1994 The 1994 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales ended last night with 71 yearlings selling for a total of \$6,076,000, up 76 percent from last year's closing day gross. The gross for the three days of the sale came to \$18,566,000, a 55 percent increase over total receipts of \$11,951,000 for 1993; the average for the sale, showing an increase for the first time in five years, was 4.3 percent higher than last year's figures, with a total of 192 yearlings selling for an average of \$96,698 as compared to the 129 sold for an average of \$92,643 in '93. A colt by Deputy Minister--Propositioning, by Mr. Prospector, consigned by Foxfield with Denali Stud as agent, topped last night's session, going to F. Eugene Dixon for a high bid of \$400,000. The chestnut is a half brother to 1990 Hopeful winner Deposit Ticket (Northern Baby), a winner of \$444,361; sire Deputy Minister has produced two Hopeful winners--Salt Lake ('91) and Dehere ('93). Dixon also purchased Tuesday night's session topper, a \$510,000 colt by Housebuster.

ERHAAB RETIRED Erhaab (Chief's Crown), the impressive winner of this year's Epsom Derby, has been retired due to knee problems. Angus Gold, racing manager for the colt's owner, Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum, said yesterday, "Erhaab was examined on Tuesday, when he showed a mild degree of lameness in front. Ultrasound examination revealed significant damage to the fibres of the deep-seated suspensory ligaments behind both of the colt's knees. There was no guarantee that, even with rest, he would be able to race again. So his owner and trainer (John Dunlop) reluctantly decided to retire him."

"I think this is going to be an awful good race for \$100,000 and Grade II," said trainer Bill Mott, who saddles morning-line favorite **Paradise Creek** (Irish River). "A lot of good horses have won this race. We might get our butts kicked if we aren't careful." The five-year-old has yet to be beaten this year, winning six straight stakes; he was only three-quarters of a length in front of **Lure** (Danzig) in the GII Early Times Dixie H. in May at level weights, but gives that rival one pound today. "I think we're a tad bit better then we were earlier in the year," said trainer Shug McGaughey of his two-time Breeders' Cup Mile winner. "I think this is a distance Lure is very comfortable at. But Paradise Creek will be tough, and he's coming off a freshening."
