PHONE CHATTER RETURNS TODAY

Phone Chatter (Phone Trick), the 1993 Champion Two-Year-Old Filly, is scheduled to return today from a 10-month layoff in Del Mar's \$55,000-added C.E.R.F. Stakes for three-year-old fillies. The chestnut fractured her left hind cannon bone after taking last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and has been progressing steadily towards her return, going seven furlongs in 1:25 at Del Mar in her latest workout. She will face five rivals in the C.E.R.F. Stakes, which will be contested at six-and-a-half furlongs.

CHANGING WAYS FRACTURES CANNON

BONE Roger Attfield, trainer of **Changing Ways** (Time for a Change), reported yesterday morning that the December Hill Farm filly will not be running in Monday's GI Spinaway at Saratoga. "I worked her with Mike Smith on her this morning and she did it great," said Attfield. "We were really high on her and thought she was doing well. When she came back to the barn, she was lame. We had her X-rayed right away and we found out she fractured the cannon bone in her right front." The fracture was not displaced or spiral. Two-year-old Changing Ways, winner of the GI Schuylerville S. earlier this summer, will undergo surgery to have screws inserted in the next day or two. The surgery will be performed by Dr. Lawrence Bramlage at Dr. Reed's facility across from Belmont Park.

GUINEAS SUNDAY CONFIRMED Newmarket's 1,000 Guineas of 1995 is now certain to become the first British Classic to be staged on a Sunday. Confirmation that the Madagans-sponsored one-mile fillies event will be run next May 7 came from the track Wednesday. the 1995 Guineas meeting will therefore be run over three days, May 5-7, with the GI Jockey Club Cup the Friday highlight and the 2,000 Guineas the centerpiece Saturday.

American Chance, never far back, bested early pacesetter Evil Bear late in the stretch for his 2nd straight stakes victory. "I think my horse certainly benefitted from the slow pace," said winning jockey Pat Day. "I was right outside and able to track the leader." Jockey Chris McCarron said of beaten Kentucky Derby winner Go For Gin, "He jumped a bit at the start and hit the gate. We spotted the field about a length. So instead of stalking the leaders from the outside, we were stalking from the inside. It was just some bad racing luck. But he finished up real well." According to trainer Nick Zito, the Woodward is still next for Go For Gin. 8-5 favorite VIRGINIA RAPIDS (Riverman), coming off a 2-month layoff, trailed the field throughout. "I guess he really needed the race," said his trainer Allen Jerkens. American Chance is 1/2 to Ophidian (GSP, \$97,128, by Ogygian).

THIRTY SLEWS FUTURE UNCERTAIN Thirty Slews (Slewpy), who was retired recently after earning \$872,590 for owners Degroot and Dutch Masters III and Pegram, will remain at Del Mar until his future will be decided, according to his trainer Bob Baffert. "We haven't really decided what we'll do, but one of the owners wants to keep him at his farm," Baffert said. The seven-year-old gelding, winner of the 1992 Breeders' Cup Sprint, suffered a torn lesion injury in one of his recent workouts, which was the reason for stopping on him. Baffert said Thirty Slews could run again, but they feel he's done enough. The trainer hasn't ruled out keeping the sprint star on the grounds as a pony horse.

SARATOGA TRAINING TO CONTINUE THIS FALL The Oklahoma training track will again be available to horsemen for training this fall from September 1 through October 2. The track will be open from 8 to 11:30 a.m., with stabling available at \$5 per day per stall. Interested trainers should contact Bruce Lombardi or Freddie Lewis. The Saratoga main track will also be open through Aug. 31, with training hours adjusted to 8 to 11:30 a.m. Tuesday, Aug. 30 and Wednesday, Aug. 31.

OCALA YEARLING SALE RESULTS A pair of \$29,000 colts topped the third session of the Ocala Breeders' open yearling sale yesterday. The first, a chestnut by **Pentelicus--Jolie Coeur** (Roberto) was consigned to the sale by Franks Farms (Southland Division) and purchased by Anthony Drakas. The second, named Exclusively Risque and sold by Mary K. Haire to Journeyman Bloodstock, agent, is by **Ecliptical--Magnetic Type** (Zen). The session average of \$7,471 represented a slight increase over 1993's \$7,463. Overall, 171 yearlings brought \$1,277,600.

RIVER DEEP TO CALIFORNIA River Deep (Riverman), winner of Royal Ascot's Jersey S., will continue his racing career in the U.S. A close seventh in the 2,000 Guineas before dead-heating at Ascot with Gneiss, River Deep is set to transfer to owner Fahd Salman's California trainer, Neil Drysdale, in the next few days. "He's the type to do well in the States," said his trainer in England, Paul Cole.

HOPEFUL S.-GI, \$200,000, 2yo, 7f
Montreal Red (D'Accord), winner of the GII Saratoga Special and GIII Sanford S. and undefeated in three career starts, leads the field of probables. "Montreal Red is doing good," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer yesterday. "He worked four furlongs on Saturday and went in :48 and change. I'll probably work him tomorrow for the race." Loblolly Stable's **Fritch** (Demons Begone), second in the Saratoga Special behind Montreal Red, will try to turn the tables on that rival. "He's doing real good," said Lee Taylor, assistant to trainer Tom Bohannan. "I'm not too sure if he'll blow out again before the race or just gallop into it." Also pointing to the Hopeful is **Boone's Mill** (Carson City), 5 3/4-length winner of the GII Sapling S. at Monmouth August 13. "He worked five-eighths yesterday and went in 1:04 4/5," said Todd Pletcher, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He's doing great and will just gallop into the race." Also listed as probable are **Bick** (Manila), **Tethra** (Cure the Blues) and **Law of the Sea** (Polish Navy).
