic from Del Mar and the Alabama S. from Saratoga. This year's series of nine broadcasts will feature 16 Grade I races.

Montreal Red (D'Accord), purchased at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky yearling sale for \$26,000, already appears to be a bargain. The colt is two-for-two after taking his maiden at Belmont in late June then following up with an off-the-pace, 3 3/4-length tally in the Gill Sanford over a muddy Saratoga track; earnings to date total \$79,620. Testing him will be a trio of promising colts making only their second career starts after impressive maiden victories: Ogden Mill Phipps' **Law Of The Sea** (Polish Navy), Loblolly Stable's **Flicht** (Demons Begone) and Terry Raymond's **Middle Man** (Meadowlake).

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 10f

Nine horses, including two previous winners of the race, were drawn at Del Mar Wed. morning for the fourth running of the Pacific Classic. Topping the lineup will be Golden Eagle Farm's **Best Pal** (*Habitony), victorious in the inaugural edition in 1991 in track record time, and 505 Farms and Ed Nahem's **Bertrando** (Skywalker), the hero of last year's running, also in track record time. **Best Pal**, who will be ridden by Chris McCarron for the first time, will have an entymate in Golden Eagle Farm's promising three-year-old **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold). **Bertrando** will be handled by Patrick Valenzuela. The Golden Eagle entry was made a slight morning-line favorite at 2-1, with **Bertrando** listed next at 5-2. Here is the full field for the race in post-position order with riders and morning-line odds: **Silver Music** (Silver Ghost), Antley (9-2); **Stuka** (Jade Hunter), Pincay Jr. (15-1); **Bertrando** (5-2); **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band), Solis (5-1); **Slew of Damascus** (Slewacide), Stevens (8-1); **Risen Roman** (Risen Star), G. The filly duplicates her winning form last time out, when breaking her maiden by 7 after narrowly missing in her career debut. "We just sat behind the leaders, and when I asked on her a bit she went by them pretty easy," said winning jockey Jerry Bailey. Gill Schuylerville star Changing Ways set swift early fractions of :21 4/5 and :45 before giving way. "She fought real hard to get second, and that's just the way it is," said her jockey Craig Perret. "She hung in there."

FLORIDA VOTERS TO DECIDE FATE OF

CASINOS Florida voters will have one casino proposition to consider on the November 8 ballot. Only one of the four petitions being circulated to put the casino issue before the public made the cut. The Proposition for Limited Casinos, a group financially backed by Calder Race Course and Gulfstream Park, received the necessary 429,428 signatures on its petition to qualify for the November ballot. The wording of the petition still has to be approved by the Florida Supreme Court August 23. The Proposition for Limited Casinos calls for 47 casinos to be located at pari-mutuel sites, on riverboats and at free-standing locations throughout the state. Thirty-five of those locations are pari-mutuel sites.

TRAVERS UPDATE Trainer D. Wayne Lukas reported yesterday that Preakness and Belmont winner **Tabasco Cat** (Storm Cat) is on schedule for the Aug. 20 \$750,000 Travers at Saratoga. "Tabasco Cat worked early in the week and is due to work again the first of the week," Lukas said. "A lot depends on the weather, but I think it will be Tues." Trainer Shug McGaughey confirmed yesterday that **Party Manners** (Private Account), undefeated in four career starts, will not be entered in the Travers. "He's definitely not running," said McGaughey. "I'm going to give him a little more time." Trainer William Huffman said Wed. he is still undecided the status of **Danville** (Demons Begone), winner of Arlington's Round Table. "I really have not made up my mind whether or not to run him in the Travers," said Huffman. "I'm going to wait until Sat. when Danville has his workout. Then I will discuss it with the owners."
