### GUINEAS WINNERS CLASH AT GOODWOOD

**Turtle Island** (Fairy King) and **Mehthaaf** (Nureyev), winners respectively of the Irish 2000 and 1000 Guineas, are set to meet in the GII Tripleprint Celebration Mile at Goodwood Saturday. After heavy rain in the south of England earlier this week, conditions are expected to be perfect at Goodwood this weekend. Trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam, who will saddle Turtle Island, said, "The more I look at Saturday's race, the more ideal it looks as a stepping-stone for Ascot's Queen Elizabeth II S. (Sept. 24). That is definitely Turtle Island's next Group I target." Also on the list of entries is: **Emperor Jones** (Danzig), **Beggarmen Thief** (Arctic Tern), **Bin Ajwaad** (Rainbow Quest), **Fraam** (Lead On Time), **Grand Lodge** (Chief's Crown), **Maroof** (Danzig), **Mistle Cat** (Storm Cat), **Swing Low** (Swing Easy) and **Ventriquattrofolgi** (Persian Bold).

**GO FOR GIN SET FOR WOODWARD** Trainer Nick Zito reported yesterday that Kentucky Derby winner **Go for Gin** (Cormorant) came out of Wednesday's third-place finish in the Forego H. in good order and will make his next start in the GI Woodward at Belmont. "We can't hide," said Zito. "On Sept. 17, win, lose or draw, we'll be there." Zito added that impressive allowance winner **Jade Flush** (Jade Hunter), who cruised home 26 lengths to the good in the Saratoga slop Sunday, may try the GI Gazelle H. Sept. 4. "She's doing great. If the track is wet, we'll definitely run," Zito said.

**NORTHLANDS CANCELS NEXT THURSDAY'S CARD** An unprecedented shortage of horses has cost Northlands Park in Alberta, Canada, a second day in its '94 meet. Racing Secretary Phil Livingstone announced yesterday that a card slated for next Thursday, September 1, has been dropped. "To ensure that we obtain strong cards for our closing weekend (Sept. 3-5), we decided to cancel Thursday." **News Continued, p. 2**

**Thunder Rumble** (Thunder Puddles) will try to keep his unblemished Saratoga streak alive; the five-year-old earned his third Spa victory in the Saratoga Cup last time out. "He worked (Wednesday) in :59 3/5," said O'Connell. "It looked very much the same as the work before the Saratoga Cup. (Thursday) morning he was ordered to sleep in. We usually work on him around 5:30, but I told the groom not to disturb him until late." As for Saturday's race, O'Connell remarked, "We've got the Saratoga factor and a very talented horse. When he's happy, he's very dangerous." Highweight **Devil His Due** (Devil's Bag) will spot the field from eight to 15 pounds. "He has to put in his big race when he's giving away weight," said his trainer, Allen Jerkens. "He's been training like he's ready for a top effort." Last year's Whitney winner **Brunswick** (Private Account) was not entered. "This race is a little too close for him," said trainer Tony Margotta. "It will only be 20 days since his first start in over 10 months. We don't want this race to cost him down the line." The five-year-old will make his next start in the Woodward.

## Sunday, Arlington:

## ARLINGTON MILLION-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 10ft

**Jeune Homme** (Nureyev), trainer Francois Boutin's hope in the Million, worked over the Arlington turf course yesterday morning. Jockey Mickey Walls was aboard for the work, which took place at a mile on the firm turf course. Jeune Homme was timed in 1:42 2/5 breezing. Trainer John Gosden arrived at Arlington Wed. from England. Thursday he watched his charge **Muhtarram** (Alleged) take a long gallop around the turf course in the company of England's second Million hope, **Spartan Shareef** (Shareef Dancer). Both horses ran in the G1 Juddmonte Int'l at York August 16, with Muhtarram a close second and Spartan Shareef fifth in his first race since Feb. They shipped across the Atlantic Monday and will run in the Million on 11 days rest. "It's a bit closer than you'd like," Gosden acknowledged. "He shipped well and we'll see what happens. He probably has the best form of the foreign horses, but if the real **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {FR}) shows up, he'll be difficult to beat." Paradise Creek has been established as the 8-5 favorite on the early line, with Muhtarram second at 3-1. Gosden said Muhtarram will blow out Friday morning.

## FUTURITY NEXT STOP FOR TIMBER

**COUNTRY** Trainer D. Wayne Lukas had one thing in mind when he ran Gainesway Farm, Lewis and Overbrook Farm's **Timber Country** (Woodman) in Wed.'s GIII Balboa S.--running him in the Del Mar Futurity on the track's closing day. "That was the whole purpose," said Lukas. "I'm looking forward to two turns; if you're going to give one-half million for a horse (the colt's price as a yearling), you want him to run all the way around."

## FOUR GRADE I RACES HIGHLIGHT ESPN

**TELECASTS** Four Grade I events will be featured on two ESPN "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" telecasts this weekend. ESPN will provide live coverage of the \$350,000 Whitney from Saratoga and the \$500,000 Beverly D. from Arlington Saturday from 4:30-5:30 p.m. EDT; Sunday's telecast, scheduled for 5:00-6:00 p.m. EDT, will feature the Arlington Million and the \$400,000 Secretariat S., also run at Arlington.

## PERFORMANCE HORSE REGISTRY

**LAUNCHED** The Performance Horse Registry (PHR), linking the pedigrees of performance horses and their actual performances in non-racing events, was formally launched this week with a nationwide mailing to performance horse owners and breeders of the first PHR registration application forms. Accompanying the forms is the recently-published Performance Horse Registry Rule Book detailing PHR eligibility rules, which cover all horses shown to be at least half-Thoroughbred. The registry will begin processing applications September 1.

"I had to ask him just once, and he did all he had to do from there to win." Excellent Tipper's trainer P.G. Johnson added, "He's now won this race two years in a row, and we'll be here next year." Even-money choice FOURSTARS ALLSTAR (Compliance), stepping down from graded stakes company, finished 4th. Excellent Tipper, a MGIII winner, is 1/2 to Lord Nelson (SW-Pan, SW-Pr, by Big Spruce).

Winning jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. said, "She made a real easy move with me on the backside and I just let her go. She was so relaxed when we came out and going into the race. She's better than these other horses." Trainer Richard Mandella agreed. "We didn't try to make a sprinter out of her," he said. "She's naturally that good. It's no secret, it's in her form. **OBS YEARLING SALE CONCLUDES** The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company held the fourth and final session of its yearling sale yesterday. A total of 172 were sold for a gross of \$1,146,100 and an average of \$6,663, down 2.6 percent from last year's fourth session average of \$6,841. The session topper was a colt by **Northern Jove--Princess Royale (AUS)** (Bletchingly). Consigned to the sale by Ten Bar Ranch, the chestnut was purchased for \$33,000 by Patty Altman. Overall, the open sessions of the sale saw 533 yearlings sold for a total of \$3,868,500 and an average of \$7,258, down 6.3 percent from last year's open sessions average of \$7,743.
