DEL MAR ENDS RECORD-SETTING MEET

Del Mar Thoroughbred Club concluded its most successful summer season of Thoroughbred racing Wednesday, establishing numerous records in several categories of attendance and pari-mutuel handle during the 43-day meeting. Total handle from all sources was a record \$412,940,657, a 22.8 percent increase from the 1993 total of \$336,413,870. The total daily average handle was \$9,603,271, second only to Saratoga Race Course in New York, which averaged approximately \$10.5 million. Pari-mutuel handle on-track at Del Mar averaged \$2,381,319 daily, up 1.8 percent from 1993, while off-track wagering averaged \$4,354,012, a 5.1 percent increase from last summer. The biggest percentage gain was realized in commingled out-of-state simulcasting where the handle totaled \$90,577,676, up 56.9 percent from last year. Daily average commingled was \$2,106,458. The record for highest single-day handle was set Saturday, Aug. 13, the day of the \$1-million Pacific Classic, when \$14,860,664 was wagered. Total attendance totaled 1,526,028 for a daily average of 35,489, up four percent from 1993. On-track attendance rose 8.8 percent, making the seaside track once again number one in America for attendance. Total attendance on-track was 688,368 for a daily average of 16,009. Horsemen competed for record purses of \$16,306,854, a daily average of \$379,229, highest in the nation. VHW Stable's two-year-old filly Call Now (Wild Again), wire-to-wire winner of the Sept. 3 Del Mar Debutante, was named Del Mar's Horse Of The Meet. Jockey Corey Nakatani won his first Del Mar riding title, while Bill Spawr captured his first solo trainer's crown.

INJURY SINKS URBAN SEA'S ARC BID

Urban Sea (Miswaki), upset winner of last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, has probably run her last race. The GISW has suffered a series of setbacks this season, including a viral infection during the summer, and now a long-standing fetlock problem seems to have ended her career at the track. Her trainer, Jean Lesbordes, said, "It's almost certain that we've seen the last of her, and she'll now be retired to stud."

KEENELAND SALE CONTINUES ON UPWARD

TREND During Thursday's fourth session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, there were 290 horses sold for a total of \$11,730,500 and an average of \$40,450, up 19.6 percent from last year's fourth session average of \$33,820. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas paid top price of \$250,000 for a dark bay or brown colt by Wild Again--Miss Blanche (Faraway Son). Consigned to the sale by Westover Ridge, agent for John W. Rooker, the colt is a full brother to Canadian Champion Two-Year-Old Colt Free At Last. After four days of the 10-day sale, 1,201 horses have brought \$76,412,500 for an average of \$63,624. This represents a 10.6 percent increase over the first four sessions of 1993, when 1,178 yearlings brought \$67,770,400 for a \$57,530 average.

RECORD STAKES SCHEDULE FOR 1995

GULFSTREAM MEET Gulfstream Park will offer a record number of stakes, 39, and a state record of stakes purses, \$4,625,000, during its January 4 through March 16, 1995 meet. The number of graded stakes, 24, equals the Florida record established last season. "I am confident Gulfstream's stakes schedule will enable us to present the highest caliber of racing throughout our 62-day meet," said Douglas Donn, Gulfstream president and CEO. "In addition, we intend to further improve our amenities programs for owners, trainers and patrons to build on the momentum generated during our excellent 1994 meeting." Heading the Gulfstream schedule are the track's three GI events, the \$500,000 Florida Derby, March 11; the \$500,000 Gulfstream Park H., March 5; and the \$300,000 Donn H., February 11.

PANCHO VILLA TO TEXAS A majority interest in **Pancho Villa** (Secretariat) has been purchased from Gainesway Farm by Omar Trevino Bloodstock, and the 12-year-old stallion will be moved to Cedarcrest Stud in Palestine, Texas for the 1995 breeding season. No fee has yet been determined, but Cedarcrest Stud and Omar Trevino will be the syndicate managers. Pancho Villa is currently enjoying his best year to date. Through the first week of September, he has sired 47 winners and six stakes horses with earning of well over \$1,100,000. His best known progeny are GI Ashland S. winner Do It With Style and Gill Nijana S. victor Statuette.

BARATHEA TO STAND IN IRELAND **Barathea** (Sadler's Wells), winner of last year's Irish 2000 Guineas and this year's Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, will take up stallion duties at Rathbarry Stud in Ireland's County Cork next spring. The four-year-old, among the main contenders for Ascot's Queen Elizabeth II S. a week from Sat., has been sold to Gerald Leigh and Sheikh Mohammed, subject to veterinary approval. He is expected to start three more times before retiring to stud, pointing for the race at Ascot, the Prix de la Foret, and the Breeders' Cup Mile.

MCCAULEY'S HOMECOMING AN EARLY SUCCESS Jockey Herb McCauley, riding at the Meadowlands nightly for the first time since 1987, brought home four winners on Tuesday night's card to tie Joe Bravo in the jockey standings with 11 winners for the meet. "It feels good to be back here," said McCauley. "I've spent the last six years riding in New York and I've proven myself there, but it's a lot healthier for me here. I'm more settled right now and happy where I am. I've thought about what it would be like to sell my house in New Jersey and move to New York, but that's not what I wanted."
